With the passage of the "stopgap bill", Congress has now approved funding your paycheck -- but only till 20 December 2024. What happens between now and then is uncertain, however, <u>preparing yourself financially</u> for a pre-Christmas Government shutdown is easy to do - **if you act now**.

Many Federal Credit Unions will offer 0% loans to <u>each member/depositor</u> whose bi-weekly paycheck is being regularly deposited into their credit union saving/checking account. Union's Investigation into APRA Protocols (continues)

This week the DLI Administration <u>denied</u> the Union's formal Request-for-Information (RFI) regarding the protocols/procedures that were used in this year's <u>Associate Professor Rank Advancement</u> competition. In response to their arbitrary denial, the Union is currently preparing an "Unfair Labor Practice (ULP) complaint" for submission to the Federal Labor Relations Authority (FLRA) early next week.

Some disturbing "irregularities" our Investigation has already uncovered:

- 1.) No "scoring rubric" (at all) was provided to the APRA Evaluators.
- 2.) No "norming sessions" were conducted prior to their evaluations.
- 3.) Some candidates scoring <u>much higher</u> than the "cut-off" point (282.4) were still <u>eliminated</u> from the competition during the "final" interview.
- 4.) The final interview the reason for which is still unclear was worth zero (0) points towards the candidates' final score -- and yet it was used to deny several high-scoring candidates their rank advancement.
- 5.) <u>No audio recordings</u> were made of these interviews, which were conducted by <u>only two</u> Interviewers (who were provided with <u>no</u> scoring rubrics, and never participated in <u>any</u> prior "norming sessions").

In order to <u>continue the momentum</u> of our APRA investigation, the Union is asking <u>ALL 2024 APRA candidates</u> to complete the (enclosed) "APRA Score Translation and Analysis Tool", and forward your <u>completed spreadsheet</u> to us: <u>APRA.protocols.2024@gmail.com</u>

DLI's Faculty/Staff Suicide Problem: what's behind it?

This month (September) was the military's "Suicide Prevention" month.

If you hadn't noticed that, it's probably because the DLI Faculty's "Resiliency Training" (including suicide prevention initiatives) has now been designated as "<u>temporarily on hold</u>".

At the same time, over the past 6 months, your Union's efforts to discuss the suicide problem with the DLI and PoM leadership have only been rebuffed -- most recently by the Garrison Commander's Directive to cease all contact with the garrison's Suicide Prevention program managers.

What's behind DLI's and Presidio's resistance to the Union's efforts?

While it's true that <u>no DLI employee</u> has -- to our knowledge - committed an act of suicide in the past $11\frac{1}{2}$ months, 17 October will mark one year since the employee leading DLI's September 2023 <u>Suicide Prevention</u> program -- <u>ended his own life</u>. *

If <u>that act</u> <u>didn't</u> <u>merit</u> a comprehensive investigation into the possible causes - <u>what else could possibly qualify</u>? And yet the Union is not aware of any such investigation ever being conducted.

Mr. Scott's death was publicly acknowledged however, his <u>cause of death</u> remained "unspoken".

The Union is also unaware of <u>any</u> "*Postvention*" action initiated by DLI or by the Presidio Garrison, either for Mr. Scott, or for the **three previous staff/faculty** members who died by suicide -- a year earlier (in July and November 2022). **

<u>Suicide **Post**vention</u> is a practice now widely considered to be <u>an integral part</u> of any serious Suicide Prevention program. * * *

Coming back to the original question:

What's behind DLI's Staff/Faculty suicide problem?


That's the <u>real question</u>, which a serious **post**vention effort -- led by the management <u>and</u> supported by your Union could certainly have helped to answer.

Unfortunately, that didn't happen, and so the Union is now forced to seek answers using a "different approach".

The survey will be open <u>until next weekend</u>, at which time the Union will close the survey and begin tabulating/analyzing the responses. For 14 years, I was immersed in a rewarding career as a Hebrew teacher at the Defense Language Institute (DLI). Teaching at such a prestigious institution was not just a job but a deeply fulfilling role where I could impart my knowledge and passion for language to service members. However, two years ago, everything changed when the department I worked for closed, leading to my layoff. After much reflection, I decided to follow a long-time dream and start my own business.

I opened <u>The Creperie Cafe</u>, a cozy coffee shop with a unique twist: we specialize in crepes and serve delicious coffee to a loyal community of regulars. The venture has exceeded my expectations, becoming a thriving small business that continues to grow.

The process wasn't without challenges — navigating permits, managing a team, and balancing the day-to-day operations of a café was a steep learning curve. Yet, the support from customers, many of whom are former colleagues and students, has been incredible.




