Welcome to Lent!

Lent is a season of 40 days (minus Sundays, which are "little Easters" and not part of the 40 days), which began on Ash Wednesday. It generally is a season of preparation, introspection, and reflection, leading to Holy Week, and ending as dawn breaks on Easter morning.

During the Ash Wednesday service, there is an "Invitation to Lent," which is a way to help us focus on what Lent is, and why it is important. The Invitation reads:

"Friends in Christ, today with the whole church we enter the time of remembering Jesus' Passover from death to life, and our life in Christ is renewed.

"We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and for God's mercy. We are created to experience joy in communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation. But our sinful rebellion separated us from God, our neighbors, and creation, so that we do not enjoy the life our creator intended.

"As disciples of Jesus we are called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from love of God and neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to the discipline of Lent – self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love – strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament. Let us continue our journey through these forty days to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection."

Lent can be seen as somber and sorrowful, bleak, dark, and frankly rather depressing. But this time of year is also when springtime (begins to) arrive, with more sunshine, longer days, crocus, daffodils, and tulips poking out of the ground and providing long-awaited color, gentle rains which melt snow and wash away winter crud, warmer weather so we can put away puffy coats, and the smell of spring in the air.

The “clashing” of Lent and spring may seem jarring, but it is good to see parallels. Right now, the earth is stirring, waiting to stretch and wake from winter slumber, just as our faith is stirring, examining, and stretching, waking at Jesus’ resurrection.

I invite you to use this time of intentional reflection, as well as experiencing the slow unfurling of spring, to prepare for Easter.

- ◆ **TREASURER'S REPORT:** Motion made to pay ABC (Automated Building Controls) & Progress from the Building Fund, other bills paid as listed.
- ◆ **PASTOR'S REPORT:** Pastor Ann gave a verbal report for January. Lenten services are scheduled for 6:15pm, starting next Wednesday. Ministerial Committee is discussing an outdoor service during Watertower Festival weekend to be held at the Pageant Grounds. More information to come!





Someone Needs You Today

We often get so caught up in the pace of our own lives—our deadlines, our to-do lists, our worries—that it becomes easy to overlook the people God has placed directly in our path. We might believe that making a difference requires a grand gesture or a significant sacrifice, but more often than not, it's the small, simple acts of love that have the biggest impact. The truth is, someone in your world needs you today.

It might be the coworker who is quietly struggling, the friend who needs a listening ear, or the family member who feels unseen. It could even be the stranger in the grocery store who needs nothing more than a warm smile. God presents us with countless opportunities every day to be His hands and feet. The question is, are our eyes open enough to see them?

Being a blessing to others doesn't have to be complicated. It is about reflecting the love that Christ has so freely given to us. This means choosing to offer a word of encouragement instead of criticism. It means putting down your phone to give someone your full attention. It means sending a quick text to let someone know you are praying for them. These actions may seem small to you, but they can be a lifeline to someone who is feeling discouraged or alone.

Today, as you go about your day, ask God to give you eyes to see the needs around you and the courage to meet them. You might be the answer to someone else's prayer. Don't underestimate the power of your presence, your words, and your kindness. You have a unique opportunity to show someone a glimpse of God's immense love.

Pipestone County Area Food Shelf

For the months of February & March, our collection of Noisy offering is going to our local County food shelf. March is also 'match month' so we can increase what is given. Here is some facts and information about our local food shelf:

- ◆ In 2024, the Pipestone County Food Shelf served 5108 Households made up of 14,626 Individuals. The average household accessed the food shelf 6 times during the year.
- ◆ About 35% of those served are Children (ages 0 to 17) and another 10% are Seniors (age 65 and up).
- ◆ 430,578 pounds of food were distributed in 2024. That's 215 *tons*!
- ◆ Most food is ordered through Second Harvest Heartland in Brooklyn Park, MN. The food shelf receives produce, some meat, and varying items at no cost through government programs, such as TEFAP (The Emergency Food Assistance Program), and grants. Some food is donated by the manufacturer or a wholesaler, and some is purchased, usually below retail cost. We receive a truckload averaging about 15,000 lbs from Second Harvest twice a month.
- ◆ Our local Food Rescue partners, Coborns, Hanks, and Kwik Trip contributed over 38,000 lbs of food in 2025.
- ◆ Dakota Layers, JBS, and Spronk Brothers make regular donations of eggs and meat.
- ◆ Other local businesses, organizations, and individuals also donate food items, including garden produce during the growing season.
- ◆ In the 2025 Food Shelf Shopper Survey, visitors to the Pipestone County Food Shelf indicate the foods most important to receive at each visit are:
 - ⇒ Eggs - 92%
 - ⇒ Meat, Poultry, Fish - 89%
 - ⇒ Fresh Fruits and Vegetables - 89%
 - ⇒ Dairy (milk, cheese, yogurt) - 82%
- ◆ The Pipestone County Food Shelf has been serving the residents of Pipestone County since 1983.
- ◆ The Pipestone County Food Shelf is an entirely volunteer-led organization. Member churches assist with weekly Thursday afternoon distributions (2 - 5 pm), while other volunteers assist with Senior Distribution (2 Friday mornings a month), and additional tasks such as helping to unload the Second Harvest Truck, bagging produce, and stocking shelves.
- ◆ Donations may be mailed to Pipestone County Food Shelf, Inc, 205 2nd St NW, Pipestone, MN 56164.





Bullying Also Involves Our Attitudes

Children typically recognize physical harm and unkind words as acts of **bullying**. But they may not consider unkind attitudes as equally unacceptable. We need to help kids understand that it's *never* okay to be unkind to others.

Consider [Ephesians 4:1-2](#), where Paul says, "I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love."

God wants us to treat others with humility and gentleness, with patience and love. So we need to help kids learn to use this standard to choose the words they use and the attitudes they show.

A Lesson in Bullying

For a few weeks, jot down some things you hear children say about others and attitudes you notice, both positive and negative. Then, without naming names, read what you heard and observed. Ask children if these things show humility, gentleness, patience, and love. Also ask how they would feel if others used these words or attitudes with them. Spend time in prayer asking God to help us all be people who choose to say "NO!" to bullying and "YES!" to treating others with kindness.

Challenge kids to think about how they use their words and attitudes in these situations:

- When their team has players who aren't physically strong and they end up losing... What do they say to or about the kids who weren't able to help them win?
- When a new child comes to class... Do they warmly invite the newcomer to join them, or do they point, stare, and whisper instead?
- When a child looks and/or dresses differently from them... Do they share Jesus' love or ignore them?

Urge children to choose to "walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which they have been called." Remind them that Jesus wants us to act "with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love."

Steps to Take if you think your child is being bullied:


1. **Listen to your child** - be supportive and avoid over-reacting. Create a safe space for them to express their feelings.
2. **Reassure your child** - Let your child know it is not their fault and remind them they are not alone and remind them of their positive qualities and skills.
3. **Coach your child on how to react** - Teach them strategies for dealing with bullies. (ie: walking away, seeking help from an adult, staying calm.)
4. **Avoid retaliation** - it's important to model constructive problem-solving for your child. Retaliation can escalate a situation and not resolve the issue.
5. **Communicate with the school** - Report bullying to a teacher or a school administrator. Follow up to ensure appropriate actions are being taken to address the situation.
6. **Seek professional help if needed.** - If bullying continues or if your child is showing distress, consider counseling services or a mental health professional.

By taking some of these steps, you can help your child navigate the challenges of bullying and foster resilience. Your support is vital in helping them feel safe and valued.


