Change of Seasons – Inside and Out

The seasons turn, both out the window and in the church. The days grow shorter, then imperceptibly longer again. The ground goes from brown to white with snow. Footing gets more treacherous as the snow packs and turns to ice. Welcome to winter in Minnesota!

The church year starts with the season of Advent, the four Sundays/weeks before Christmas Day. We prepare for Jesus' coming, the first time (at Christmas) and the second time (nobody knows when this will be). The color of paraments is blue.

Then we have the season of Christmas, often known because of the song "The 12 Days of Christmas," which lasts from Christmas Day (December 25th) through January 5th. Christmas Day is just the beginning! In this short season, depending on the year, we hear about Jesus' childhood, his baptism, and the start of his ministry. The color of paraments is white.

Then January 6th is Epiphany! Like Christmas, there is both the Day of Epiphany (January 6th), and the Season After Epiphany, which lasts until Fat Tuesday, the day before Ash Wednesday. Since Easter is movable (not a set date), some Epiphany seasons are long, others are shorter. This year there are 7 weeks, as Ash Wednesday is on February 22nd. "Epiphany" means revelation or discovery, such as an "aha!" moment. Epiphany can be a time to show that Jesus' identity was revealed to non-Jews, such as the Magi and Cornelius and his family. This year we will hear stories of John the Baptist, Jesus' baptism, and the Sermon on the Mount. The color of paraments is green.

I look forward to seeing you in church as we explore Jesus' life and ministry through the eyes of the writer of the gospel of Matthew, which we will be following this year. Matthew has Jesus telling many parables and other stories, many familiar, some maybe not so wellknown. Let's discover Matthew's Jesus together!

First Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes - November 9, 2022

Members Present: Nancy Johnson, Craig Thies, Chris Hollingsworth, Pastor Ann, Tami Taubert, Kristy Henriksen, Brenda Kellen, and Scott Sterud.

Call to Order: President, Nancy Johnson, called the meeting to order at 8:00 pm.

Devotions: Tami T. lead the devotions from the Nehemiah Study book, chapter 2. Scott S. will do the devotions next month using chapter 3.

Treasurer's Report: Tim S. was absent – he is sick. Nancy J. presented the financial reports, the reserve fund report, and the accounts payable report. Tim has met with Jennifer N., from Kinner, a couple of times. The Treasurer's reports were reviewed and discussed by the Council. The reports were created by Kinner. There are some report format changes. The details are missing from the Reserve Fund report, which may have been a spreadsheet before. Nancy will talk to Jennifer about the differences. There will have to be a budget meeting set up soon. Craig will look at the Pipestone Building bill tomorrow for approval. Brenda K. made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented. Tami T. 2nd the motion and it was approved. Kristy H. stated that the donation from the Noisy Offering of \$3,278.95, should be paid to the family it was collected for, because their medical bills are coming in. Tami T. made a motion to pay the AP report, with adding the donation payment for medical expenses of \$3,278.95 and holding the Pipestone Building Materials invoice pending approval. Scott S. 2nd the motion and it was approved.

Secretary's Report: The minutes from the October meeting were reviewed. Nancy noted that the minutes should be changed to "add Jennifer Nordmeyer, from Kinner, as an authorized signer on the bank accounts", because she is doing the Treasurer duties now. This change should be sent to Lori ASAP, so it can be taken to the bank for the change. Kristy H. made a motion to accept the Secretary's Report with the correction for Kinner. Tami T. 2nd the motion and it was approved.

Pastor's Report

• Pastor Ann is still living in the parsonage basement. Melissa has started cleaning the parsonage. Pastor will give the window blinds estimate to Property Management for purchase. Pastor Ann and Nancy J. went to Equipping Congregations on Saturday. Pastor Ann started teaching confirmation. Last Sunday was All Saints Day – the service was nice for it. Pastor is looking forward to Advent and Christmas.

President's Report

- Treasurer Position Nancy J. distributed the Treasurer job description. The Council discussed this. Brenda K. made a motion to approve the Treasurer job description as written, Scott S. 2nd the motion and it was approved. The Treasurer position will function like this for now and will be put into the Bylaws.
- Plans for 2023 Council election nominations The Council discussed this and when the Council and Committee nominations need to be submitted by.
- Budget/Personnel Committee The Personnel committee will be meeting in December. The Budget committee will meet in December also.
- 130th Anniversary The 130th anniversary of the Church is in November. The Council decided to celebrate this on November 20th with coffee and treats in the Narthex after the service. Kristy H. will find some volunteers.
- Constitutional Changes Nancy told the Council what the constitutional changes are pronoun changes, emphasis on adding "equity", and holding remote meetings. Kristy H. made a motion to accept the constitutional changes as outlined by Nancy and to accept the communication piece. Tami T. 2nd the motion and it was approved.

Vice-President's Report

• Parsonage Update – Craig stated that the countertop, sink & faucets were supposed to be installed today. Craig has to approve the payment for the appliances and the blinds. The plumbing and cleaning of the house must be done before the move. They plan on moving the Pastor upstairs on November 19th, because all the items will be done by then. Craig said that the bills will start coming in as the project completes.

