As one ham noted on the CY0S Facebook page, "Gentlemen, the CY0S DX-pedition to Sable Island should be recognized and remembered as an outstanding example of how it should be done!"

The eight-operator DX-pedition logged more than 84,000 QSOs during its stay on the rarely activated Canadian island known for its unusual crescent shape, history of shipwrecks (it isn't called "The Graveyard of the Atlantic" for nothing), and population of wild horses, featured on the CY0S QSL card:

Before CY0S, Sable Island ranked as the 49th Most Wanted DXCC Entity per "Club Log".

The team was composed of W2GD, Jay, K4ZLE; Craig, K9CT; Lou, N2TU; Dan, W4DKS; Glenn, W0GJ; Murray, WA4DAN; and Lee, WW2DX, along with a crack group of pilots, including members of the CQ DX Hall of Fame.

The island is home to over 250 wild horses and, as the saying goes, wild horses couldn't drag DX Engineering away from the opportunity to play an important role in this major DX-pedition. The active hams at DX Engineering were more than happy to participate, contributing performance-enhancing gear as well as joining DXing enthusiasts the world over in the pileups.
