"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him, may not perish but have eternal life."

John 3:16

What comes to mind when you hear that verse? When did you first learn that verse? When you start to hear the verse you can rattle off the rest by memory? This is a favorite verse for many people.

God loves us and the world and Jesus died. There is the gospel in a nutshell. But that verse that is so familiar has great significance for our daily life. That verse is more than words. That verse came alive in the person of Jesus Christ. Death and perishing is not what God intended for us or his creation rather God is on the side of life and not just daily life but the promise of a future- eternal life.

During the month of March come and explore what life and a relationship with God and Jesus is all about. During Sunday morning worship we will hear the promises that God offers to us through covenants he made throughout the Bible. We will hear

stories and words of promise, blessing, and transformation.

Here are the themes for March:

March 4th: Moses and Israeli in the promise of life given in the commandments. Also Jesus overturning the tables in the temple reminding us that God love and worship of God is at the heart of our relationship with God.

March 11th: We are reminded of the promise God made to Moses that even in the wilderness there is the promise of life. Look at the bronze serpent and you will live. Jesus is promised to be lifted up and restores our relationship to God and on the cross we have the promise of life.

March 18th the Adult Education Committee will be leading worship. This worship will focus on what is the life that God intends for us to live in the here and now. We will be looking at living life in the following areas: Faith life, family and friends, movement, medical, work, emotional, nutrition, and family and friends. God wants us to be healthy and to care for ourselves and each other. Come and celebrate the person God created and calls you to be.


March 25th: Palm Sunday we begin the journey of Holy Week. We celebrate that our Savior has come. Hosanna, the shouts of people, means, "Lord save us now." There is what John 3:16 is all about. Jesus coming to save us. Take time in March not just to experience the March Madness of sports, but experience the March of peace and love that God the creator has to offer to you in a relationship with Jesus Christ.

MAUNDY THURSDAY

March 29th 7:00 p.m.

Maundy Thursday is the night we remember our Lord breaking bread with his disciples and Instituting or beginning the meal we know as Holy Communion. This is a special time to pause and to give thanks “Maundy” means “command” and on this day we celebrate Jesus’ command to “love one another” (John 13:34). We celebrate Holy Communion on Maundy Thursday because this is the night Christ gave the church this gift of Holy Communion. In this holy supper,

Jesus’ actions on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday shows us that following Christ means crossing the boundary from selfishness to servant-hood. On Maundy Thursday the plot to betray and kill Jesus begins to unfold. Yet in the midst of that Jesus has a meal with his disciples and afterwards washes their feet.

Maundy Thursday worship ends with the stripping of the altar which reminds us that Jesus was stripped before he was beaten and crucified. We are also reminded that Christ was stripped of his dignity on the cross and that our servant-hood involves humility and self-denial.

For those who are interested please contact Pastor Joyce. Instruction for those interested in receiving First Communion will be Wednesday evening at 7:00pm following the Worship. The dates are March 14th, 21st, 28th.

GOOD FRIDAY March 30th 7:00pm

Good Friday is the day we pause to remember the death of Christ. Make room in your Good Friday to pause, reflect, pray, and thank Jesus for the sacrifice he made for YOU. During the afternoon the church will be open for you to stop any time to pray, read the Bible or just be in the presence of Christ. There will be prayers to pray and Scripture passages to read. The cross will be center in the sanctuary and chairs around the cross to sit and pray for just a few minutes.

The prayers and Bible passages focus on the men and women who surrounded Jesus during those last days of his life and who were with Jesus at his death. The prayers will also include prayers for our nation, world, and people you know.

This time is FOR YOU to come and pray, read and pause, and is totally up to you when you come and how long you stay. This is YOUR time to pause and remember the importance of Good Friday.

A Good Friday worship will be held at 7:00 p.m. The focus of the worship service will be a series of reading and hymns which focus on the death of Christ.





1st Lutheran Church Council Monthly Meeting Minutes – February 14th, 2018

Call to Order.

President Douty called the meeting to order at 8:00 pm.

Devotions

Devotions were given my Bob Douty

Secretary's Report.

All members that were present reviewed the minutes from the previous meeting (Jan 2018). A motion was made and seconded to approve as written. Motion carried.

Treasury's Report.

Sharleen introduced herself to the new members and discussed the financial statements presented. After the information was reviewed and discussed a motion was made and seconded to approve the report as written, including paying the accounts payable. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report.

Pastor Joyce's report included information on the upcoming Lenten Services and her busy schedule now that Lent is upon us.

President's Report.

