



## Hallettsville Brick Hotel The Cornerstone 1947

Albert Pavlu, a local blacksmith, purchased the property which had once been in home of the City Hotel, in January 1931. Pavlu began work on erecting a building for his blacksmith shop. In the plans, he used the brick wall that was left standing after the hotel burned as part of his new building.

In June of 1947, the old brick building formerly occupied by the Albert Pavlu Blacksmith shop was torn down. The owner of the property, Mr. Paul Renger, announced that a Texaco filling station would be built on that corner.

During the demolition, Lloyd Moore, who had been hired to demolish the Pavlu Blacksmith shop, removed the cornerstone from the old City Hotel building.

According to the New Era-Herald, when the cornerstone was opened a variety of items were found.

Inside the cornerstone were 24 coins; two silver dollars and a number of halves, quarters, and dimes, the oldest coins dating back to 1834.

Also found were a quantity of magazines and papers all in bad condition due in part to having been soaked and damaged during the fire which partially destroyed the building.

Among the paper relics were the following: a Bible belonging to French Simpson Sr., dated February 15, 1885 and inscribed "Presented to himself on his 37th birthday" and deposited November 15, 1891; a magazine, Frank Lester's Popular Monthly, dated 1890; a copy of the Hallettsville Herald, published by Lehmann and Donohue dated November 1891; an issue of the Houston Daily Post for November 24, 1891, the day before the

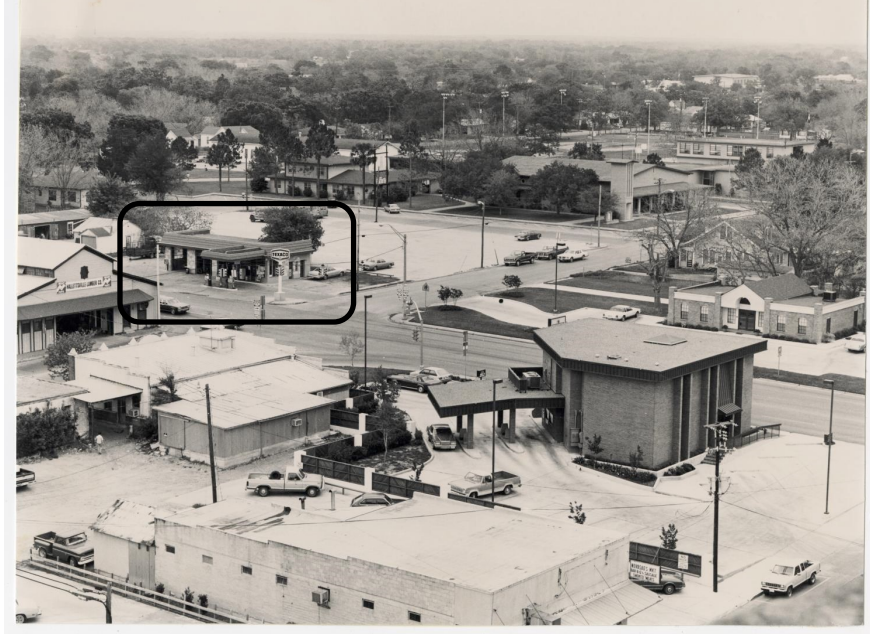

The present owner, Mr. Paulie Renger, returned the cornerstone and its interesting relics, to the Masonic Lodge.
