

Happy New Year?! Is that a question or a statement of joy? I don't know about you but I am wondering what in the world 2021 will hold in store for us. How will things be the same? What will be different? What will be the next thing to happen? What will happen with COVID? The theme for 2021 seems to be more questions and more waiting and more changing of plans.

Habakkuk was a prophet and the book bearing his name in the Old Testament is a story of lament and written as a conversation between God and Habakkuk. I encourage you to read Habakkuk. To be honest it is one of my favorite books in the Bible. Things are not going well for the nation of Israel and the prophet begins by crying, out to God, "O Lord, how long will I cry for help, and you will not listen! Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contentions arise." Sound familiar? Chapter 2 Habakkuk tells the Lord, "I am going to

stand at my watch post, and station myself on the rampart; I will keep watch to see what he will say to me and what God will answer concerning my complaint." In other words, God do something. I am waiting. The image of Habakkuk taking a stand is powerful image. He is ready, watching determined, waiting to see what God will do. Perhaps some of you feel like Habakkuk wondering what in the world God is doing and where is God. May we like Habakkuk, take a stand and watch and wait, for God has not abandoned his people. And the same true for us; God has not abandoned us. God may seem hidden and we may feel our prayers and concerns going unanswered. I assure you God is at work and the key is that we are to live by faith.

The book ends with these words, "Though the fig tree does not blossom, and no fruit is on the vine; though the produce of the olives fails, and fields yield no food; though the flocks is cut off from the fold, and there is no herd in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the Lord; I will exult in the God of my salvation. God, the Lord is my strength; he makes my feel like the feet of a deer, and makes me tread upon the heights."

Habakkuk has every reason to complain. But in the midst of trials where does Habakkuk turn? He turns to God. Ultimately in the midst of trials, questions and fears Habakkuk's only hope is in God.

A small three letter word makes all the difference in Habakkuk's life. That word is "Yet." Though there are struggles, aloneness, COVID, wondering about school, financial issues, business issues, political issues, the list could go on. How will you respond? "Yet" means, "at the same time, even though, or never the less", I will rejoice in the Lord. In the midst of whatever you are going through God is with you. God's love, mercy, and grace, is sufficient. God's time is not our time and our call is to wait and confess that God is our strength. "Yet" in spite of all the uncertainties we are to live by faith.

Making our feet like that of a deer reminds me that God will equip and grant us what we need to bring us through the difficulties we are facing. Just as God has equipped a deer to climb to the impossible places, God has also given us what we need to bring us through the rough places in our life. The deer can climb the rocky terrain because they have the right feet to climb. God has also equipped us with unique abilities and skills to face 2021. God knows what is in store for us and we can trust God to lead us through as he has in the past.

Let us walk confidently into 2021 and may our theme be, "yet I will rejoice in the God of my salvation, God the Lord is my strength."

# **Cultivating Generous Congregations – January 2021**

## **Stories of Generosity**

There are abundant stories of generosity in youth, ages 7 – 17. They are also known as Generation Z. In a survey of 902 individuals in that age group by DEEP FORCE and reported in Cultivating Generous Congregations: Lake Institute on Faith and Giving:

20% - Want to start a charity.

49% - Volunteer at least once a month.

32% - Have donated their own money.

26% - Have raised money for a cause or charity.

We can see this kind of generosity in First Lutheran Youth as they work at the fair stand, when they serve the Banquet, as they contribute funds to the mission of the church and do service projects through the church and other organizations in the community. Way to go — youth of First Lutheran.

# First Lutheran needs you – Called to serve:

There are many ways we can cultivate a generous congregation at First Lutheran. Here are some examples from the "Cultivating Generous Congregations".

- -Be fully present. Set aside distractions and commit to being here.
- -Offer and receive welcome. We support each other by giving and receiving hospitality.
- -Listen generously. Listen first before preparing to speak.
- -Suspend judgement. Create a space between what is said and judgement or reactions.
- -<u>Turn to wonder</u>. Ask yourself "I wonder why a person feels or reacts certain ways? Or, I wonder what this says about me?"

# **Financial Update**

Your President and Vice President have been working on preparing a budget for 2021, trying to foresee how Fist Lutheran can use it's funding to live its mission next year and in the future. Two interesting considerations are: 1) We will no longer have monthly mortgage payments, and 2) We will no longer have income from the preschool once Pipestone's new school is in use. It has been the rent from the preschool that has made the biggest part of our recent mortgage payments and has allowed us to reduce dependence on the church reserve funds and endowments to meet our financial responsibilities. We are thankful the financial generosity of the congregation has made it possible to maintain our full time pastor, support staff and mission priorities. As you plan what you can give financially to First Lutheran in 2021, please consider how much every members support is needed to carry out the work and purpose of this congregation.



Greetings from your camp - Shetek Lutheran Ministries!

What a year! We welcomed Amanda Randall as our new Program Director on Feb. 23 and three weeks later everything was turned upside down. Amanda has done a great job adapting and rising to the challenge of camp programming during a pandemic. Unfortunately, we were not able to do all our programs in 2020.

During these times, we have had to be very creative to carry on our mission. Obviously, a big part of our mission is our summer programs for youth and families. But another part of our mission is the faith formation and leadership development of the young adults who serve on our summer ministry team. Many of them go on to serve the church in rostered leadership positions and/or lay leadership. We committed to hiring our summer staff of 20 this past season, not knowing if we'd be able to have overnight camp or not. We want to support their development along with their summer employment. Several scenarios were being planned.

In the middle of June, the MN Department of Health came out with guidelines for overnight camp and we put our plans into action. Most camps cancelled all their summer onsite programs but we felt if there was a way to offer programs as safely as possible, we wanted to try, for the sake of the campers who would have an opportunity to attend. Safety is a high priority and we followed the CDC guidelines and MN Dept. of Health recommendations and worked with our local public health officials. Our programs were adapted and we ended up with 5 weeks of programming from July 5 to August 7 with 265 participants.

Even though this was a difficult summer with a lot of extra work to make it happen, it was well worth it. Our summer ministry team learned to adapt, were very creative and learned resiliency! Our campers were very thankful to have an opportunity to come to camp even though it was different from previous years. We are very thankful also that we had no incidents of COVID-19.

Our "Building on the Foundation" capital campaign was on hold for most of the year. We started the congregational phase in Feb. but then had to suspend it in March. The Board voted at the end of September to begin some of the infrastructure work, so we have started on the building to house our new water treatment equipment. Our plan is to get the equipment in this winter and switch the system over next spring. The architect is almost finished with the plans for the Adult/Youth Lodge and we hope to begin in the spring of 2021 on the first new building! We are at \$1,100,000 in gifts and pledges towards our goal of \$1,500,000.

Some improvements in 2020 – painted the ceiling in the kitchen and the ceiling and back hallway in Dakota and painted the apartment building and cabin #5. We also had to repair a sewer line by the dining hall. Thanks to wonderful volunteers we have a new deck and stairs on the back of the chapel and we removed several dead trees and stumps. Many other improvements also happened.

I am thankful for the year round staff who have struggled this year with fewer campers, retreats and programs. They have been positive and supportive of each other through everything. I hope we can return to something more normal soon.

I'm also thankful for the Paycheck Protection Program loan we received along with some grants. Those have been very helpful. Compared to 2019, we will be about \$180,000 lower in program income and about \$60,000 lower in retreat/rental income. However, in the face of all the uncertainty, our donors and congregations have responded with incredible generosity and I can't say "THANK YOU" enough for your support and prayers!!

### First Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes - December 9, 2020

<u>Members Present:</u> Pastor Joyce, Paul Henriksen, Nancy Johnson, Kristen Brockberg, Scott Sterud, Tami Taubert, Sharleen Ludolph, Erin Musch, and Chris Hollingsworth.

Call to Order: President Paul Henriksen called the meeting to order at 8:00 PM.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Sharleen L. presented the financial reports, the reserve fund report, and the accounts payable report. These were reviewed and discussed by the Council. It was stated that our PPP Loan Forgiveness was approved. Erin M. made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report as written and to pay the accounts payable. Tami T. 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion and it was approved.

