

Treasure Oak Country Club Pool Rules and Policies

The following rules are for the safety of our members and guests. The Club Manager, Lifeguard Staff and Board of Directors have the authority to enforce the pool rules in order to provide a safe environment. Please read these rules and if you have any questions, direct them to Steve Pennington, Club Manager, Paulette Baudrey, Bookkeeper or any member of the Board of Directors.

Members & Guests

- ALL MEMBERS must sign in and MUST sign in their guests. This includes After Hours visits to the pool.
- There is a \$5 charge per guest, per visit. Fees will be added to the member's monthly statements.
- Guests are adults and children visitors that live within the local area and are not members of Treasure Oak Country Club.
- House Guests are adult and children visitors that do not live in the local area and are staying or visiting a Treasure Oak Member (i.e., Grandchildren from out of area visiting and going to the pool with their Grandparents that are members of TOCC).
- Guest fees do not apply to non-member babysitters/nannies when they accompany members children to the pool.
- Guests are allowed up to 8 visits each calendar year. After hours visits to the pool count towards the 8 visits.
- Members using pool during "Swim at Your Own Risk" will comply with all the rules and regulations of the pool. Members with guests must still sign in and note guests.
- Children under 13 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.

Parties & Rentals

- A member inviting a group of 12 or more members & guests, is required to fill out a <u>Pool</u> <u>Reservation Request Form</u> and lifeguards booked/confirmed with the Rental Chair. Lifeguards for pool parties booked by members must provide proof of the Red Cross Lifeguard certification via email to TOCCOffice@gmail.com. Lifeguards employed by TOCC already have their certifications on file.
- The pool and clubhouse can be rented by members only. All rentals must be approved in advance by the TOCC Board. A rental will be confirmed by Paulette Baudry, Bookkeeper or April Evans, Rental Chair. A member can host a non-member function, but the member is the responsible party.
- Pool parties must be booked in advance by completing the pool rental form. Forms can be printed or done electronically thru the website. **Reminder:** Parties are not booked until your receive confirmation from Paulette or April.
- The number of lifeguards needed for a party will be determined by the Rental Chair and ages and total number of swimmers will be taken into consideration.
- Please note, the pool will not be closed for private parties.

Personal Conduct

- Absolutely no running on pool deck.
- One at a time on the diving board when one person's feet are on the board, the person behind them must have their feet on the concrete!
- Absolutely no diving in shallow water, diving only in deep end.
- No horseplay, pushing or shoving.
- No glass containers allowed at the pool.
- No profanity allowed at the pool by children or adults.

<u>Lifeguards</u>

- To ensure the safety of all pool participants, the pool lifeguard on duty reserves the right
 to close the pool in case of lightning, thunder or heavy rain. The reopening of the facility
 will be left to the discretion of the lifeguard on duty.
 - o If lightning is seen or thunder heard, please exit the pool for 30 minutes. Every time lightning strikes or thunder is heard, it is 30 minutes from that moment.
 - Members are to exit the water & pool area.
- The lifeguards have the authority to remove from the pool area anyone who endangers the safety and welfare of themselves or others.
- Lifeguards are responsible for enforcing safety rules and responding to emergencies. Parents or guardians are responsible for the supervision of their children.
- Do not distract the lifeguards on duty or ask them to step away from the pool to get items from the office.
- Lifeguards shall at all times have complete and absolute authority to enforce all rules established by the Pool Committee and the Board of Directors.
- Members and guests may not reprimand any lifeguard. Complaints are to be directed to the Club Manager and/or Board of Directors.

Proper Swim Attire & Health Awareness

- It is recommended to shower prior to pool entry.
- Must wash off grass, dirt, and sand prior to entering the pool.
- General Pool maintenance, special request: <u>NO COTTON in the pool</u>. This includes cotton t-shirts, and especially cut-off jean shorts. It may seem odd, but a single cotton t-shirt each day in the pool creates fuzz that can cause problems with our filtration system. A clogged filtration system can cause cloudy water, and can ultimately result in a CLOSED pool while maintenance corrects the issues. We are not saying you cannot wear swim shirts, just not COTTON!
- All children not potty trained MUST wear a swim diaper. Any accidents must be reported to lifeguard on duty and may result in temporary pool closure.
- Please be conscious of others. No one who is ill, or has an open sore or skin disease may go into the pool.
- First aid kits are available, including bandages and gauze for minor injuries. Report injuries to the lifeguard.

Additional Information

- Members are expected to clean up any trash in their area and dispose of it properly when they leave.
- The club belongs to all members. Please help keep the club in nice shape by cleaning up your area at the pool.
- Let club management or Board Members know of any issues you encounter at the pool, and please also let us know when things are going well, too!
