

Preschool-1st Grade Summer Programs at Monroe Montessori School

Summer Camp offers opportunities for children ages 3 through 6 to work in a Montessori classroom emphasizing self-directed development, refinement and progress. This program runs from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and offers indoor and outdoor activities. Half day classes from 8:30-11:30 are also available.

Summer Camp is focused on learning through discovery. Taught by experienced Montessori teachers, the summer program encourages choices of curriculum that include Practical Life, Sensorial, Mathematics, Language Arts, Science and Cultural Studies as well as the theme of the session.

While each morning students work on classroom activities, afternoons are a time when the teacher reads stories to the children, organizes group games and group interactions, as well as following up morning lessons with activities that reinforce the discovery of new ideas. There is also time set aside to enjoy summer, interact with friends, run through the sprinkler on special days and discover the great outdoors. The teachers have many local outings planned that will keep each day interesting, enjoyable, restful in the afternoon and just the right pace.

The before and after school program provides your child a warm, friendly environment consistent with the Montessori philosophy of respect, consistency and stability. Extended Day is available from 7:00—8:30 am and from 3:30—6:00 pm.

Please note: On warm, sunny days children may participate in outdoor water play. It works best if children bring their swimsuits to school each day. You will also need to pack a towel and a change of clothes along with a bag for the wet clothes. Also, please be sure to put sunblock on your children prior to arrival time. Sun hats and sun shirts are encouraged.

1 June 20 - June 24	Gardening Part 1: Come have fun in the garden! This week we will explore the art of gardening while we learn about maintaining a garden, how to use gardening tools and how to plant fruits and vegetables. We will also learn about what we eat, where our food comes from, and what plants need to grow. We will plant healthy growing snacks (sugar snap peas, carrots and tomatoes) that we can tend to throughout the summer. 2 June 27 - July 1	Gardening Part 2: We continue our study of gardening with flower identification, dissection and pollination. We will learn to identify different types of flowers at the Monroe Community Garden. We will also dissect a flower and learn to name its parts (the petal, corolla, stamen, pistil and calyx). 3 July 11 - July 15	Animals on the Farm: Participants will learn about farm animals big and small such as chickens, rabbits, cows, pigs, horses and even lamas. We will dissect chicken eggs to better explore the parts of the egg. We will have a variety of small game farm animals visiting our classroom including both large Flemish and Holland Lop rabbits. 4 July 18 - July 22	Dinosaurs and Volcanos: T-Rex, Triceratops, Stegosaurus, Velociraptor, Apatosaurus, Pterodactyls and more! Come explore the first reptiles to roam the earth! Which dinosaurs flew? Which dinosaurs were carnivores? Did the first dragonfly really have a wingspan of 2 feet? We will look at all kinds of fossils, some of which dating back to the dinosaur age, and make fern prints and fossils to take home as well. We will also learn about tectonic plates, how a volcano is created, the layers of the Earth and, of course, lava! 5 July 25 - July 29	Pacific Northwest Wilderness & Camping: Join us as we explore some of the many wonders the Pacific Northwest has to offer. We will study PNW animals and learn to identify their tracks. We will also learn about wilderness safety, what to pack when exploring the outdoors and what to bring when camping.
