Another newsletter arriving to you means another month has passed and a new month is unfolding. Where does the time go? I think of the passage from Ecclesiastes 3, "To everything there is a season and time for every matter under heaven." As we continue to live during this time of pandemic and recovery, I continue to think, what is God's purpose? Where is God in all of this? What time is it now? What season is it? As I write this we are at the end of April and we have not seen a clear sunny day for at least a week and we have temperatures in the 30's and 40's"! Where are the flowers? Where is the sunshine? Where is warm spring weather? What is God's calm reassuring presence? What time and what season is this? Can anyone else relate to my ranting?

In my ranting I pause and I think of Scripture and breathe in and breathe deeply and say, "To everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven." I breathe slowly and say, "Come Holy Spirit, renew me Holy Spirit." Try it. Breathe deep and slow. When we are frantic and are feeling like life is out of control or we wonder where God is, we miss God because we are

not looking for God. We need to remember that God is in our life. As we continue to face and cope with different seasons in our life such as, COVID, school year ending, wedding season, graduation season, the season of travel and time at the lake, may we know that God in all of our seasons.

Look ahead to what awaits us. We have the promise of God going before us to show us the way. We have the promise of God that this is the day he has made, let us rejoice in this day and the here and now. Rejoice that hours of daylight are growing. Rejoice that you are healthy and able to see family. Rejoice that masks are being worn by people. Rejoice that in the midst of struggles and pain, grace sufficient for each day comes to us as we listen for God's gentle word of hope and healing.

May is the month of endings and beginnings. School is ending for kids and summer activities are beginning. Graduation is occurring as youth end high school and venture to college or work. Some are ending their college days and entering the work force. Some are ending work and entering into retirement. Some are ending living in their own homes and downsizing to apartment. For some ending of life as they know it because of the death of a loved one and a whole new way of living is beginning. What is ending in your life and what is beginning?

Hold on because in all our endings and beginnings, in all the changes and unsettledness, we have a God who does not change. I think of the verse from Hebrews 11:1, "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." There is our hope during these crazy days of 2021. We may not see what is beginning for us and we may be going through challenges, but faith is knowing that there is a time for everything. We can be confident in the future not because of whom we are but because of who God is.

So this month of May, may you pause, breathe deeply of God's presence and go into the month confident that God goes with you.

We are thankful for the donations given to mission causes through our noisy offering bucket in the Narthex each week. Last week we contributed \$158 to the Lutheran Disaster Relief campaign.

Another important lesson from the "noisy offering" bucket is to help teach our children and youth generosity. Especially now when no offering plates being passed and automatic account withdrawals are common. Most often we learn generosity from our parents, think about your role models for generosity. By encouraging our kids to put some spare change or a portion of their earnings / allowance in the "bucket" each week we teach them:

- 1. To exhibit generous behavior and set that example.
- 2. We place importance on intentionally giving to identified needs.
- 3. We develop the act of sharing as part of their identity
- 4. We can teach children about specific needs in the community and world.

# First Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes - April 14, 2021

<u>Members Present:</u> Pastor Joyce, Nancy Johnson, Brenda Kellen, Craig Thies, Tami Taubert, Sharlene Ludolph, Kristi Henriksen, Dave Dulas, Scott Sterud, Kristen Brockberg, and Chris Hollingsworth.

Call to Order: President Nancy Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:55 PM.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Sharlene L. presented the financial reports, the reserve fund report, and the accounts payable report. These were reviewed and discussed by the Council. Sharlene will send a sales tax-exempt certificate to Computers & Beyond. Kristi H. made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report as written and to pay the accounts payable with the following changes: do not pay the Malware charges, do not pay Dwight, and do not pay the sales tax to Computers & Beyond. Tami T. 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion and it was approved.

<u>Devotions:</u> We watched a Growing Young video – Take Jesus' Message Seriously. There was discussion. The Council is to read chapter 5 in the Growing Young book for next month's devotion and to look up on their cell phones "If Starbucks marketed like a Church".

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> The minutes from the March meeting were reviewed. Brenda K. made a motion to approve the minutes as printed, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Dave D. Motion was approved.

