## Greetings faithful Lenten pilgrims

When you hear the word, “Lent” what thoughts or images come to your mind? Perhaps for some of you John 3:16 comes to mind.

*“For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that everyone who believes in him, may not perish but have eternal life.”*

When did you first learn that verse? When you start to hear the verse, can you rattle off the rest by memory? This is a favorite verse for many people.

God loves us and the world and Jesus died. John 3:16 came alive in the person of Jesus Christ. What does God’s love look like? God’s love is made visible in the death and resurrection of Christ. God’s love is visible as Jesus healed people, taught on a hillside, ate with people, walked with his disciples, and prayed. God’s love is made known as we the people of God pray for one another, listen to one another, care for one another, and serve

God in his kingdom.

During the month of March, come and explore on Wednesday nights, "The Body of Christ." We will be exploring the different parts of Jesus' body. The question of us for this Lent is, "How are we to live as the body of Christ today?" Another question we will seek to answer is, "How do we use our body to serve Christ?" Join us for this time of worship and meditation. Ash Wednesday was a traditional service with the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion. Here are themes for the next five weeks of Lent:

**March 3<sup>rd</sup>: Hands of Christ.** Can you think of a story where Jesus reached out and touched someone? How or when have you sensed the hands of Christ in your life?

**March 10<sup>th</sup>: Mouth of Christ.** Think of some of Jesus' teaching. Or what words of Jesus from the gospel of John did he speak to tell you who he is? What are those, "I am" sayings of Jesus? What words of challenge and rebuke did Jesus speak? What words of hope or grace has Jesus spoken to you?

**March 17<sup>th</sup>: Ears of Christ.** What were the cries of people that Jesus heard? Did Jesus heal a deaf person? Whose words and cries of people are you deaf to? How are our ears closed to the words that Jesus speaks? What words of comfort have you had spoken to you?

**March 24<sup>th</sup>: Eyes of Christ.** Skim through the gospels and who were the people Jesus saw? Read John 9 and look at the different things that Christ sees. Think about the blind man and what he sees. Where do you see Jesus in the world around you? Where do you see Jesus in your own life or the life of your family?

**April 1<sup>st</sup> (Maundy Thursday) Blood of Christ.** Imagine what Jesus must have been thinking that last night with disciples. Ponder what Holy Communion means to you. What does it mean that Jesus blood was shed for you? Why is that important? Remember the first time you took communion and gave thanks for the gift of life.

**April 2<sup>nd</sup>: (Good Friday) Body of Christ.** What can we say on Good Friday, except thank you and WOW!. Take time to ponder the meaning of the death of Christ for you personally. Think of one person that you need to tell that Jesus loves them and died for them.

**April 4<sup>th</sup> (Easter) The Risen Body of Christ.** Celebrate... Celebrate... Dance to the music that Christ is alive and life conquers death. Nothing can separate us from God's love. Proclaim loudly Christ is risen, Christ is risen indeed!

**Please join us for worship on Wednesday nights @ 5:30pm for in-person masked Worship. The service will be lived streamed on Facebook live.**

Prayer for March: Creator God, thank you for not just sending us the words that you love us, but rather you showed your great love by sending your son Jesus in human form. Please forgive me when I take your love for granted. Free me Lord from anything that obstructs my way to you. Clear away the clutter of grudges. Remove resentment and bitterness. Cleanse me of thoughts filled with anger, envy, or self-pity. Create space in my life for more kindness, generosity, and compassion. May I recognize your gifts that are around me. Amen.

## Cultivating Generous Congregations – Feb. 2021

### Stories of Generosity

The month of March is National Food Bank month. First Lutheran recognizes Karen Hellie for her generous service as our bank representative for the past 35 years. Some questions for Karen: 1) How did you get started working with the food bank? "I received a call from the previous representative who was leaving the community asking if I was interested. I thought about my grandfather, Charles Tobias, who gave food and clothing through the Salvation Army to people during the depression. His work was greatly appreciated. I thought this is my opportunity to carry on his mission, so I took the position." 2) What keeps you involved in the Food Bank? "I enjoy the people, the ones I work with and those families who need the service. There is good cooperation from the congregation when it is our turn to help." Thank you, Karen, for generously serving the community and First Lutheran through the Food Shelf.

