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Grace peace and joy be with you this month as we journey into August. August to me is a month of transitions. First Lutheran Church Endowment Fund Update

In October 2016 First Lutheran established an Endowment account with the ELCA. Through June 30, 2018, \$4,618.68 in interest has been earned by this account. In January 2018, the Ivar and Lois Benson Mission Endowment Fund was established, also with the ELCA. Through June 30, 2018, this account has earned \$737.72 in interest.

Formal approval was made by the Church Council in January 2018 that all of the proceeds generated from these two accounts through 2018 would be used to help fund the salary of the Youth and Family Ministry Coordinator. To that end, \$5,356.40 has been

earned through June 30, 2018 to help offset this expense.

Establishing a new endowment account or adding to an existing fund can be done through gifts of cash, check, real estate, stocks, bonds, mutual funds, life insurance, annuities or an estate bequest. These gifts are held permanently with only the earnings being used. Further information regarding endowment giving in the form of a question and answer session led by a representative from the ELCA is tentatively scheduled for this fall. A specific date will be noted in an upcoming edition of the VOICE and Church bulletins.

It has been awhile since my last letter. I hope you have been enjoying the activities of summer. I have been busy preparing the new FLCW booklet for 2018-2020. Wow! 2020 is really that close. The booklet will be arriving in mid to late August. It will be colorful and difficult to miss in your mailbox. After the church directory last summer, I found many names that were not included in our last booklet. All circles will be receiving new members. Try to include them and realize that not all know what Kaffi Ti, LWR, and other things are.

I have some exciting news for this month! On **Wednesday, August 15 from 6:30-8:30PM**, we will be having a **retreat on Prayer**. It will be led by Pastor Joyce and held at the Parsonage - **843 6th St SW**. Bring a **“Snack to Share and a Heart for Prayer.”** Beverages will be provided. You may bring your June and July/August *Gather* magazine along if you so choose. Some information will be taken from it, but not all.

School supplies are now on sale! I hope you are shopping with our School Kits in mind. We have many backpacks to fill. Extra ones were ordered last year. We can make more, too. Last year we made 144 for LWR and 4 for PAS. Items needed are:

- *4 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper approx.. 8x10 ½ “, no loose leaf paper
- *1 30 centimeter ruler or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- *1 pencil sharpener * 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons * 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well) *5 unsharpened #2 pencils; secure together with rubber band
- *5 ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with rubber band *1 eraser approx. 2 ½” long
- * 1 drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approx. 14x17” with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

Happy Shopping! We will be assembling these kits for God’s Work-Our Hands in September.

The Shetek Quilt Auction went very well! Total money raised was \$32,025.25. We think this is a record! Marv even jumped in the lake with his clothes on when the final number was totaled. We were lucky the auction was before all the rain came in July. One week of camp had to be cancelled-you could not get there with the flooded roads to Keeley Island.

Thanks for donating. We made some baskets using items left after Kaffi Ti. Let’s do that again next year!

I hope to do this since I have a lot more free time now that my time as Synodical President has concluded. Joan Iverson was elected at the convention in June at St. Cloud. She will do a fine job!

ALICE Training option based tactics have become the accepted response, versus the traditional "lockdown only" approach.








FLY NIGHT AT THE BIRDCAGE!
