### **Positive Results in April**

- Having heard about the Community Development District's recent change in policy to no longer have fountains in the various lakes, the Master Board asked Community Development District representatives to attend the Master Board meeting and provide a rationale for such action. The Master Board advised residents to make their feelings known to Community Development District officials, who are elected. At the April Community Development District meeting, their board reversed positions, having found fountains that also provide increased aeration.
- At the Golf and Greens meeting, a motion was made regarding reciprocal golf fees for the summer season. That motion included a higher rate of using guest fees for Lakes Village members, which meant such fees went to the reciprocal club, and did nothing to advance Colonial or its Lakes Village members. After discussion with residents and other Master Board members, this motion was unanimously defeated.