### Called to serve – First Lutheran needs you.

In keeping with the Food Shelf theme, Karen tells us in March donations are matched X3. Donations of cash go a long way in purchasing food from Second Harvest. The Food Shelf is able to purchase 3-4 cans of food for each dollar. You can make donations directly to the Food Shelf or as designated gifts through First Lutheran.

Time to think about pre-confirmation age children in First Lutheran. We need people to serve on the Sunday School/Children's committee. Right now the needs are in planning for "post Covid" faith formation programs and to oversee use of funds belonging to this group. Interested people are encouraged to let Pastor Joyce or any Council member know how you would like to help.

Without the mortgage payments, pre-school rent, Covid restrictions and PPP grant the narrative budget will look very different in 2021.

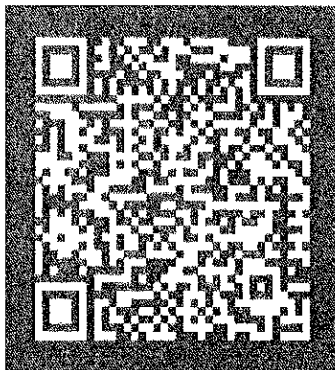

March 10th: Mouth of Christ

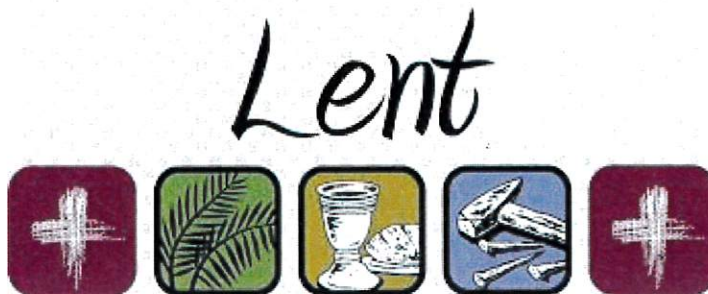
March 17th: Ears of Christ

April 2nd: (Good Friday) Body of Christ

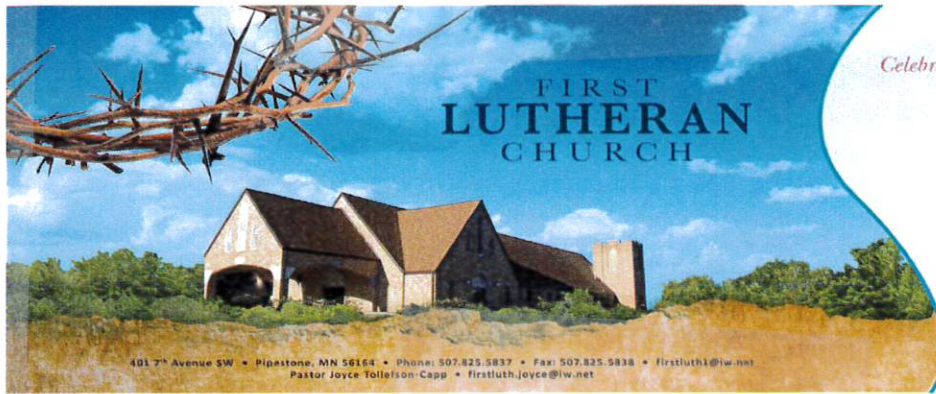
April 4th (Easter) The Risen Body of Christ

### **First Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes – February 10, 2021**

**Members Present:** Pastor Joyce, Nancy Johnson (via Zoom), Brenda Kellen, Craig Thies, Tami Taubert, Sharleen Ludolph, Kristi Henriksen, Dave Dulas, Erin Musch, and Chris Hollingsworth.

**Call to Order:** President Nancy Johnson called the meeting to order at 8:04 PM.

**Installation of Church Council and Committee Members:** Pastor Joyce lead the installation process and followed with devotions.