The Council tabled the discussion. Craig will have the insurance report next month.
- Memorial Donation Mrs. Dallin memorial donation will be every year in Nov. Dec. for the next 10 years. Nancy J. met with her financial advisor.



Confirmation students and Acolyting

Great job by all of the confirmation students who have already helped with acolyting in December!! Your help is appreciated so much! If you are unsure of the date your student was assigned, the student and/or the parent will receive an email and/or a text reminding you a few days before. Otherwise, you can check this link:

(<u>https://www.signupgenius.com/go/9040E4DA4AB2EABF85-december</u>) or go on to our church website to access that link: <u>Worship Information</u> (<u>firstlutheranpipestone.org</u>). We also have a 'What-To-Do" list posted in the

Acolyte closet. But here is a copy of that as well for parents to review with your child

one more time:

- 1. Please be at Church at or before 9:15 a.m.
- 2. Go to the Acolyte closet and find a suitable rope that fits your height. Grab the rope for the waist and tie, add the cross.
- 3. Light the candle lighter from the eternal flame (red candle on the altar) OR use a lighter from the usher stand in the narthex. (To put out the candle lighter, pull the wick back).
- 4. Sit on the Right side of the altar. Sit up (NO SLOUCHING). NO CELL PHONES!!!!!!!!!!! Pay attention and be respectful during the service.
- 5. Helping with offering: during the offering, when the pastor goes up to the altar, acolytes should go to the front steps and stand facing the congregation. When the ushers bring the offering plates, take the plates from the ushers, then turn, carry the plates to the table behind the altar, and return to your designated seat. *If there is special music during the offering, please stay seated until the special music is over.*
- 6. Communion: During communion, acolytes should stand beside the altar. Acolytes will be in charge of bringing the bread and wine to the servers as needed. You are welcome to have communion if you wish.
- 7. Go up to the altar at the end of the last hymn and immediately put out the candles. DO NOT BLOW THEM OUT!! Use the snuffer at on the lighter pole. ALSO – DO NOT PUT OUT THE ETERNAL CANDLE (the red one on the altar)!!

8. You are responsible for properly hanging up your own gown and rope each time you use it.

Never be afraid to ask someone if there is anything else you can do to help OR if you are unsure of what to do!! If you have any questions, or problems, please call Pastor Ann (763-742-3119).

Greetings from your camp - Shetek Lutheran Ministries!

Over the past three summers, Shetek has adapted and sought out new ways to carry out our mission. In 2020 we offered a shortened season with many restrictions and served 265 campers. Last year, 2021, we offered a full season of summer programming but limited our numbers and served 618 campers. This year we offered our full season with somewhat limited numbers and served 621 campers. This year, our limited camper numbers had more to do with the difficulty finding summer staff than the pandemic. One of our greatest challenges is finding young adults who are willing to serve for the summer. We were blessed with 4 international counselors this past summer and Shetek will be doing more with international counselors in 2023.

Our summer ministry team of 20 young adults served faithfully this summer. Elementary, middle school, senior high, family camp, grandparent/grandchild camp and SOS camp (for folks with disabilities) all came this summer! For reference, 621 campers is about 75% of the campers we served in 2019. Safety was again a top priority and again, as in 2020 and 2021, we had no known cases of COVID. Campers were again thankful for camp.

Our "Building on the Foundation" capital campaign was on hold for most of 2020 and 2021. This year we restarted the congregational phase of the campaign. Several congregations have run successful campaigns in their congregations so far this year. We will be contacted all our 101 member congregations to give them the opportunity to participate. We continue to visit with prospective major donors, those who give or pledge \$5,000 or more for the campaign. Our total so far in cash and pledges is about \$1,475,000 towards our goal of \$1,500,000 with a challenge goal of \$2,000,000. With our member congregations and new donors, we hope to reach our challenge goal of \$2,000,000 in 2023. The new lodge is close to being open for guests. Our beach/waterfront was updated and landscaped before our summer program started this year and is a beautiful improvement. Our new water treatment system was up and running for the summer also.

Shetek continues to receive estate gifts periodically, which we are very thankful for. Over the years, these thoughtful gifts have really benefitted the ministry at Shetek. If you're interested in finding out more about how to support Shetek in this way, please let us know. We have access to a gift planner at no cost to our donors.

Some improvements in 2022 – the new landscaped beach area along with a new dock for the swimming area and the new water treatment center. We did some grading and tiling on the south end of the property to improve drainage. Several smaller propane tanks around camp were removed and consolidated to larger ones. A new water line was installed from the new lodge to the activity center and the old pump house is no longer in service. Plans for future expansion were included with the new water line.

I am thankful for our year round staff and their hospitality to our guests and campers. Shetek welcomed Val Kastner in Feb. to our Housekeeping team, Lexie Blaschko joined us in May as our Program Director and Jana Sturges began in June in our Food Service.

2022 looks better than 2021, but compared to the average from 2015-2019, we will still be about \$30,000 lower in program income and about \$12,000 lower in retreat/rental income. However, in the face of all the uncertainty over the last couple of year, our donors and congregations have continued to respond with incredible generosity. I am amazed and grateful and can't say "THANK YOU" enough for your support and prayers!!


