Dear Parish Families,

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus declares, "I came to cast fire upon the earth, and how I wish it were already blazing!" (Luke 12:49). He's not speaking of destruction, but of a holy fire — one that purifies, awakens, and transforms. Like a prairie fire that clears away dead growth to make room for new life, Christ's fire burns away complacency and calls us to deeper faith. It may cause division, even within families, because truth challenges comfort and discipleship demands courage.

As a parish, we're invited to carry this fire — not with fear, but with purpose. In our homes, our ministries, and our community, we can be bearers of Christ's light: speaking truth with love, living our faith boldly, and kindling hope in others. Let us welcome the fire Jesus brings, trusting that what it consumes, He will renew with grace.

A few parish updates: the 6:30 p.m. extra Saturday evening Mass at St. Cecilia, which has been offered during the summer months, will conclude **on August 30**. Later, we can assess whether this is something we should continue in the future. On another note, I encourage each of you to consider attending one of the adult education classes being offered.
