What does the name “Maundy” mean?

The term "Maundy" comes from the Latin "mandatum;" it is from a verb that means "to give" or "to order" -- command. After Jesus and the disciples finished the Last Supper and walked toward Gethsemane, Jesus taught them a new commandment "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." (John 13:34).

The Last Supper

On the first Maundy Thursday, after they had eaten, Jesus gave the disciples his body and blood together with the bread and wine for the forgiveness of their sins. Called Holy Communion or the Eucharist, Lutherans believe this to be one of two sacraments -- gifts from God. Most worship services focus on the meal and communion as a way to commemorate this day.

With nightfall our Lenten observance comes to an end, and we gather with Christians around the world to celebrate the Three Days of Jesus’ death and resurrection. At the heart of the Maundy Thursday liturgy is Jesus’ commandment to love one another. As Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, we are called to follow his example as we humbly care for one another, especially the poor and the unloved. At the Lord’s table we remember Jesus’ sacrifice of his life, even as we are called to offer ourselves in love for the life of the world.

PRELUDE

WELCOME AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

INVITATION TO FIRST COMMUNION (Youth and parents)

P: Parents, when you brought your child to the font, here at First Lutheran or another congregation, you made certain promises to your child. You with the support of the church, promised to, “live with them among God’s faithful people, bring them to the word of God and holy supper, and to teach them the Lord’s Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments. You promised to place in their hands the Holy Scriptures and nurture them in faith and prayer.” By bringing them to worship and instruction you are fulfilling your promise to your child. Do you promise to continue the work God has begun in you and to continue to pass the faith on to your child, if so say, “I do.”

Parents: I do.

P: The Sacrament of Holy Communion is the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. This meal was instituted by Christ himself. Jesus Christ’s introduction of Holy Communion is found in Matthew, Mark, Luke, and in Paul’s First Letter to the Corinthians. Jesus took bread and wine and presented it as his body and blood to his disciples. The Christian church continues this sacrament to this day. Martin Luther in the Small Catechism asks, “What benefit do we receive from eating and drinking?”

First Communion Parents & Families: The benefit which we receive from Holy Communion is in the words: “Given and shed for you.” In Holy Communion we receive forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation.

Pastor: Youth you have been marked with the cross of Christ forever in your baptism. You have been instructed in the sacrament of Holy Communion. Do you promise to come to worship, continue to grow in learning about your baptism, and to come to the Lord’s Supper often? If so say, “I do.”

Youth: I do.

Pastor: May God continue to guide you as parents and encourage you as youth to seek his kingdom and to remember your baptism. Let us pray:

Gracious God, loving Lord, we thank you for these young people who will be receiving the body and blood of your Son, Jesus Christ. As they grow in years, deepen their faith in Christ and their trusting in the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Thank you for parents and family members, and this church who love and support them. Guide them and renew their faith. Help us to encourage one another and see ourselves, others and the world through Jesus eyes. Amen. *(Invite Youth and parents to face congregation)*

C: We welcome you to the Lord’s Table. Together we will explore the mystery and wonder of Holy Communion and accept Christ’s gifts of grace through this Sacrament. May you always know that you are welcome here. Thanks be to God.
