Greetings pilgrims on the journey,

During the season of Lent, we travel with Jesus from the wilderness to the upper room and to the cross. We take time to be with Christ and ponder his love for us. His love was made known as he taught people, healed people, and journeyed with his disciples. In Lent, we are not only pilgrims but we are on a journey. A journey is a passage from one place to the next. We journey with Jesus and one another as we prepare our hearts.

Our theme for Wednesday night worship services will be: "THE BODY OF CHRIST." Worship will be at 5:30 starting on Ash Wednesday, February 17th. Our worship service will help us to consider our Lord's humanity, the human body in which He lived, suffered and died. April 1st (Maundy Thursday) Blood of Christ

April 2nd: (Good Friday) Body of Christ

April 4th (Easter) The Risen Body of Christ

Called to serve – First Lutheran needs you.

Our council has decided to continue First Lutheran's relationship with Pipestone Meals on Wheels. You may know that this group uses our kitchen daily to assemble meals and as a distribution point for the program. They are always looking for volunteers. Another suggestion from Meals on Wheels is to make a bag lunch that can be eaten over the weekend. This may be a project for a group in the church.

Our Council committee leaders are set up. There will be opportunities to help each committees work. If you were not able to commit to a whole term of service at this time, think about joining committee members for one day or for a short term project as your schedule permits. Be watching for announcements about activities and projects. The more help the better.

Financial Update

What is a narrative budget? It can be used as a story about how First Lutheran practices good stewardship of the gifts entrusted to us. The line item budget is still necessary but when you look at it there is little inspiration in building costs and salary for employees. These are necessary costs for maintaining and growing our congregation. A narrative budget looks different. It gives emphasis to how the spirit is at work in a congregation. By adding categories based on mission, faith formation, worship, stewardship and pastoral care we can see a better picture of how our money followed our congregation goals even in a year of isolation and mortgage payments. Be watching in the next couple months as a review of 2020 is completed and will be presented here as part of this financial update.



The Value of Giving



The Pipestone County Food Shelf, like many other non-profit organizations in our Community, and the region, relies heavily and/or entirely on volunteers to provide its services. In the case of the Food Shelf, we also receive food donations from our local "food rescue" partners as well as individuals, businesses and organizations within the community. What is the value of these "gifts?"

The Food Shelf relies on seventeen churches and one non-profit which compromise the board of directors to provide volunteers to work the distribution at the Food Shelf each week. These organizations provide volunteers each week on a rotating basis throughout the year. In addition, there are seven individuals that help with our deliveries from Second Harvest Heartland two times a month, by unloading the truck, break down pallets, inventory delivered items, and set up the produce area.

In total this means that a little over 350 individuals donate over 2500 hours each year to keep the Food Shelf operating. What is the value of this donated time? A United States membership organization says each volunteer hour is worth \$27.20. Using that metric, the value of hours donated at the Food Shelf would be \$68,000.

Our "Food Rescue" partners (Coburn's and Hanks Foods) along with JB Foods, JBS, Pipestone Holdings, and numerous individuals and organizations from the local area donated 19,330 pounds of food in 2020. Feeding America, assisted by RSM, US, LLP, reviewed accounting records supporting the amount of donated product, as well as the recalculation of the approximate average wholesale value of one pound of donated product at the national level for all product donations for the calendar year 2018. This report is divided into 29 categories as well as an average valuation between \$1.60 - \$1.65 per pound of donated product. Based on a valuation of \$1.60 per pound of local donations would be valued at \$30,928.


On volunteering: "If you don't volunteer during your working years, you probably won't after you retire. Research indicated that while about 75 percent of people who volunteer while working continue their service in retirement, only about a third of people who don't volunteer while working start after retirement. If you do volunteer, you might even feel better. Research shows that volunteers experience less depression, better quality of relationships, increased social interactions and social support, and less loneliness."



First Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes – January 13, 2021

Members Present: Pastor Joyce, Paul Henriksen, Nancy Johnson, Brenda Kellen, Scott Sterud, Tami Taubert, Sharleen Ludolph, and Chris Hollingsworth.

