

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This past week, our nation experienced intense focus on our differences. Elections have a way of doing that, don't they? As we gather this Sunday, I invite you to pause, breathe, and consider the incredible blessing of peace—especially in our relationships. The recent elections may have stirred up discussions, differing opinions, and perhaps even frustration. But let us remember that the strength of our relationships matters most, far more than political views or affiliations.

There will be a chance for a Holy Hour during the next several Thursday evenings. We may also call it Eucharistic Adoration, which begins at 6:30 pm and ends around 7:30 pm. During that time, there will be an opportunity for those wishing to go to Confession.



Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday, we celebrate Gaudete Sunday, a day of rejoicing as we draw closer to the celebration of Christ's birth. The readings remind us of the joy and hope of trusting God's promises. The prophet Zephaniah (3:14-18a) speaks of God's tender love for His people, describing Him as a mighty Savior who rejoices over us with gladness. In his letter to the Philippians (4:4-7), St. Paul encourages us to rejoice always, as the Lord is near. Finally, in the Gospel of Luke (3:10-18), John the Baptist challenges us to prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ by living lives of generosity, fairness, and integrity.

Dear Parishioners,

As we light the final candle on the Advent wreath this week, we are fast approaching the festive celebrations of Christmas. In these final days, we should recollect and prepare ourselves for the Solemn Christ Mass, welcoming the newborn King into our hearts and lives.

The Fourth Sunday of Advent invites us to reflect on the profound mystery of the Incarnation, as fore-told by the prophet Micah, who proclaimed, "You, Bethlehem-Ephrathah too small to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel; whose origin is from of old." (Mic 5:2). This prophecy reminds us of the humble beginnings of our Savior, who chose to enter our world in the most unassuming way.

We also hear from the Letter to the Hebrews, which says, "Behold, I come to do your will." (Heb 10:7). The call to obedience and surrender is echoed in the Gospel of Luke, where Mary receives the angel's message, responds with faith and trust, saying, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38). Yet, we have for the Gospel Mary visiting Elizabeth and in the final verse of today's passage Elizabeth proclaims: "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."

May we believe in Christ, who has come to teach, reconcile, and redeem us if we choose. As you gather with loved ones this Sunday and Christmas, I pray we do not forget God's love for us, that He sent Jesus to bring us closer to God and each other, and not a time for politics being more important than God and loved ones. God is born into our hearts and our lives, and we are all to become a Holy Family of God. Focusing on relationships comes about by making time for prayer and reflection and then practicing the virtues to allow the spirit of Christmas to fill us with peace and hope.

Remember to check this bulletin for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Mass times.

As you gather with family and friends this Christmas, I encourage you to invite them to Mass. Let us come together not just as a community but as members of God's family to give God the proper worship and adoration He deserves.

May the Christ Child enter your hearts and fill you with His love, peace, and joy. May He be your strength and guide, especially during trials and difficulties.

Wishing you and your loved ones a Merry Christmas filled with many joys and blessings.



Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph December 29, 2024



In the second reading, Saint Paul teaches the burgeoning Christian family in Colossae the importance of "bearing with one another and forgiving one another" (Colossians 3:13). This needs to happen for any family to thrive and grow. Families will have disagree-

ments. Family members will hurt one another, unintentionally or not. In today's Gospel, Mary and Joseph could have punished Jesus for not telling them that he was staying in the temple. Jesus could have been offended that he was being treated like a child. But any negative feelings they had they bore without lashing out and they forgave one another for their misunderstandings.

Because she was childless for so long, Hannah promised God that if she had a son, she would consecrate him to the Lord. Today we would never consider giving a little child over to the priests of our parish. Yet, parents generally bring their newborns to the church to be baptized, consecrating them in their faith. Though the newborn's parents still raise the child as their own, they also understand that all of us are God's children and they trust God to watch over their precious baby, for he or she is precious to God as well. We place our children in God's hands, as our parents likely did when we were young.

Luke tells us that all who heard the twelve-year-old Jesus in the temple "were astounded at his understanding" (Luke 2:47). His response to his parents when they finally find him shows that he understands that he is the Son of the God who welcomes being called "Abba," an intimate term for "Father." He understands that even though his mother and foster father love him with all their hearts, his Father loves him with a divine love, a perfect love. Lather he will tell his disciples that the Father loves them perfectly as well.