#### Pastor's Report:

- We need Readers & Communion Servers for worship services. A sign-up sheet was passed around. It was noted that the Offering assistant duties are from Council meeting to Council meeting.
- Pastor Joyce fell outside of the church and broke her hand. The sidewalk will be looked at where this happened. Pastor and Ron went on a short trip after Easter.
- Confirmation will be wrapped up over the next 3 weeks, with a meeting every week. Sermon notes
  have been a struggle this year because of inability to attend service and watching sermons. 20 sermon
  notes are required every year of confirmation.
- May 9<sup>th</sup> is Senior Sunday. There are 7 Seniors who will be presented quilts. May 12<sup>th</sup> is our next Council meeting and that is also when Baccalaureate is. Council meeting will be moved to May 19<sup>th</sup>.
- Pastor Joyce is working on getting Baptisms back into the Sunday Service. During Covid, a lot of private Baptisms were done.
- Mission Minute during worship service will be replaced with Faith Sharing by members. It was suggested that Council Members do this during the month they do the offering.
- · Pastor Joyce has gotten back to doing nursing home and assisted living services. She has been doing more home visits. Pastor talked to 9 different people today. People have had a lot of needs during

Covid. Pastor is looking at taking a Sunday off in June.

- Pastor asked the Council what have you missed during Covid coffee, Sunday School, greeting and sharing the peace. She also asked what have you learned during Covid and what would you like to keep doing – Facebook service numbers are going down.
- Pastor Joyce is thinking about getting a group together to look at the Church's Mission Statement & the Church's Values to review these and update them. They have not been looked at for 8 years. We need to keep the Church moving forward.

#### President's Report: No report.

<u>Vice-President's Report:</u> Craig will be working on the insurance form for Pastor's injury. There will be a property insurance review on the parsonage. Craig & Mike Straw will be meeting with Vast on internet issues in the Church. There needs to be consistent internet coverage throughout the Church.

#### Committee Reports - Round Table

- <u>Mission & Outreach</u> Kristi H. The noisy offering for May will be going to Shetek Camp. She received a letter from the SF Banquet asking for us to help serve in June.
- Worship Tami T. Discussed recording a service message during the week rather than continuing with Facebook Live. There are not enough volunteers to help with recording it live, because people are getting busy. The committee will discuss finding other people to help. The committee is still working on their committee description.
- Sunday School Kristen B. Discussed different ideas for Sunday School and a Sunday School roundup pizza party. Ingrid and Kristen are working on Sunday School options and curriculum. Looking at Wednesday nights as an option.
- <u>Property Management</u> Scott S. Upcoming projects: They will clean the church carpets after preschool is done, fix the garage door at the parsonage, finish landscaping the church, and clean the church murals. They are looking for donations to help with the landscaping.
- Adult Ed Brenda K. Last Sunday 4 people met to discuss the book. There are only a couple of Sundays left.
- Congregational Life Dave D. They worked with Pastor Joyce to create a survey about what the
  congregation's interests are. He will send the survey to Ellie tomorrow and they hope to have some
  results by next Council meeting. The survey is through Survey Monkey and there will be some paper
  copies to distribute for those without email.
- · Youth Erin M. No report.

#### Old Business

- Bank Account signatures The account signatures are finally done. One account was missing a last name. Nancy will get this sent in next week.
- Tech Update We received 2 quotes on computers and went with the quote from Computers & Beyond. One computer is up and working. The other one is on its way. Discussed printers.

#### **New Business**

Church Web Page – Reviewed the church's web page and discussed ideas to change and improve it. Looking at the web page on the computer is a different view than on your phone. Nancy and Pastor Joyce will give the ideas to Kelli for her to improve the web page.

# LOOK FOR THE FOLLOWING:

- Older Adults with chronic health conditions
- Older Adults who are isolated, living alone, or disconnected to family, friends, and community due to COVID-19
- Older Adults living in closed living facilities due to COVID-19
- Older Adults who recently received a new health diagnosis
- Older Adults who are caregivers

# OLDER ADULTS WHO DISPLAY/REPORT ANY OF THESE SYMPTOMS:

- Persistent sad, anxious, or "empty" mood
- Feelings of hopelessness, guilt, worthlessness, or helplessness
- Irritability, restlessness, or having trouble sitting still
- Loss of interest in once pleasurable activities, including sex
- Decreased energy or fatigue
- Moving or talking more slowly
- Difficulty concentrating, remembering, making decisions
- Difficulty sleeping, early-morning awakening, or oversleeping
- Eating more or less than usual, usually with unplanned weight gain or loss
- Thoughts of death or suicide, or suicide attempts
- Aches or pains, headaches, cramps, or digestive problems without a clear physical cause and/or that do not ease with treatment
- Frequent crying, expressed Fear of leaving the house
- Failing to keep routine appointments
- Expressed fear, anxiety, sadness, anger, or confusion due to COVID-19
- They received a new habit/life-style altering diagnosis




