District News

Representative Synod Dates

Our upcoming Synod dates for Connexional year 2025-26 are taking place on **Saturday 13th September 2025 and Saturday 25th April 2026**, both to take place at Saint Michael's Church of England High School (Astley Rd, Chorley, PR7 1RS).

Important information: Online Suite - Statistics for Mission site

There have been difficulties with the Statistics for Mission Online Suite and as a result, the decision has been taken to shut down Statistics for Mission until the new Online Suite can be launched.

What this means is that **from Monday, 9 June, there will be no access to Statistics for Mission. Any users of the system that need to make changes can do so by inputting the details via a Microsoft form that will be added to the Methodist Church website.** These requests will then be processed manually and will take up to 7 working days to process.

Please note that Property Consents, Annual Returns and Gift Aid will be able to continue to operate as per normal.

Connexion are working towards implementing a new online suite which will be secure, fit for purpose and will offer scope for future improvements. Unfortunately, complications with the development of this new online suite mean that the launch date for this has been delayed, and is now expected to launch in October 2025. Weekly Spotlight

This week, we're celebrating the Greater Manchester Plus Mission Area. Our Mission Area Leads and Deputy Chairs Revds Katie Smith and Alan Bradley facilitate mission; deputise for the District Chair; encourage and nurture connections; and partner with ecumenical, faith and civic leaders.

There's been a lot happening since September! The Mission Area covers everything from the heart of Manchester with its city centre ministries at places like Central Hall

and Victoria Hall, to rural communities in the High Peak, alongside the peaceful setting of Chapel in the Fields. There's work with people who are homeless, with refugees and asylum seekers, and with long-standing local communities.

One of the exciting things happening under the NPNP (New Places for New People) work is the growth of Caleb Communities through communities such as Bite-Sized Church and Crafty Corner.

Across the Mission Area, churches and chapels continue to serve faithfully – being salt and light in the places they're called to.

We've also had time for reflection and encouragement, with two retreats at Gladstone's Library – one for Superintendents focused on "Leading Well," and one for Ministers around the theme of "Soul Food," led by our Learning Network colleagues.

Perhaps the biggest joy in this season has been meeting people, hearing their passion for God, and seeing the creative and committed ways they're engaging in worship and mission. Church buildings are being used in new ways. People are trying new things. And in it all, there's a deep sense that God is not finished with us – there is much to be optimistic about.

Digital Digest: Optimising Social Media Posts

Social media is a great tool for church outreach and growth. I am often asked how churches can optimise their social media content to maximise their exposure and ensure that as many people as possible see their content.

Most social media platforms now prioritise 'organic' visual content – think photos and videos that you have made. Photos and videos can grab people's attention when they are scrolling through their newsfeed and are much more likely to be interacted with.

One of the key things to keep in mind when creating content is to 'be authentic'. Digital content that shows insights into how your Church operates and the people working behind the scenes will be much more successful.

Try to give your digital audience an insight into what engaging with your Church would be like. One easy way of doing this could be creating content around the 'day-in-the-life' of your Minister. This could include short videos showing the Minister working in the Church, visiting a local school or preparing for a service.

Another easy form of authentic content could be a series of short videos of members of the congregation sharing why they attend your Church. You could also consider asking a member of the Church to do a short video about an upcoming event, explaining what is planned and what a visitor can expect when they attend.

Videos are the best way to engage with your audience – with short 30 second videos being most successful.

The graphic below shows the hierarchy of post types, moving from left to right in terms of how effective they are. If possible, try to avoid relying on sharing links to other people's content – try and generate some of your own content!

The time you post can also help. Content posted early in morning (7-9 AM) and evenings (6-9 PM) often get higher engagement.
