\*In Lavaca County during the existence of Petersburg, there were two William Martins living in the county. One was a lawyer, and one was in constant need of one. Which one bought property in Petersburg has yet to be determined.

\*The family of George McCulloch was in the Jackson and Lavaca County area from 1854 to 1860. George had a brother named John L. McCulloch who served in the Mexican War. His body was reported lost or destroyed and his burial location is unknown. He was not married and had no descendants. However, it is unknown if this John L. McCulloch is the same person who deeded the above properties to Mrs. Experience B. Elson.
