7 "I will sing to the Lord all my life; I will sing praise to my God as long as I 8 live" (Psalm 104:33).

What makes your heart sing? Early one Sunday morning I stopped outside the church and just listened as the birds were singing. I thought how they are delighting in being birds and doing what birds were created to do. Sing. I found myself singing the song, "Build Us Up, Lord" throughout that day. I was challenged by the hymn to pray for First Lutheran that the living Christ would come into our worship, our activities, our families, our world to teach us how to love one another and to plant seeds for the kingdom. Paul writes in Colossians 3:16," Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God."

We are created to praise God. So, what makes your heart sing? Where do you see or hear God at work in your life? Sometimes we need to just pause and be still and listen to the sounds of nature and even the sound of our own breath and beating heart. When I do that, I realize I am connected to God and God breathes life into me each day. What makes my heart sing

is hearing the sound of laughter and conversation on a Sunday morning. I delight in hearing people singing the liturgy, or the hymns on Sunday. What makes my heart sing is hearing people sharing with one another about their work. What make my heart sing is when I observe men and women serving as ushers, readers, musicians, or people serving coffee after worship. What makes my heart sing is as people gather in committees or as a council to serve the church. What makes my heart sing is people using the gifts God has given in them to be of service to their neighbor.

During the summer I encourage you to pause to think about where you hear God and what makes your heart sing. As people and as a congregation God has created each of us uniquely and we each have gifts and talents that the other needs. Without you First Lutheran would not be who we are. This summer we need you to be part of worship to sing praises to God. What is it that you would like to see happening at First Lutheran that would make your heart sing? How can you be part of bringing joy to others? How can we together praise God and sing a new song of ministry and mission?

I know there are things that keep us from singing. We all experience pain, struggles, loss, and those things which rob us of joy. Each day is a gift from God. But some days are more difficult than others. Disappointment, anger, resentment, bitterness, the economy, family issues, family economic issues, etc.... All seek to rob us of a singing heart. But I am reminded of what Paul writes in Philippians 4:4-7, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Paul acknowledges that difficulties are part of life but in all ways and experiences we go through, Christ comes with his peace. May we keep singing and know that God is with us.

This summer take time to pause and sing and notice the presence of God around you. This summer pause and give thanks. This summer may the peace of God be with you all.

First Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes May 8, 2019

Members Present: Pastor Joyce, Paul Henriksen, Nancy Johnson, Patti Peterson, Shar Ludolph, Tami Taubert, Gail Barduson, Gen Velde, Craig Thies (Property Management).

Members Absent: Teresa Jansen, Debbie Reinert, & Kristen Brockberg

Call to Order: President Paul Henriksen called the meeting to order at 8:00 pm.

Devotions: Devotions were given by Gen Velde.

REPORTS

Secretary's Report: The minutes from the April 2019 meeting were reviewed by the council. A motion was made by Tami Taubert & seconded by Gen Velde to approve the minutes as written. The minutes were accepted by Council.

Treasurer's Report: The April Treasurer's report was reviewed. A motion was made by Tami Taubert & seconded by Gen Velde. A discussion followed. The report & accounts payable were approved by the Council. It was noted that the Labor Law posters have been put up.

Pastor's Report: Pastor thanked the Congregational Life Committee & Worship Committee for taking care of the church service on April 28th.

The last confirmation class for the school year was held tonight. There has been congregational concern about the loss of the Youth & Family Ministry position.

Our church has been approached by the Methodist & Presbyterian churches about joining them for combined Sunday School classes. They meet on Wednesday evenings for Sunday School & a meal and have had success with more children attending. Pastor Joyce & Kristen Brockberg will be looking into this arrangement. They are also having Vacation Bible School at the end of June which our Sunday school kids can attend. Senior Sunday is May 19th.

Pastor will be attending a continuing ed event next week.

President's Report: Paul has been meeting with church staff. One of the upcoming changes will be the newsletter coming out as email instead of regular mail because of time & cost.

Vice President's Report: Nancy inquired about our church having a folder available with our information for visitors. One was started during the planning for the 125th Anniversary but was never completed. Pastor will look into the status of the project.

Nancy has been revising the information for the Safe Haven project & feels it is ready to be reviewed.

Adult Ed: Gail reported that the walking group met tonight for the first time – but due to the stormy weather they had to walk in the church.

The Congregational Life Committee will be helping the Adult Ed Committee with the free community meal but they are not ready to do this yet & will continue to make plans.

Outreach & Mission: Gen reported that \$1210.54 was collected for World Hunger with the 40 Days of Giving jars. For the next project they will be working with the FLCW on the Soles for Souls.

Property Management: Craig reported that the committee had their meeting at the parsonage. They finalized the plans for a railing on the front step. There have been water issues in the attic & it has been decided to blow insulation in the attic. They took care of some small jobs & are looking for input on a new deck for the parsonage because the current one is in rough shape. They are getting bids for materials for a composite deck but are open to suggestions for other options.

OLD BUSINESS: Regarding the Shirley Van Beek Annuity – this annuity is being split between four entities. It cannot be dispersed until all of the groups have finished the required legal work. There is one entity who hasn't completed their obligation so there is no distribution at this time.

A recommendation was made that there be some instruction on how to use the QR code that is in the bulletin as in a power point or hands on learning.

NEW BUSINESS: Gen will write a thank you card to Mark Z.

ADJOURNMENT: The meeting was adjourned by President Henriksen at 8:55pm after praying the Lord's Prayer.


