Grace peace and warmth be with you today and in the month of February

The season of Epiphany continues in February. Epiphany is the season of light and making Christ known. Christmas is celebrating the birth of Christ and the season of Epiphany answers the question, “Who is this child of Bethlehem?” “Who is this one named Jesus Christ?” The word ‘epiphany’ is a Greek word meaning ‘to reveal.’ When you have had a great idea or you learned something or gained a new insight you might say, “I have had an epiphany.” The season of Epiphany is learning new insights about Jesus and what it means for us to be his followers.

Epiphany begins with the bright star leading the Magi to worship the infant Jesus. Epiphany concludes with Jesus being made known as the Son of God on the Mount of Transfiguration. Jesus is with Peter, James, and John and he is changed and the glory of God is around them. God speaks to them from a cloud, “This is my Son, the Beloved, with him I am well pleased, listen to him!” (Matthew 17:5). The challenge for us in our busy, noisy, demanding schedules is to ask "what does it mean for us to listen to Christ so he can reveal himself to us?".

During the season of Epiphany our gospel lessons proclaim Jesus as teacher, healer, and the Son of God. Epiphany is the season of light and the mission and ministry of Jesus is made known. In other words, Jesus is doing what he came to do which was bringing in the kingdom of God. Like Christ, the church today is called to engage in the mission of healing, teaching, and making Christ known as the light of the world.

Our gospel lessons in the month of February are from Luke Chapters 4-6. I encourage you to read those chapters. We hear of Jesus preaching in his home town and the reaction of unbelief. (Luke 4:21-30). We next encounter Jesus teaching from a boat and calling fishermen to follow him. (Luke 5:1-11). Jesus also teaches the beatitudes in Luke 6:17-26 and challenges us to ponder what does it mean to be a disciple. Finally on Sunday, February 24th, Jesus answers the question, "what does love look like?" (Luke 6:27-38).

Epiphany themes in the cold of winter warms us with the promise of Jesus who comes to us and meets us where we are at. But Jesus does not leave us the same. He challenges us to seek the kingdom of God and follow him as the light of the world. My prayer during the season of Epiphany is that you will experience your own epiphany of meeting Christ in your life, through your work, through His word, and through his calling.

May the light of Christ guide you in the dark cold days of winter and February.



## 1<sup>st</sup> Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes January 9<sup>th</sup>, 2019

**Call to Order:** President Douty called the meeting to order at 8:00 pm.

**Devotions:** Devotions were given by Deb Reinert

### **REPORTS:**

**Endowment Report:** Chuck Sendelbach, chairman for the Endowment Committee, provided an update report regarding the financial status of the endowment funds. A detailed report will be provided within the annual report and will be addressed at our annual meeting on the 20<sup>th</sup> of Jan 2019.

#### **Secretary's Report:**

The minutes from the December 2018 meeting were reviewed by council. A motion was made by Gen Velde to approve the minutes as written, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Deb Reinert and approved by Council.

#### **Treasurers Report:**

Sharleen Ludolph reviewed the financial reports to include the accounts payable with the members present. Four additional invoices that were not received earlier were also presented for payment. Discussion followed. A motion was made by Gen Velde to approve the financial reports including the accounts payable as presented, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mark Zinnel and approved by Council.

#### **Pastors Report:**

- Ten weddings are planned for 2019.
- Hope in the Heartland, Imagining our Future as Small Congregations will be attend by 3-5 individuals on Feb 2<sup>nd</sup> to discuss the future of smaller congregations. Cost is \$50.00 per congregation, plus \$10.00 per person for lunch etc.
- Pastor will be gone from the 23-26 of Jan 2019 to attend a retreat in the cities.
- Prayer at the Parsonage has been requested by member of our congregation and the pastor will continue the fellowship. Date/Time to be determined

#### **President Report:**

- An amortization schedule for our mortgage was reviewed and discussed by the council comparing 2018 vs. 2019. Note to be paid off by June 2021.

#### **Vice President:**

- Grace Lutheran Church, Lake Benton, MN discussion is still ongoing. There interim pastor will be leaving in April of 2019.

**Youth and Family Coordinator:**

- Mark has had a conversation last week with our insurance company (Grinnell) regarding the churches policy for youth as it relates to safe haven. Further ongoing discussion will be addressed as to our churches policy going forward. An initial policy had been started a couple of years ago and Mark, Bob and Gen will look into the paperwork that was initiated.
- Mark has been in contact with other churches in our community (Cornerstone, Faith and Christ the King) to work together on certain events for the youth in the future.
- A lock in for the Youth is planned. Mark would appreciate parents and or adults to assist in this event.
- A city wide youth service is being planned.

**Adult Ed Report:**

The Epiphany Party was held on the 6<sup>th</sup> of January with 15 individuals. Had a lot of fun with the different dishes served

**Congregational Life:**

Kelli Velde informed the members of the council that the website has been updated and encourages all members of the congregation to share information that could be displayed for information. She is also posting the information on Facebook.

**Outreach and Mission:**

- The outreach committee will continue to break down via quarterly projects and goals to assist in serving the local and international communities.
- Monies were raised during the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2018 for the Heifer project and there are dollars available to purchase an animal for families in need.

**Property Management:**

- Water heater has been replaced in the parsonage.
- The ice on the parking lot is an issue that is being addressed.
- Exhaust fans for the bathrooms in the basement have been replaced. Very noisy before.

**Sunday School:**

Pastor provides some input since Kristen was sick. Working on the Naima Books.

**Worship:**

- Christmas decorations have been put away.
- Discussion is ongoing as to the music for upcoming services with the Praise Team and Organists. Options are being looked at.

**Youth:**

There was no meeting in Dec or Jan. Will meet again with the Youth & Family Ministry Coordinator later in Feb.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

President Bob Douty gave an update on the By-Laws/Constitution vote that will happen at the Annual Meeting.

- We still need reports from the Congregation Life and the Treasurer for completion of the annual report. Will try to finish the report this week so it can be passed out the members that attend this Sunday's service.

The FLCW Brunch will be held sometime this winter or spring. We will look at hosting it when we have a special guest or a celebration to commemorate.


