Margaret ministered in the Wigan Circuit some years ago and was well loved.



#### **A Prayerful Reflection**

Take time to sit quietly and ask Jesus to be present with you in a new way this week. As we prepare to pray, let's remember to praise and thank God for His love, joy and peace that he lavishes upon us.

#### **CMP 456**

Make me a channel of Your peace. Where there's despair in life, let me bring hope, where there is darkness, only light, and where there's sadness, ever joy.

> O, Master, grant that I may never seek so much to be consoled, as to console, to be understood, as to understand, to be loved, as to love with all my soul.

### A WORD FROM SCRIPTURE - Ephesians 2:11-18 (NIV)

<sup>11</sup> Therefore, remember that formerly you who are Gentiles by birth and called "uncircumcised" by those who call themselves "the circumcision" (which is done in the body by human hands)— <sup>12</sup> remember that at that time you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world. <sup>13</sup> But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ. <sup>14</sup> For he himself is our peace, who has made the two groups one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, <sup>15</sup> by setting aside in his flesh the law with its commands and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new humanity out of the two, thus making peace, <sup>16</sup> and in one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility. <sup>17</sup> He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. <sup>18</sup> For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit.

Peace, perfect Peace - Paul describes how things were for Gentiles as they related to those who were Jewish. Becoming part of the Jewish community was very difficult, words like 'separate' and 'excluded from citizenship' and 'without hope', would perhaps leave many feeling downcast and worthless. But look at verse 13, look what Jesus has accomplished and we praise God, 'But now in Christ Jesus you who were once far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ'.

**Verse 14** 'For Christ Himself has brought peace to us, He united Jews and Gentiles into one people when, in His own body on the cross, He broke down the wall of hostility that separated us'.

Jesus is our Peace and He brought these separate groups of Jews and Gentiles together into one, by removing the barriers that stood in the way. We have things dividing us, perhaps causing a sense of unrest and a lack of peace, conflicts can easily arise through 'personality clashes'. In Jesus, we find the ability to live together in peace, His peace is showered on us all, through what He's done for us. In Paul's day these differences were much the same issues, racial and cultural clashes that Paul had to deal with in Ephesus. The secret of dealing with them is for both sides to recognize their unity in Christ. Through Jesus we have been reconciled to each other as well as to God.

We belong to Jesus Christ ... because He has made peace ... not because He merely teaches us about peace, or preaches peace, or encourages peace, but because in His own body He has made peace and broken down the enmity ... And the purpose of His life and death is to create a single new humanity in Christ — a humanity of peace ... but a humanity which is peace in Christ.

Lord, you are the Lord of life, in Your presence is the fullness of joy.

 We give thanks for lively and vital communities. We pray for individuals that help to restore and hold together community life. We pray for people in areas where community has broken down, for down-town areas of fear and poverty, for those who have left home and have nowhere to go. We remember all who sleep rough and the organisations that care for them.

## God of hope, fill us with joy and peace in believing.
