We hope that you will share in the prayer offered by Rev'd Jez Hackett – Superintendent of Bury Methodist Circuit – for healing, for peace and for love.


District Online Update

Travelling Storyteller Project

Several members of the Travelling Storyteller Project travelled to Clitheroe Pendle Primary School on Monday, 29th September. Having collected the resources to set up the space, 3 team members; Anne Baker, Elizabeth Davis and myself travelled by car and met a fourth team member of the team; Hylda Emsden at the school in Clitheroe. We shared the story of Creation with around 100 children in Key Stage 1 (Year 1, Year ½ and Year 2). This is the fourth time we have been reinvited to the school and each time the children remember that we have been before.

One of the teachers commented on how calm the session was and that neither the teachers nor the children get much time to be calm in the day.

The team received the following message from the RE co-ordinator:

'Thank you so much for today's visit, superb as always. We love our visits from the Godly Play Team. You and your team of ladies are fantastic and we cannot wait to see you again soon'









Tent of Nations

As a District, we were privileged to hear Daoud Nassar of the Tent of Nations on Mon 22nd Sept by Zoom and in person at Hapton Methodist Church, Pendle and Burnley Circuit. The Nassar family received the Methodist Peace Award in 2017.

Daoud shared the powerful story of their educational, ecological farm, surrounded by 5 Illegal settlements. We saw and heard how the farm stands as a statement of resilience and non-violent resistance. A humbling story to listen to, of the family's Faith, courage and unwavering commitment to justice based on their motto 'We refuse to be Enemies'.

As church leaders and the Methodist Church in the UK, Daoud emphasized the importance for the need to advocate for the Tent of Nations and speak out at the political level, encourage official church delegations and church members to visit the Tent of Nations if they plan a trip to the Holy Land. International presence is the only remaining protection for the Tent of Nations.