President Douty discussed the:

- Introduction of the new members of the council.
- Schedule that deals with devotions for the monthly council meetings and a schedule for individuals that would be responsible to pick up the offering weekly and place within the safe in the church office.
- Council books and information within. He encouraged all committee members to review the job description for their specific committee provided to include the updated constitution and bylaws. The intent is to update with current doctrine and policies as it relates to 1st Lutheran. He would like committees to return the information back to the council for our review by the April meeting.

Adult Ed Report.

Nancy Johnson reported that her committee has put together a plan for the year and more information will be forthcoming.

Sunday School Report.

Pastor Joyce reported for Kristen that they have developed a document that will outline milestones that we have failed to implement in the past couple of years. They are looking forward to beginning this process immediately.

Congregational Life.

No committee member present, therefore not report submitted.

Outreach and Mission.

Gen Velde reported that their committee had met last week and decided to implement a drive to collect non-perishable food to donate to the Pipestone Food Shelf. The first week was last Sunday and will continue through Lent. Sister Churches was also discussed, along with selecting a date for the banquet.

Property Management.

No member of their committee was present to provide a full report. However Mark Zinnel our custodian was present at their last committee meeting and one item that he bought up was the sign that they are reviewing on Highway 30 directing cars south to our church. It is outdated and needs to be larger. More information will be brought to future council meeting.

Worship.

Mark Zinnel reported that Tami Stevens donated a Christmas tree to the church. Mark will obtain a Sam's card to be used in the future to take advantage of the saving for many of the events that take place throughout the year. He had been using his card from work and since he is no longer employed there, he cannot use it. Mark is concerned that we are short of individual that volunteered to assist after communion with the clean-up. The worship committee need for member to step up and volunteer.

Youth.

No committee member present, therefore not report submitted.

Old Business

- Youth and Family Ministry Coordinator. The position has been listed in the Star, our bulletin and the voice. So far one individual has indicated that they were interested. It was decided we will wait a couple of weeks before we take any action.
- Constitution-By Laws-Resolution Update. President Douty explained to the council the necessary action and time line that will need to be adhered to approve the change to this document. This time line will allow our members to review the proposed document and if necessary submit changes along with a final vote for implementation. The executive committee will meet and present to the council within the next couple of months a time line that could be used to move forward.
- Pairing with Grace Lutheran. A meeting was just conducted with the president of both congregations and Pastor Joyce to decide how to move forward. It was decided to consolidate all previous correspondence for clarity and to visit other congregations with our region that have experienced pairing to gather information that will make our proposed transition in the future easier.
- Shingles. Nothing new to report, due to Property Management not available.

New Business

- Youth Checking Account. Christy Appel submitted an e-mail that her committee requested that certain individual be listed as responsible for the financial checking account. A motion was made and seconded to approved the recommendation of their committee:
 - o Remove Gen Velde
 - o Add Erin Musch and Bob Douty
- Motion carried.
- Memorial Money. The president brought up for discussion the ongoing problem of maintaining a current report of all memorial money given to the church. Currently we do not possess that option and should do so. It was decided that the Office Manager begin the recording for historical purpose. Unless the memorial has been directed for a specific requirement, the money is just placed in the general fund. The endowment committee has asked for the council to review this policy and with the possibility of the memorial money (without certain restrictions) be given to their committee to invest in First Lutheran Church ELCA endowment fund. It is a way of growing this fund with real possibilities of receiving distributions that can be used as directed by the council for future projects etc.
- Noisy Offering. Continue to do one a month, maybe with the kids involved. No real discussion was made.
- Thank you. The intent was from the council to send out to our members thank yous that reflect our true meaning as Christians.

Adjournment.

The meeting was adjourned by President Douty.



PIPESTONE COUNTY FOOD SHELF

Did you know that Pipestone County Food Shelf served 489 households in 2017. Those 489 household totaled 1,561 individuals. The Food Shelf is meant to be used for emergency purposes. People can use the food shelf once a month. In 2017 the food shelf distributed 162,923 pounds of food!!!! The food shelf needs people like you to continue this worthwhile ministry. You can support the food shelf in three ways:

- Bring food. The church will be gathering food until April 1st. There is grocery cart in the entryway of the church. Let's fill that cart to overflowing with food !
- Give financially to the food shelf. The money you give has purchasing power. Roger, the director of the Pipestone County Food Shelf, can purchase food through Second Harvest. He can stretch every dollar you give
- Serve at the food shelf. Karen Hellie is the contact person if you would like to help out at the food shelf.

There are 16 different churches that serve at the food shelf each Thursday. The board for the food shelf is made up of a representative from each of the 16 churches. We say a huge thank you to Karen Hellie who faithfully serves as First Lutheran's representative. Karen also serves as the secretary on the board.

We also say thank you to the many volunteers from First Lutheran who have helped serve at the food shelf when needed. Volunteers include:
