By the time you read this, I will have been First Lutheran’s pastor for about a month. I am so delighted to be here, and am starting to remember faces, and even connect a few names to those faces! I look forward to meeting and getting to know you, as we walk together, doing ministry at First, and in the community of Pipestone.

A little about me. I am the eldest of three children. My sister, Meg, lives in Toledo, OH, and is a social work professor at the University of Toledo. My brother, Paul, lives in Cedar Rapids, IA, and works with branding at Ratheon. Both of them are married, and my brother has two boys, one in Ames, IA, and the other in Aurora, CO. My mom still lives in White Bear Lake, where we grew up. My dad passed away in 2014. Yes, White Bear is a suburb of St Paul, but growing up, my neighborhood seemed more like a small town than a suburb. I went to college at the University of Wisconsin – Eau Claire. I graduated with an elementary education major, and a music minor. I sing, play the piano some, and play(ed) the French Horn.

After graduation, I came back to White Bear, and was a substitute teacher at all grade levels for 7 years. During that time, I also worked at Orchestra Hall in Minneapolis doing many things, including ushering, bartending, and working backstage with performers. I then taught 5<sup>th</sup> grade at an all-girls’ Catholic school run by Spanish nuns, and also in Tokyo, Japan, for 4 years. My students were international, but I taught in English. Some were there because a parent worked in an embassy, some were there because a parent worked for a business, and some were there because they were bi-cultural, with one parent from Japan, and the other from somewhere else. It was an amazing experience, and I am still in touch with some of the teachers and students from Japan. When I returned from overseas, I taught middle school music for a year.

After my teaching experiences, I worked at the University of Minnesota – Twin Cities for several years, working with students and families who had questions about financial aid, billing, and registration. I knew I wanted to continue to work with youth, so I volunteered to be a small group confirmation leader at my home church. That experience, and others, made it clear to me that I was called to go to seminary, and I started classes while still working at the University. Eventually my work schedule couldn’t flex enough to accommodate my class requirements, so I became a full-time student. I graduated in 2013 and was ordained in 2014.

My first call was in Belgrade, MN, where I was associate pastor at Big Grove Crow River Grace Parish (5 years). My second call was as associate pastor at Grace Lutheran in Luverne (3 years), and now I am here, solo pastor at First Lutheran in Pipestone (1 month)! I am appreciative of the warm welcome I have received from the congregation and community, especially your willingness to help me move from Luverne (and “move 2.0” from the garage and basement when the parsonage renovation project is complete). I have participated in a few community activities and look forward to doing more of that. I enjoy going for walks, doing counted cross stitch, reading (when I have time!), watching M.A.S.H., doing sudoku and other pencil puzzles, and being with family and friends.

## Colors of change.....

Happy Fall! The season is changing from the warmth of summer to the coolness of autumn. Leaves are changing color and falling to the ground. Extra layers are needed, as more are required in the morning, and shed as the day goes on – and are often forgotten at school or in the office!

Fall brings a change of season in the church, too. All summer has been a “green” season, where green paraments (the cloths and banners on the altar, lectern, and pulpit, and the pastor’s stole), a time of spiritual growth and learning about Jesus’ ministry and teaching.

The change in colors in church starts on Sunday, October 30, Reformation Sunday. This is a festival day when we, as Lutherans, remember Martin Luther and his attempt to re-form the Roman Catholic church from the inside. The Pope and others didn’t like his efforts, but he persisted. Eventually his followers broke away from Rome, and formed the “Lutheran Church,” named after Luther (which he did not want). The color that day is red, which stands for the Holy Spirit, who inspired Luther, and continues to inspire us today as we live our lives.

The color changes to white on Sunday, November 6, All Saints Day. This is a day when we remember the saints (People of God...we ALL are saints) who have joined (through their baptism) or left (through their

death) our First Lutheran community since last All Saints Day. We will have candles to light to honor and remember these saints, and there will also be candles available for anyone to light to honor or remember others in your life who have been baptized or died in previous years.

The color changes back to green for one week, as we wrap up the church year, then we have another “white” Sunday on November 19, Christ the King. This is “New Year’s Eve” in the church, where we take a look at God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The next color change happens on November 27, which is the First Sunday of Advent (the beginning of the church year), when we turn to “blue” for the next 4 weeks, the four Sundays before Christmas Day (which is on a Sunday this year). The season of Advent is a season of preparation for Christ’s birth. Many of the readings are looking forward to Christ’s second coming, as well as looking at some of the familiar stories of Mary, Joseph, Elizabeth, John, and others.

I look forward to journeying with you over these next weeks as we finish out one church year and begin the next, filled with both the new and the familiar.

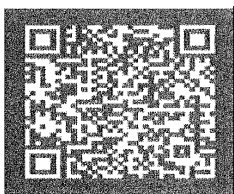

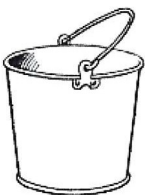

**Call to Order:** President, Nancy Johnson, called the meeting to order at 8:10 pm.

### **Committee Reports – Round Table**

- **Worship** – Tami T. – The Worship Team will be doing the worship service Labor Day weekend, when the Pastor is gone.
- **Adult Ed** – Brenda K. – Waiting for Bible study sign up to start this September – October time frame. Nancy J. told Brenda to order about 6 Bible Study books. Pastor DeBlock will ask Ellie to order the books tomorrow.
- **Congregational Life** – No report.
- **Mission & Outreach** – Kristy H. left a report with Nancy J., because she is attending the Churchwide Assembly in Columbus, OH this week. Noisy offering for August & September is the Food Shelf/Senior Center/Meals on Wheels building project. Time to start thinking about scheduling The Banquet project. **Members Present:** Nancy Johnson, Craig Thies, Chris Hollingsworth, Pastor DeBlock, Tami Taubert, Tim Stanga, Kristy Henriksen, and Scott Sterud.

**Call to Order:** President, Nancy Johnson, called the meeting to order at 8:01 pm.

**Devotions:** Dave D. was absent, so Nancy J. suggested that we use the Nehemiah Study as a base for devotions going forward. Nancy will talk to the Adult Ed Committee first.

**Treasurer's Report:** Nancy J. announced that Tim S. will be quitting as Treasurer, due to family and time constraints. We will have to start looking for a replacement. Tim S. presented the financial reports, the reserve fund report, and the accounts payable report. These were reviewed and discussed by the Council. Craig stated that the Property Management Committee will review the parsonage remodel invoices before they are paid. The current parsonage invoices that are scheduled to be paid will be given to Property Mgmt. and held for their approval. Kristy H. made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented and pay the AP Report with the parsonage remodel invoices removed. Tami T. 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion and it was approved.

**Secretary's Report:** The minutes from the August meeting were reviewed. Tami T. made a motion to accept the Secretary's Report as written. Scott S. 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion and it was approved.

### **Pastor's Report**

- Pastor DeBlock transferred his membership from MN to SD. This last month, he has been working with the 9<sup>th</sup> graders on confirmation. Pastor was going to meet with the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> graders, but the picnic took longer than usual. The skits they did tonight for confirmation went well. Pastor went on vacation for a week. They have moved out of the parsonage. Over the last month, Pastor DeBlock did 1 baptism and no funerals.

### **President's Report**

- New Pastor / Transition from Interim – The last Sunday in September will be Pastor DeBlock's last day. It is also confirmation Sunday. There are 6 people who will be confirmed. Pastor has a New Pastor Checklist that he will give to Nancy. Council discussed Pastor's last Sunday. Coffee and small treats will be served in the narthex. Nancy will work on this. New Pastor's 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday is the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday in October. Kristy and Nancy will work on what to serve with coffee that day. The new Pastor is scheduled to move Saturday, Sept. 24<sup>th</sup>.
- Admin Asst./Ellie's retirement – Ellie's retirement party is tomorrow from 12 pm – 1:30 pm. Cake, sandwiches, and salads will be served. Lori Ilse is the new person in this position. She has been working with Ellie for about 2 weeks. The Council discussed how to pay Ellie her last day of work, because it is after a regular pay period cut off. Tami T. made a motion to pay Ellie a 1-day bonus, with no deductions for her last workday. Tim S. 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion and it was approved.
- Parsonage Project Funding – Nancy texted committees asking for parsonage project funding. The Youth Group said they would donate \$10,000. The Council discussed parsonage updates and funding. The parsonage will not be done by the time the new Pastor starts. It will be at least a month out. Not sure where she will go until it is done. The Council discussed this situation and some solutions to find her temporary housing.

- Library Books – We have to make room at the church for Pastor Ann’s books. Kristy H. made a motion to purge the books and to open at least ½ of the bookshelves for Pastor Ann. Tami T. 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion and it was approved.
- Treasurer Position – As discussed previously, Tim S. will be quitting. Nancy will pursue other options such as getting quotes from outside accounting firms, Kinner and Meulebroeck, and posting the job.
- Congregation Directory - Nancy sent the Council an email about an online directory. There was discussion. Tami T. made a motion to do an online church directory. Scott S. 2<sup>nd</sup> it and it was approved.

**Vice-President’s Report**

- Parsonage – Council discussed this earlier in the meeting. They are planning to move Pastor Ann on Sept. 24<sup>th</sup>. They will store her items in the parsonage garage. Nancy will call Pastor Ann to see if she can stay in her apartment for another month, until the parsonage is done.
- Fair Stand –There are no updates. Nancy added some pros and cons to the list. Adjuster was there and insurance has yet to respond. Our insurance company, Grinnell, sold out to Nationwide.

**Committee Reports – Round Table**

- Property Management – Scott S. – Scott started discussion about helping a local child out with health equipment needs. Council discussed helping through the noisy offering and other fund-raising ideas.
- Mission & Outreach – Kristy H. – We are helping with the Banquet in Sioux Falls on Wednesday, Oct. 26<sup>th</sup>, at the main site. We will need 5 people for prep and 20-25 to help. Kristy will have Lori put this in the bulletin.
- Worship – Tami T. – no report.
- Adult Ed – No report.

- Pastor Dan has mail for Pastor Ann. He will leave it for her.
- Tami T. said that there isn’t an organist for Confirmation Sunday. She said that the Worship Team will sing.

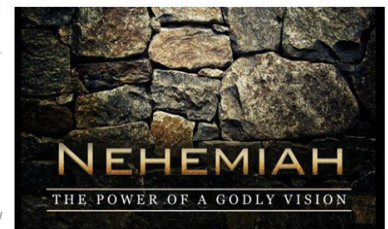
