Dear Saints in Christ:

“You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.’ This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it:

‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’ (Matthew 22:37b-39)

November is the month of Thanksgiving, bounty, family time, harvest, and fall decorations. November is also the time of All Saints Sunday. This year Veterans Day, Sunday, November 11th marks the 100 anniversary of the end of World War I. Then of course there is Thanksgiving on November 22nd. As you can see there is much to grateful for in the month of November.

So, how do you show your gratitude? What is it that you are grateful for? Most people would say they are grateful for family, friends, and food. But the call of gratitude goes much deeper. Gratitude is our theme for the month of November. So what do we mean by gratitude?

Gratitude is appreciation for who we are, what we have, and knowing the source of life is God. I came across the following definition of gratitude: “Gratitude reminds us we are not self-made, but God-made. Gratitude liberates us from the false notion of self-reliance and moves us to reliance upon our Creator. Gratitude prompts us to see ourselves in community with each other and, most importantly, with God. Gratitude is part of stewardship.”

We will look at gratitude from a variety of standpoints.

November 4th: All Saints Sunday, we will pause and give thanks for people whom we have loved and lost this past year. We will remember them with gratitude and be thankful for their faith. Our lessons for this Sunday will Psalm 103:1-5, 10-15, Philippians 4:4-9, and Parable of the Sower, Luke 8:4-8, 11-15.

November 11th: Veterans Day, we will remember our veterans and will look at the theme of **Developing Gratitude in Daily Life**. Our lessons are: Psalm 19, 2 Corinthians 9:6-11, and The Rich Young Man, Matthew 19:16-30

November 18th: Gratitude is an Attitude. Deuteronomy 8:1-10, Isaiah 55:1-6, Parable of the Talents Matthew 25:14-30

November 25th: Gratitude a Way of Daily Living. Deuteronomy 6:1-9, Joel 2:21-27, and The Cleansing of the 10 Lepers, Luke 17:11-19

Gratitude and stewardship are connected. What are we stewards of? It all begins with God. God has created the world and that we see and don't see. God also breathed life into us and we are in partnership with God and one another to care for the earth, each other, and ourselves. Our purpose in life is to work together with God to not build our own kingdom and wealth but to build up one another. Come and give thanks to God and worship the God of creation.

The Southwestern Minnesota is one of 65 synods in the ELCA, which are grouped into nine regions. Our Region 3 consists of the nine synods of North Dakota, South Dakota, and Minnesota. We are the third largest synod in terms of number of congregations with 240 congregations and one mission start. We are the fourth largest synod in terms of baptized members with 113,896. More than 360 ministers (including 125 retired ministers) are rostered in the Southwestern Minnesota.

The congregations and all the baptized who are the Southwestern Minnesota Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America are claimed by this mission: God places us in cities, farms and towns together under one prairie sky. The Risen Christ surprises us with opportunities to plant God's Word in the world. By God's grace together we have what we need.

The Synod office is in Redwood Falls Minnesota. The Synod Staff include: Rev. Jon Anderson who serves as the Bishop of the Synod. Rev. Linda Pedersen and Kathryn Skoglund serve as the Synod Ministers. Rev. Larry Strenge serves as the Director for Evangelic Mission.

It is the ministry of the synod to support the living out of faith in congregations and individuals lives. Walking together in confidence, we cultivate life-giving congregations, nurture partner ministries, and cooperate in the life of the ELCA.

The word Synod means, "walking together." The synod office and staff walk with us to encourage, support, and guide congregations and pastors into their calling to be the church in this time and place.


We are trying to set up a Krumkake Lessons event, too. Watch the bulletin for the date. Let me know if you want to learn how to make Krumkake.






Junior High Youth Gathering
