

Greetings faithful people of First Lutheran:

I was sorting through some drawers at home and came across a series of pictures. One said, honor the past, another rejoice in the present, and the third embrace the future. I cannot remember when I took them or where I took them. Yet I thought



those are key phrases that describe this time we are living at First Lutheran.

Honor our past. What does that mean? Honor is to hold in high regard, or high respect, or revere. As I think not just about the 8 years that I have been here, but also the history of First Lutheran, for there is much to respect and honor. First Lutheran began in 1892. Faithful men and women since then have come and gone. Faithful men and women have served in

many capacities here and have worshiped. What I respect or honor about the past is that through stormy times, times of celebration, times of growth, times of loss, times of weddings and baptisms, and times depression and lack of income, the church continues to thrive and survive. Why? Because the foundation of the church is Jesus Christ and the message of "Christ has died, Christ has risen, and Christ will come again" is at the heart of our mission and ministry.

We show respect and honor of the past by carrying on the legacy of nameless and forgotten men and women who has faithfully served God, one another, and built this church. Now is the time for each of us to look within ourselves as ask, "God, what is the task you are calling me to be part of as First Lutheran embraces the future you have for us? Now is the time to remember the past and give thanks for faithful men and women who lave led, guided, prayed, led worship, taught Sunday School, served as custodians, served as a funeral committee, served at Kaffi-Ti, filled communion cups, and sat in the pews and sang and worshiped the living God. The list goes on.

We honor the past as we remember our identity as Lutherans. Faith Alone, Scripture Alone and Grace alone. We honor the past by reminding ourselves that the church is here for the sake of the neighbor and building one another up in the faith. Faith Alone- we are saved by grace through faith. Luther said faith is, "a living, bold trust in God's grace, so certain of God's favor that it would risk death a thousand times trusting in it." I love that definition. Faith is God's work in us, that changes us and gives new life. May we as we look ahead hold on to God's promises and know that God who has begun a good work in us will continue to build the church.

As Lutherans, we believe in Scripture alone. Scripture is the written word of God. Scripture is Jesus the living word of God. Scripture is the supreme authority of the church. As people of faith may we this fall dust off the Bible and as individuals and families dig into the word of God. I think of Psalm 119:105, "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet and light unto my path." May God's word guide us into the future as the word has rooted us in the past.

As we honor the past, we are reminded that we live by God's grace. God's grace is God granting us that which we do not deserve. Think of your life and the church and all that we been given. We have life, forgiveness of sins, hope, love, joy, and peace. All gifts of God.

Let us in September pause and honor the past by giving thanks for all that has been and praying for all that is yet to be.

Prayer for September:

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Called to Serve

We are working on setting up some new projects that will be sustainable through the transition period ahead of us.

Pastor Joyce is training volunteers to serve as our visitor team. The members will provide contacts through the church to those in need of visitation in their homes or care settings. If you have benefited from pastoral visits in the past, you know how important this team will be. Give them your support and encouragement as they develop this important mission. Details are yet to be worked out but if you are interested in making connections with those in need of visitation, please let Pastor Joyce know.

First Lutheran is also starting a new education program called "Living in Faith Together" (L.I.F.T). It will be a joint effort of the Sunday School and Adult Education Committees. Intended for parents and children, this Wednesday evening program will provide support and education on growing in faith to families in the congregation. We thank Kristen Brockberg for taking a leadership role in this project. Be watching for more information. Support the program with your help and prayers as we work to teach our young people about what it means to follow Jesus.

<u>Members Present:</u> Pastor Joyce, Nancy Johnson, Dave Dulas, Scott Sterud, Kristi Henriksen, Sharleen Ludolph, Kristen Brockberg, Chris Hollingsworth, and Jocelyn Burnett.

<u>Call to Order:</u> President Nancy Johnson called the meeting to order at 8:00 PM.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Sharleen L. presented the financial reports, the reserve fund report, and the accounts payable report. These were reviewed and discussed by the Council. There was extra discussion about the work comp insurance, payroll subscription, and the copier lease. Later in the meeting, after there was a full quorum, Kristi H. made a motion to pay the Accounts Payable Report and to approve the Treasurer's report, as both were written. Scott S. 2nd it and it was approved.

<u>Devotions</u>: We watched the last Growing Young video – The first job of a leader is to define reality. Discussion followed. This is the last chapter, in the Growing Young book. There was discussion about how to do devotions going forward. Pastor Joyce will bring in a guide next month.

Secretary's Report: The minutes from the July meeting were reviewed. There was a vote to approve the minutes as written. All members voted in favor and the minutes were approved.

Pastor's Report:

- Pastor has been lining up and training people to help with shut-in visits and shut-in communion.

- There was discussion about a couple of incidents that have happened lately with having an unlocked church. The Council decided that the church doors will be locked when there is no church service. A notice will be posted on the doors with a phone number to call, to be let into the church.
- · Joyce Colvin did a good job managing the fair food stand this year. Joyce C. burned her arm at the food stand and an Incident Report was completed.
- · Pastor will start meeting with confirmation students.
- · This Saturday the Bishop retires. Pastor Joyce and Kristy H. will be going. Pastor will be helping at Grace Lutheran with their service.
- \cdot $\;$ Faith Lutheran is having a car wash and asked if our church wanted to participate. The Council

decided not to.

- · Pastor Joyce handed out a talking point LIFT, Living in Faith Together. There was discussion and Council decided it should be posted.
- · There are three more Sundays of the Generosity Mission Statements. Discussed possible volunteers. There are multiple baptisms and weddings in the future.

President's Report:

- 1. Nancy J. reported that we need to increase the awareness of the Work Care Groups. The task coordinators will be contacted to organize these groups again, to do small tasks.
- 2. Handed out a Code of Conduct, attachment A. This must be reviewed by the next Council meeting so it can be discussed and in place before Sunday School starts.
- 3. September 19 was set up as Rally Sunday. It will include coffee and snacks. Congregational Life committee will help serve. Coffee after Church services will start Sept. 12.

<u>Vice-President's Report:</u> Craig was absent, so Nancy presented the report. The Personal Committee is working on better job descriptions for the custodians – their job duties and who they should report to.

<u>New Business</u> – Bulletin Board – a 78"x50" wood bulletin board will be mounted by the Pastor's office. Notices will be posted here.


Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 9:35 pm, with the Closing Prayer.





Companion Synod

We are a church that believes God is calling us into the world - together.

The ELCA has companion synod relationships that connect Lutheran churches throughout the world with ELCA synods and congregations. These relationships are rooted in "accompaniment," which promotes the values of mutuality, inclusivity, vulnerability, empowerment, and sustainability. Through the program, companion churches and ELCA synods nurture and strengthen one another for life and ministry through prayer, study, communication, exchange of visitors, and sharing of resources.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Southern Africa – South Eastern Diocese is our synod's companion.



Companion synod relationships, including the one between Southwestern Minnesota Synod and the South Eastern Diocese of the ELCSA, began in 1990. The relationship was promoted primarily by exchange of visits by bishops and church officials of the companion partners. In 2005 it was decided to expand the relationship to the local level by pairing the 10 circuits of the South Eastern Diocese with the 10 conferences of Southwestern Minnesota Synod, so that people from the companions could come to know, walk with, and join each other in ministry and projects.

Through these connections, we have benefitted from learning about reconciliation and forgiveness from our South African companions. We have also learned about poverty, racism, amazing singing, and people having great faith in very difficult situations.

Some realities are pervasive throughout the diocese. The realities created by the 350 years of Apartheid and racism continue in South Africa despite the election of Nelson Mandela in 1994. HIV/AIDS presents grave health issues and has created many orphans and much poverty. The climate of the diocese is very hard on their church buildings.

Some realities are pervasive throughout the diocese. The realities created by the 350 years of Apartheid and racism continue in South Africa despite the election of Nelson Mandela in 1994. HIV/AIDS presents grave health issues and has created many orphans and much poverty. The climate of the diocese is very hard on their church buildings.

Early in the circuit-conference relationships, it was decided that we could work together to combat HIV/AIDS through both a diocesan HIV/AIDS coordinator and circuits carrying on their own ministries. Thus, our conferences have annually supported a diocesan HIV/AIDS coordinator, and conferences are still encouraged to support the diocese's Health and Wellness Committee's efforts to combat HIV/AIDS.

All conferences and circuits have worked commonly to provide required school uniforms for children. Students from poor families are not able to afford \$50 a year for uniforms.

Conferences also work to help with various kinds of building projects in the circuits since parsonages and sanctuaries need to be repaired and most of their offerings go to pastors' low salaries. Buildings are neglected because the local church does not own either the parsonage or sanctuary.

Conferences and circuits, in their discussions and relationships, develop their own ministries and projects together. There is room for creativity in relationships. Some circuits and conferences are quite urban while others are very rural. Several of our conferences are very involved with helping with agricultural projects with their companion circuits in growing community gardens and raising chickens and rabbits. The diocese also appreciates pastors helping with preaching and teaching about stewardship.
