Methodists at Silverstone




Methodists were busy at a very different sort of circuit last weekend when they hosted a wellbeing space trackside at the Silverstone Grand Prix.

Eric Gill's *Annunciation*, part of the Methodist Modern Art Collection, is being displayed as part of the 'It takes a village' exhibition taking place at the Ditchling Museum of Art + Craft.

<u>In a ground-breaking initiative</u>, survivors of abuse advised the Methodist Church on the future of the watercolour, *Annunciation*, that was created by the controversial sculptor, typographer and printmaker, Eric Gill, who sexually abused two of his daughters.
