#### O Come, O Come, Emmanuel...

So, begins, in my opinion, one of the most hauntingly beautiful hymns in the hymnal. Maybe it is because it is in a somber key. Maybe it is because the tune is from the 1400s, likely originally a chant done in a monastery. Maybe because it expresses in both words and music the longing and waiting that each one of us knows as the days get darker and colder, more dreary, when we begin looking forward in hope to the arrival of Christ, of God fulfilling the prophesies of old. Maybe I have memories or images of sitting in a darkened room, lit only by candles, hearing the plaintive pleas of the people, and the promises of God, sung acapella by men, accompanied by at first a single bell, then adding more instruments. And the refrain: Rejoice! Rejoice Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

That is the promise – Emmanuel (God with Us) shall come to us. We will not be left alone, out in the cold, hungry and lonely and without hope. We shall be able to rejoice. But not yet. For now, we wait.

We wait through the four weeks of Advent, preparing our hearts, minds, and hearts for the arrival of Jesus. But there are other preparations happening at this time as well.

The children are preparing their Christmas pageant songs and recitations. Gift-buying either is or soon will be in full swing. Stock is being taken of the supply of bags, tissue paper, bows, wrappings, and tape to wrap or disguise purchases. Baking, or at least recipe and ingredient gathering, is taking place. Christmas music is everywhere.

But in the midst of the holiday preparations, the hustle and bustle of getting everything ready, it is easy to forget for what, for whom, we are waiting — Emmanuel, God with Us.

My prayer for each of us this Advent season is that we will remember to prepare, prepare our hearts for the arrival of Emmanuel, who needs nothing more than open hearts.

Call to Order: President, Craig Thies, called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm.

**<u>Devotions:</u>** Devotion was led by Cristy A. Next month Ingrid W. will lead devotion.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Lori I. went over the bills and pointed out that First Fruits was updated in the operating statement. Ingrid W. made a motion to pay the bills and Mike S. 2nd the motion and it was approved.

**Secretary's Report:** The minutes from the September meeting were reviewed. Cristy A. made a motion to accept the Secretary's Report and Kristy H. 2nd the motion and it was approved.

#### Pastor's Report:

- · Pastor Ann handed out her report for September and this was reviewed.
- The Council reviewed Pastor Ann's upcoming date list, from her September report. A few notes are Pastor and Lori's medical insurance need to be decided on by the church in October. In the past, they've had Gold+ with an FSA. The other option would be Silver+ with an HSA. Congregation would be expected to contribute to the fund, so the costs are equivalent. Lori and Pastor Ann will make a recommendation and Craig T will review the costs.

- · Piano tuner all of the church pianos were tuned last year. Cost last year was \$540 for all 4 pianos (\$135 each). Council recommended the sanctuary piano and downstairs choir piano be tuned once a year and the other 2 pianos be done every other year.

#### Are you looking for a great gift idea for a wedding or even Christmas?


