Welcome to the Learning & Development Newsletter!

After all the excitement of the General Election and its results, I've been wondering what made those who voted decide where to place their cross on the ballot paper. Some would have voted because of their commitment to a particular party. Others would have gone for the leader or prospective prime minister who appealed the most. Perhaps a specific issue would have been the basis for the decision for some electors, or perhaps local matters was most important. But for many, the character and reputation of a candidate standing to be elected as their Member of Parliament would have attracted them to support them. As we have experienced in the weeks leading up to this election, knowing how politicians live their life can attract people towards them or turn them away completely. In the votes count, how one lives counts.



Live is the theme of this newsletter. In brief, the emphasis on the 'Live' practice in A Methodist Way of Life is how we, made in the image and likeness of God and blessed and gifted with what makes us unique, can live in a way that will attract others to Jesus. How we live our lives, in word and deed, can have an impact on others and make them want to know more about God.

I can think of examples of this in my own life, from the lovely and caring Sunday school teacher in my early childhood to the two girls who attracted me during the first few weeks at college with

their gratitude and joy through every experience. That had a great influence on me, leading me to come to know Jesus in a real way, and I am indebted to them. I wonder which people come to your mind? What can we learn from them?

One of my favourite Welsh hymns is the traditional children's hymn 'Dod ar fy mhen dy sanctaidd law' by Eifion Wyn, a hymn writer who is buried in our village. The last verse is a prayer for the kind of life that attracts people to God. I once saw the last two lines quoted in a reference for someone applying for a job!

Grant me a better heart each day

And grace a means to live

So that others may through me

Know for themselves God's love. (tr. DWD)

In the same vein Madeleine L'Engle said "We draw people to Christ not by loudly discrediting what they believe, by telling them how wrong they are and how right we are, but by showing them a light that is so lovely that they want with all their hearts to know the source of it."



May we live in a way that allows God to shine out of us.