<u>Call to Order:</u> President Paul Henriksen called the meeting to order at 8:05 PM.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Sharleen L. presented the financial reports, the reserve fund report, and the accounts payable report. These were reviewed and discussed by the Council. Brenda K. made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report as written and to pay the accounts payables as noted with changes. Tami T. 2nd the motion and it was approved. It was mentioned that the audit was done last night and everything looked OK.

<u>**Devotions:**</u> We continued with the Growing Young Core Commitments video series. The topic was empathy. Nancy led the discussion and followed with prayer.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> The minutes from the December meeting were reviewed. Tami T. made a motion to approve the minutes as printed, 2nd by Scott S. Motion was approved.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor Joyce talked about empathy and visiting members. Adult Ed needs to meet because people are inquiring about the next book study. Pastor & Brenda will get together to discuss.

Campfirmation is going well. It is hybrid – some are attending by Zoom.

Pastor is the Conference Dean and she has been working a lot with organizing a meeting to elect the new Bishop. The meeting to start this process is 2/21/21.

Pastor Joyce has been talking with pastors who are struggling during this time. People are being stretched. Tomorrow night, Pastor is part of a small group meeting, Cultivating Congregations. They will be discussing how to keep building generosity in the new year.

Pastor is looking ahead to the 5^{th} graders and 1^{st} communion. There are 5 weddings and a couple of baptisms on the calendar for 2021. Ash Wednesday is 2/17/21. There was discussion about options for putting ashes on people's heads. The worship committee will review this and the Lent services.

Pastor is continuing with technology improvements, how to get young families involved, how to get committees jump started again, and how to get people to come back to worship in the church. There was discussion about Facebook Live options – congregation viewing and greetings.

Pastor is taking the last Sunday in February off.

President's Report:

Still looking for someone to update the church's web pages on an ongoing basis. This will be a paid position. Paul thanked the Pastor for all her work during this wild year. He also thanked Tami, Mark, and all who helped with the worship services. Paul stated that there is a good Council group this year and it will be next year too.

Vice-President's Report:

Nancy asked if we should get more "Growing Young" books – Pastor will follow up on this. Nancy has been working on the Narrative budget.

Committee Reports

- Adult Ed Brenda K. Sent her year review to Ellie. 1 yr book study. 3 yr Growing Young.
- Property Management Scott S. handed out the 1 yr and 3 yr report. Report was reviewed.
- Worship Tami T. They have no 1 and 3 yr plans yet, but are meeting Wednesday to discuss.

Old Business - None

New Business

- Brenda K. made a motion to use the Endowment Donation to pay the Food Shelf \$915.36. Tami T. 2nd the motion and it was approved.
- Scott S. made a motion to approve the change of the automatic transfer at First State Bank, from \$2,482.59 to \$2,517.36. Tami T. 2nd the motion and it was approved.
- Meals on Wheels They have been using the church kitchen since April. They have asked if they can continue to use the kitchen, because there is no room at the new Senior Center for this program. The City does not fund this program. There was discussion maybe church could do some extra Saturday bag lunches and help with deliveries. Tami T. made a motion to let Meals on Wheels continue to use the church kitchen through 2021. Brenda K. 2nd the motion and it was approved.
- Memorials Paul distributed a handout for a new committee, the Memorial Committee. This committee would track the funds given as undesignated memorials. It would consist of 2 members, one who is a council member. Tami T. made a motion to set up a Memorial Committee. It was 2nd by Scott S. and approved.
- Undesignated Gifts The percentages of how to distribute non-designated gifts was reviewed. A motion was made by Brenda K. to update the percentages as follows: Benevolence 15%, Debt Reduction 0%, Endowment 35%, Capitol Improvements 35%, Sabbatical 2%, Reserve & Misc 13%. Nancy J. 2nd the motion and it was approved.
- Annual Meeting Council discussed the meeting. It will be January 24th at about 10:30 am. Need 22 people for a quorum and Zoom options were discussed.
- Pastor left the room. Paul stated that Pastor Joyce and Ellie had their annual reviews and both received satisfactory ratings. Council had discussion and we are pleased with their work. Discussion was tabled until next month.

<u>Adjournment:</u> The meeting was adjourned at 9:44 pm, with a prayer from Pastor Joyce, followed by the Lord's Prayer. *Chris Hollingsworth*, Secretary