<u>**Devotions:**</u> We continued with the Keychain Leadership video. Nancy led the discussion on how to involve younger adults and teens to help with ushering, reading, and in other areas.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> The minutes from the November meeting were reviewed. Kristen B. made a motion to approve the minutes as printed, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Erin M. Motion was approved.

#### Pastor's Report:

- Pastor will be working with the Nominating Committee this month. They need to make sure that they
  involve people who want to be on a Committee. Kristen B. commented if we need to revamp our
  committees and look at how they function or can be improved.
- Lots of congregations are having issues during this time due to the Covid protocol. Pastor Joyce stated that we are not and as we go into 2021, what do we want to bring forth as we open up.
- Pastor Joyce has been doing yoga and meditation 5-6 times a week. She asked, "How do we take care
  of ourselves?" Pastor will be out Christmas through January 2. She needs help on how to get the new
  offering envelopes out to people for the new year.

#### President's Report:

• Paul H. commented on delivering baskets and the people who wanted to visit/talk when they received their basket.

- Paul talked about the Committees. Each Committee should write a goal for next year and the next 3
  years by the annual meeting. Committees have not been meeting like they should be and some of that
  could be because of Covid. It was discussed if the Council meeting should be at a different time and
  day. The discussion was left undecided for now.
- Paul is grateful for the offerings made by the congregation this year.

<u>Vice-President's Report:</u> Nancy asked the Council if they would like to continue doing the Growing Young series for devotions. This was discussed and the answer was yes.

  the 3:30 pm service.
- Adult Ed Brenda K. absent. Pastor Joyce reported that they read a book and met on 2. One discussion had 7 people attend.

- Sutterlund/VanBeek/SWMN Initiative donations There was discussion about what to spend the

- Mortgage Payoff There was a lot of discussion on how to fund the mortgage payoff. The payoff amount is about \$23,000. The funds will come from the following: \$11,000 Youth fund, \$3,800 Endowment Committee, \$5,200 Sunday School fund, and \$3,000 SWMN Initiative. Erin M. made a motion to pay off the mortgage as discussed and Scott S. 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. The motion was approved.
- Annual Meeting The annual meeting will be held on January 24<sup>th</sup>. Snow date will be January 31<sup>st</sup>.
- Church Website Pastor Joyce mentioned that we should start looking at improving our Church's website. There was discussion on different options and where to look for help.

The Banquet is grateful for the many volunteers, donors and guests who make up The Banquet ministry. Without generous donors, we could not assist the hundreds of families who come daily seeking food for the body and soul.

The Banquet began in 1985 serving one meal per week. Now, only through generous donations like yours, volunteers at The Banquet prepare and serve 16 meals per week at two permeant locations. We serve breakfast and supper Monday through Friday and lunch on Saturdays at our main location on 8<sup>th</sup> & Indiana Avenue. Volunteers at our west location on 5<sup>th</sup> & Marion Road prepare and serve supper Monday through Friday. These additional meals are helping guests, many without transportation, access supplemental food to help stretch their grocery budgets. The guests truly appreciate the support they receive through this ministry.

Thank you for your gift of \$800 toward the purchase of food for The Banquet guests.

#### Banquet fast facts:

- The Banquet serves nearly 200,000 meals and 8,000 gallons of milk to guests living in poverty each year.
- More than 1,500 guests receive personal necessities such as hygiene items, warm socks and sweatshirts and undergarments for Christmas each year.
- The Banquet's Project: SOS (Supply Our Students) gives more than 6,000 backpacks filled with school supplies to school students living in and around Sioux Falls every year.
- Volunteers are the heart and soul of this ministry. Nearly 20,000 volunteers cook, serve, answer phones, sort supplies, work with children and help with the building and grounds.

The Banquet is a non-profit, 501(c) 3 agency which relies solely on private donations of materials and cash to pay for milk, coffee and juice; food and equipment; staffing and building costs. The Banquet receives no city, county, state, federal or United Way monies for any of its projects or programs. Thanks again for your support of The Banquet ministry.
