



MEETING TO DISCUSS BARTLETT SCHOOLS REFERENDA

William J. (Bill) Busler, Area 2 Representative

On August 2nd, the County-wide ballot will contain two important referenda for all citizens of Bartlett, including those of us who live in Davies Plantation. The first referendum deals with the establishment of a Municipal School District (MSD) in Bartlett. The second would approve a 0.5% increase of the sales tax within Bartlett, related to the funding of the Bartlett School System.

In preparation for these referenda, the Davies Plantation Homeowners Association will have a special presentation at our Annual Meeting on June 28th at Hillwood. I will present the case in favor of both questions; we hope that others will provide the opposing viewpoint. Mayor McDonald will be on hand to provide additional factual information and to answer questions.

I have been asked to prepare this brief synopsis in advance of the Annual Meeting.

HISTORY

About a year and a half ago, the Memphis City Schools Board voted 5-4 to surrender their charter, effectively merging it into the Shelby County School System. This vote was then approved by the City Council and the voters of Memphis. A federal district judge presided over the transition details, including the establishment of a Transition Planning Commission, and ultimately a 13-member Board to oversee the new "Unified" District, which is scheduled to begin operations in August 2013, with an estimated 150,000 students.

Meanwhile, the six suburban cities in Shelby County, including Bartlett, have with varying degrees of intensity begun to pursue the goal of establishing their own MSD's, effectively seceding from the Unified District. Originally, a referendum to do this in each city was planned for May 10th, but a Tennessee Attorney General's contrary opinion has delayed the vote until



August 2nd, in conjunction with the sales tax referendum and the County general election

THE MSD REFER-ENDUM

If the citizens of Bartlett approve this question,

the City of Bartlett is authorized to establish a new Bartlett School District, encompassing 11 schools and about 9,000 students. A five-member School Board will be elected on the November 6th ballot, and will as soon as possible thereafter appoint a Superintendent. The Superintendent will then select the administrative staff and faculty for each school, with the goal of opening in August 2013.

It is **extremely** important to remember that the *status quo* – Bartlett Schools being operated by an all-suburban County Board overseeing 56,000 students – is no longer an option. There will be only two possibilities after August 2013: 1. Bartlett schools will be administered, along with all the other public schools within Shelby County, serving 150,000 students, by the unified board, which in all likelihood will be comprised of 9 members from within Memphis, and 4 from suburban areas of Shelby County. 2. There will be a Bartlett School District of 11 schools and 9,000 students, administered by a Board of 5 citizens, all of whom are citizens of Bartlett.

FINANCING

At present, the cost of educating students in Shelby County is broken down as follows: about \$2,000 per student comes from Shelby County, through tax revenues. (This is true for students in Memphis as well as those in County Schools.) County students receive another \$6,000 each from the state and federal government; within Memphis, the figure is about \$8,000, due to additional grants. (The state and federal funds are administered and "passed through" by Shelby County.) Very important: This money will "follow" students, no matter what school system they are enrolled in – unified County, or MSD. In other words. Bartlett would not have to start from scratch in raising money to operate its school district.

However, state law requires that each community forming a school district demonstrate its commitment by setting aside an amount equivalent to 15 cents of its property tax rate to be used for its schools. Note that the law does not require the tax rate to be raised by 15 cents. However, if Bartlett did this, it would increase the taxes on a \$250,000 home by about \$94 per year.

An alternative proposal, set forth in the second Referendum, is to impose a 0.5% increase in sales tax within Bartlett. This would actually bring in far more revenue (\$3.6 million) than a 15-cent increase in property taxes (\$1.6 million). Not all of this money needs to be specifically given to the schools: some can go into the general fund. If the sales tax revenue were absolutely earmarked for the schools in the referendum, this would create a "maintenance of effort" benchmark that could never be reduced later on. If the second referendum passes, the cost of a \$100 bag of groceries would increase by 50 cents.

If it fails, Bartlett will probably raise property taxes.

CONCLUSION

This is probably the most significant issue we will ever have to vote on it Bartlett. Please plan on coming to the Annual Meeting. Meanwhile, if you have any questions, feel free to e-mail me at WBusler@aol.com.



CERT

Community Emergency Response Team

One of the best ways to prepare for an emergency is to receive training through the **CERT** program. CERT is an acronym for **Community Emergency Response Team**. CERT is a training program that prepares you to help yourself, your family, and your neighbors in the event of a disaster. During an incident, emergency service personnel may not be able to reach everyone right away. By getting trained in CERT, you will have the skills to help emergency responders save lives and protect property.

As a member of a CERT team, you can respond to disasters, participate in drills and exercises, and take additional training. CERT teams are known and trusted resources to emergency responders and their communities.

CERT training takes about 20 hours to complete and provides critical skills in emergency preparedness and response.

Participants learn how to:

- * Identify and anticipate hazards
- * Reduce fire hazards in the home and workplace
- * Extinguish small fires
- * Assist emergency responders
- * Conduct light search and rescue
- * Set up medical treatment areas
- * Apply basic medical techniques
- * Help reduce survivor stress

CERT trained persons will be part of a network of responders that will be of great value to the community during and after a disaster. The Bartlett Fire Department offers CERT training on a regular basis. For more information contact: Laura Jenkins at 385-5536 or e-mail her at:
