1st Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes Sep 12th, 2018

Members Present: Pastor Joyce, Bob Douty, Paul Henriksen, Nancy Johnson, Neil Johnson, Mark Zinnel, Kristen Brockberg, Shelia Johnson and Deb Reinert.

Members Absent: Teresa Jansen, Gen Velde and Sharleen Ludolph.

Call to Order: President Douty called the meeting to order at 8:00 pm

Secretary's Report:

All members present reviewed the minutes from the Aug 8th, 2018 meeting. A motion was made and seconded to approve. Motion carried.

Treasurers Report:

Bob Douty reviewed the financial reports to include the payables with the members present. Discussion followed, insuring that the pre-school invoices (5 total) be given to the men's committee for payment as earlier agreed upon by their committee. A motion was made and seconded to approve the report as written. Motion carried.

Pastors Report:

- Pastor mentioned that the fair was challenging this year with help. However it allowed her to visit with customers/members at the stand vs. in the past of working. It was much better and easier.
- Three baptisms this month and 2 wedding scheduled for Sept & Oct are in the planning stage.
- On the 9 of Aug the families that had met with the Pastor in July continued their conversation and discussion at the SW Park.
- Pastor Joyce has volunteered to assist Christ Lutheran Church in Slayton due to the shortage of a pastor.
- Pastor was involved at a retreat at Lake Shetek during the period 24-25 Aug.
- A pre-school incident had occurred the other day and both the school and church are adjusting.
- Parenting class has begun – 5 families represented
- Confirmation kick-off – 3 new youth

President Report:

Due to the resignation of Monica Derby earlier in July, the council decided in Aug to contact her one more time to see if her schedule had changed and allowed her to fulfill the remaining 4 months. Contact was made in Aug; however she has decided that it was not the right time to continue as sec. I asked the council if they had thought about a replacement and the name of Linda Hollingsworth surface because she had just served as the sec previously. The President indicated he would reach out to her and ask. If she declines then the responsibilities falls back onto the nominating committee which the President will get involved.

Vice President:

Has reached out to Barry Berkenpas (President from Grace Lutheran Church, Lake Benton) to continue to the conversation of the possibility of sharing staff personnel.

Youth and Family Coordinator:

- Youth Event next week at the Hiawatha Pageant Grounds
- Confirmation is ongoing.

Adult Ed Report:

Parenting with Hope for young families. Will be having a meeting in 2 weeks.

Congregational Life:

Property Management:

- Committee is getting a bid for outside spraying and fertilizing for the church.
- Committee is looking at replacing the hand railing and deck at the parsonage. The deck is in bad shape.
- The committee has been notified about the increase in number of bats in the church. Discussion was addressed as to the options. The committee will look into getting a bid from sources that deal with removal of the bats.

Sunday School:

- Bibles have been given out (3 year old and 3rd Grades).
- Sunday school program is up for a renewal in Oct.

Worship:

On the 21st of Oct, a representative from the Banquet will be providing a temple talk during the Sunday service. This will occur just prior to our church support the Banquet on the 24th of Oct.

Youth:

Fair Stand Report.

- o Received the final financial (expenses and payables)
- o Looking at different options for workers next year involving additional individuals. More information to come.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Constitution and By-laws.
 - o It was agreed to print copies of the new constitution and by-laws pass them out at upcoming Sunday service and those that have not will then be mailed to them for their review.
 - o This process needs to begin the week of the 23rd of Sept. with the mailing to go out and in their possession NLT 20 Oct 2018.
- Pre-School.
 - o A signed contract has been received back from the Pipestone Area School Board approving the lease for school year 2018-2019.
 - o Questions from the council were addressed (i.e. payment status). President will check with the school as to their policy.
- Personnel Committee. Lay personnel of Steve Werner and Marlys Winter have been identified by the church staff to represent them for their annual evaluation later this year.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Synod Contribution for 2018.
 - o We received a letter from the Synod referencing that they have not received any contributions from our church for this calendar year. The church budget has allowed for our church to pay the Synod in the amount of \$2,000.00. A motion was made and seconded to pay the \$2,000.00 with discussion as to how we are going to pay this amount. We currently do not have the amount required. Vote was called and the motion failed.
 - o Further discussion was addressed with the thought of paying the \$2,000.00 by the 14th of Nov 2018. We would use the noisy offering prior to the 14th for 5 Sundays and if we did not generate

enough funds, the balance would come from the reserve fund. Motion was made and seconded. Motion carried.

- Shetek Presentation. Lake Shetek Lutheran Ministries would like to attend an Oct or Nov council meeting to further address their concerns and opportunities for the future going forward. President will contact them to attend in the Oct or Nov council meeting.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

ADJOURNMENT: The meeting was adjourned by President Douty at 10:00 pm.



Pre-School (1st Lutheran Church) School Year 2018-2019

Over that last few months your church council and the Pipestone Area School have met on numerous occasions to discuss the possibility of leasing some of the downstairs classrooms to the Pipestone Area Pre-School for the upcoming school year. The intent of the school was to consolidate locations (from the previous location of United Methodist and Jasper) to make the Pre-School more economical for transportation, feeding etc. Our church was a good fit for the number of rooms they needed and the availability of those rooms were not being used on a regular basis. We have done our due diligence on our part of establishing a solid lease that provides good guidance for both the lessor and lessee. We are still crossing the t's and dotting the i's and I'm sure there will be some questions on both parties as we move forward through the school year. Toni Baartman has been instrumental in the coordination and I thank her for her impute, guidance and understanding. Mark Zinnel our Youth & Family Ministry Coordinator and Custodian will oversee the day to day coordination with the school. If there are any questions, feel free to address them to him or any member of the church council.


Prayer at the Parsonage will be held on Tuesday, September 25 at 6:30pm. More praying will be done this time. Check the bulletin on Sunday for more details.