**Treasurer's Report:** Sharleen L. presented the financial reports, the reserve fund report, and the accounts payable report. These were reviewed and discussed by the Council. Shar explained the reports for the new members. Nancy and Shar will discuss and create a plan to fund the reserve funds quarterly, since the mortgage has been paid off. Kristi H. made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report as written and to pay the accounts payable. Erin M. 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion and it was approved.

**Secretary's Report:** The minutes from the January meeting were reviewed. Tami T. made a motion to approve the minutes as printed, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Brenda K. Motion was approved.

#### **Pastor's Report:**

- Pastor Joyce welcomed the new council and committee members. She would like committees to set goals for the year with the idea of getting more people involved. The Sunday School committee chair, Tanya Schroyer, has resigned. We are looking for a replacement. Pastor stated that she had 10 people visit her today.
- Pastor Joyce is the Conference Dean and she has been working a lot on organizing the conference meeting. She has been attending a lot of Zoom meetings and taking a class on the Gospel of Mark.
- Pastor has been working on the Lent services, with Covid restrictions. She has been researching on how to do drive by imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday. Covid makes doing things longer. "Body of Christ" is the Lent theme. Two new members will be installed on Sunday. There are five weddings in the future. Pastor Joyce has started working with these couples.
- Pastor Joyce will be taking the last Sunday in February off. Amanda R. will be leading the worship service that Sunday. Pastor distributed "Growing Young" books to those who did not have one.

#### **President's Report:**

- Nancy had Pastor Joyce distribute the Committee job descriptions. These are to be reviewed and brought back next month with any changes, so they can be updated.
- Nancy has been working on the Narrative Budget, which explains where funds come from and where they are distributed or spent. Discussed taking the amount of the prior mortgage payment and distributing it to other needed areas.

**Vice-President's Report:** No report. Craig T. was just installed as Vice President.

### **Committee Reports**

- Property Management – Craig T. reported for Scott – 1 yr project will be church landscaping and the 3 yr project is the parsonage upgrade. Council members suggested that some of the parsonage upgrades be done before the landscaping.
- Mission & Outreach – Kristi H. – They met and created a plan. She reviewed the plans with the Council and will put a report in the Voice of the upcoming events.
- Congregational Life – Dave D. – He is new to the committee, so he is still figuring out what it involves. He will set up a committee meeting.
- Adult Ed – Brenda K. – They met Sunday. They will be reviewing the book “Good Life” as Zoom meeting. Books are ordered and they are working on a long-term plan.
- Youth – Erin M. – It has been hard to meet during Covid. The 2022 National Youth Conference was discussed and put on the calendar. She will set a meeting date.
- Worship – Tami T. – They met last month and discussed Lent services and a plan for when Pastor will be gone the last Sunday in February. Discussed guidance on updating paraments and church decorations.

### **Old Business**

- Web Site update – Pastor Joyce and Nancy talked with Kelly about working/updating the Church web site. They gave her clearer expectations and said Kelly was excited to do this project.

### **New Business**

- The following Resolution for account signatures at First State Bank Southwest was discussed:
  - ▶ Endowment Account: Continue Chuck Sendelbach (Chm) & Steve Werner (Treas); Remove Paul Henriksen (previous President); Add Nancy E. Johnson (current President)
  - ▶ Youth Account: Continue Erin Musch; Remove Paul Henriksen (previous President); Add Nancy E. Johnson (current President)

Brenda K. made a motion to accept the Resolution for account signatures. Tami T. 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion and it passed.

- There was discussion about all the church and committee bank accounts and fraud safeguards. It was decided that a copy of all bank statements be given to Shar for review. She will report quarterly to the Council about the general spending in each account. Kristi H. said that the FLCW has its own constitution which includes their banking procedures. Brenda K. made a motion to require two signatures on all church related bank account checks. Erin M. 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion and it passed. The signature cards will have to be updated on all bank accounts.
- Pastor Joyce asked for volunteers for the offering pick up, readers, and communion assistants.

**Adjournment:** Brenda K. gave the closing prayer. The meeting was adjourned at 9:20 pm.
