As you may know, I love to sing. I love music, both listening to it, and performing it. Over the years I have been in band, marching band, choir, brass choir, orchestra, pit orchestra, accompanied, conducted, been an audience member, and worked at Orchestra Hall in Minneapolis. Music has always been a part of my life. My dad would sing in the car, and whistle. My mom took piano lessons as a child. I was in Greater Twin Cities Youth Symphonies in high school, and was a

member of the above ensembles in college. I have played piano for nursing home services, and conducted ensembles as a substitute music teacher. I've been in church choirs since 3rd grade. If I had to choose whether to lose my sight or my hearing, I may very well choose sight, as not hearing music, and sounds of creation, would likely be more difficult for me than not seeing the faces of loved ones or gorgeous sunsets again.

When listening to the radio, I tend to choose "oldies" stations, which play music from the 60s, 70s, 80s, and 90s. There has been a resurgence of the music of Peter, Paul and Mary, and Pete Seeger lately, music which I grew up with via my dad's record collection, which also contained Whoopie John and other oom-pah music. Music of the 80s brings me back to high school and college. Or, I tune into to the classical music station, which was often on in the living room. I bet each of you could list your favorite type of music to listen to, sing, or play. There are many options to choose from!

Church is full of music, too. We are very blessed to have Paul Henriksen as our organist. I am thankful for his willingness to be here week after week, putting in practice time on the hymns, liturgy, and prelude/postlude music. When Paul is unable to be here, others share their musical talents, either in person (the Worship Team), or via YouTube videos (from a variety of sources). We also enjoy the LIFT kids and their enthusiasm when they sing. I know that some songs or hymns are new, or can be difficult to sing. Others are old favorites, and you light up with anticipation when they are listed in the bulletin. The way music is chosen here is this: we have a book that has all sorts of worship information in it for each week – text summaries, ideas for preaching, prayers, and even music suggestions. Tami Taubert makes a list of suggested songs or hymns for each week, based on this book, or using other hymns she thinks would be appropriate. Then I look at Tami's list to see how it flows into the rest of the service, if the music supports the message of the rest of the service, and change any hymns/songs as needed. Tami usually selects the songs sung by the Worship Team, as she knows what music they know.

This system has been working well. However, sometimes people want to sing a favorite hymn or song, but it never comes up. We don't know what songs or hymns you know or love, and want to sing! So, elsewhere in the Voice there is a form to fill out, letting Tami and me know what songs or hymns YOU would like to sing. They will be compiled into a list, and we will sing as many as we can in the next year or so. You may know songs that I don't, and some of the songs I know might be unfamiliar to you, yet I think they are old standards. I look forward to seeing what you come up with, and singing <u>your</u> favorites in the future.

A time to pay attention

During Epiphany, let's notice the ways God appears to us

I have a bad habit of looking at my feet when I walk. I don't often stub my toe or trip on uneven ground, but occasionally I run into something or someone I'm not expecting.

Our 2-year-old has the opposite issue. While we walk around our neighborhood, his head is always up and looking around. This means he often trips over his feet, but his view of the world is much broader than mine. As is the case with most toddlers, he might ask, "What's that?" or "What's their name?" or "What's that called?" His curiosity reminds me that a simple shift in perspective can engender wonder.

Whether I'm looking at my feet while I walk, hunching over my cellphone or resting my elbows on a desk at work, this posture of folding inward prevents me from truly seeing the expansiveness of God's good creation. This makes me wonder about the opportunities we miss simply because our posture doesn't allow us to see the world around us. Epiphany marks the day and the church season when Jesus comes to be named and understood as God's own son, the living and breathing manifestation of God in our midst.

The Epiphany story begins with three magi noticing a new star and setting off on a journey. Arriving at their destination, these three people from distant places encounter a child born to a teenage mother in a little-known town, a birth heralded by livestock and ranchers. Jesus' birth story isn't what most imagine when they think of a newborn king. Yet the magi come to see and understand Jesus as God on Earth.

Most of us think of an epiphany as a flash of insight, but what if Epiphany is an invitation to notice the beauty and brilliance of what's already there?

The name Epiphany comes from the Greek *epiphaneia*, meaning "manifestation." Most of us think of an epiphany as a flash of insight, but what if Epiphany is an invitation to notice the beauty and brilliance of what's already there?

The magi found a new star in the sky. They bore witness to the presence of God within little Jesus. And during the time after Epiphany, we'll hear Gospel stories of Jesus growing in his understanding of who he is as God's child and of the kind of messiah he is called to be. Perhaps, then, Epiphany is less a sudden realization and more a growth in understanding.

When I realign my focus, when I notice how much I cast my eyes to the ground or hunch over, I can lift my head, straighten my posture and enjoy a new perspective. With my eyes up, I'm free to perceive and appreciate the beautiful diversity of the people and plants and creatures I encounter. I can truly see my neighbors, noticing when someone is having a rough day. I can even serve my neighbor who's reaching out for help.

Amid what's been a very challenging season for many, something as simple as letting someone know you've noticed them can produce a profound impact. We long to be seen by each other and God.

Epiphany calls us to see our neighbors—our neighbor in need, our neighbor who's struggling, our neighbor who puts on a brave face at worship while suffering inside, as well as our neighbor who's rejoicing. It calls us to notice neighbors who don't look, worship, speak, vote or pray as we do. It calls us to recognize them, too, as God's children.

Amid what's been a very challenging season for many, something as simple as letting someone know you've noticed them can produce a profound impact. We long to be seen by each other and God.

How differently might we treat one another if the first thing we noticed about someone was their identity as a beloved child of God?

When we notice and focus on what draws us together rather than what drives us apart, we can approach our differences from a place of genuine care and concern for one another's well-being. By seeking to understand our neighbors, we can build the world God intends—a world ruled by peace, built upon equity and justice, and infused with the sweet fragrance of love.

During this time after Epiphany, let's commit to noticing and celebrating all the ways God appears in our time and place. You might create a list and write down every time you notice God in your world—from people, plants and animals to the movements of stars and other heavenly bodies.

Take a cue from my 2-year-old: Keep your head up and look around. Maybe you'll fill up your notebook with signs of God's presence so quickly that you'll need to buy another one. Notice your opportunities to bless and be blessed by others. Surely the Messiah is with us.

Lutheran World Relief Wildfire Disaster Project

Lutheran World Relief is requesting kits, quilts and funds to address the California Wildfire Disaster as well as the Carolina Hurricanes of last fall. The supply of the quilts and kits is constantly being shipped in the U.S. as well as around the world.

To help with this project, First Lutheran will be gathering items for the Personal Care Kits starting in February. This is usually a project that is done during Lent, but the decision was made to start now.

ITEMS NEEDED ARE:

~Bath Towels (20x40 to 27x52, dark colors preferred, NEW) ~Soap (each kit needs 8-9oz bars of soap - or 2-3 bars each) ~Toothbrush (adult size, in original packaging) ~Sturdy Comb - there are many different types of hair, so no picks or fine-toothed combs, please! ~Metal nail clipper (attached nail file optional)



Nail clippers, bath towels and combs are the items least donated.

Please bring your items to the church and put them in the purple bucket in the Narthex. Kits will be assembled as items arrive. We strive for 40 for the 40 Days of Lent. Last year we sent 44 kits. It would be GREAT to double that amount!

This is a CHURCH project, not just an FLCW project.


President's Day