<u>Question of the Week:</u> How can I help my family be more reflective of the Holy Family? What difficulties stand out in our family life?







What God did in the lives of countless saints, he wants to do in the lives of ordinary people like us. And that's what this study is about: the journey of prayer God wants to take us on.

THE HOLY FAMILY: JESUS, MARY & JOSEPH

As modern discussions make clear, it is not easy to define a family or the roles within it. Today's readings add the complication that more is expected of individuals who exercise extraordinary roles, whether it is the judge-priest-prophet-Nazirite Samuel, the God-become-human Jesus, or even ordinary Christians trying to live out their Christian identity in the world.

Samuel: Despite their designation as "historical," the Books of Samuel interpret all historical events theologically. Consisting of a total of fifty-five chapters that describe the years 1070 to 970 BC, these books interpret the transition from the chaotic period of the judges to the kingship of David. For the author of Samuel, it is God who raises up, inspires, and guides leaders, not historical or political circumstances, much less the person himself. This insight is key to understanding today's reading.

In the verses preceding today's reading, the reader is introduced to Samuel through his birth narrative. The chapter begins with a description of his pious family: his father Elkanah and his mother Hannah. Tormented by Elkanah's other wife, Peninnah, over her barrenness, Hannah prays at the shrine in Shiloh for a male child and vows that she will raise him as a Nazirite, dedicating him to the Lord's service. After an initial misunderstanding, the resident priest—Eli—blesses her and her prayer.

Today's reading begins with God's answer to her prayer: Hannah conceives and gives birth to a son. Highly theological, the reading pulls together many of the previous pieces of the story to show that this is more than a story of a family: it is a story of God's work in the world. First, Hannah stands in line with other barren women in Scripture whose sons furthered God's salvific plans. We can recall the examples of Sarah, the mother of Isaac: the unnamed mother of Samson; and Elizabeth, the mother of John the Baptist. Next we see that the reading continues to focus on the highly religious nature of the family. They engage in the annual pilgrimage, make vows, offer sacrifice, and trust in God's answer to prayer. Indeed, the child's name, shemu'el (Samuel), is explained by the phrase she'iltiv (requested from God). Thus, the circumstances of his birth and the faith of his parents foretell Samuel's greatness. This child, who is the answer to a vow, bridges the periods of the judges and the kings. Dedicated from his birth, he serves a priestly role at Shiloh, as a Nazirite. Chosen by God, he is prophet who meditates between God and Israel's first kings.

St. Patrick's Financial Council - December 10, 2024

Fr. David opened our meeting with prayer at 7PM. In addition to Fr. David, council members attending were Tom Chambers, Kevin Wittrock, Charlotte Fett, Michelle Griffith, Doug Sorensen, Marty Hanson, and Don Mosinski.

Doug moved/Marty seconded that the agenda for the meeting be approved. All voted in favor. Minutes of the October 8, 2024 finance council meeting were read. Doug moved/Charlotte seconded approval of minutes as submitted. All in favor.

Linda went over the financial statements from October & November. No major expenses during the period. We did have \$1,423 in expenses in November for priests who covered for us while Fr. David was receiving medical care. Net income for end of November was \$1,522. The building fund had a gain of \$10,000. Parishioners have been very generous! This brings the fund to \$221,007 as of the end of November. Kevin moved/Marty seconded approval of the financial statements as presented. All approved.

Safety Committee: Marty was in touch with the gentlemen who handled our bat removal. He rented a lift to close off one spot where the bats had been able to get back in. Linda is working on an evacuation plan.

Grounds committee: Michelle found some grant possibilities for cemetery repairs. The Daughters of the American Revolution provide grants for repairs on historical grave sites. Several organizations provide grants for the cemeteries of veterans. Linda will provide a list of veterans buried at St. Patrick's cemetery, and Michelle will work on applying for some of those grants, to do repairs on at least some of the headstones.

Old Business: Thad Harker of Primus Companies has lined up an engineering team for our building project. The original estimate from K/O Architects included civil engineering and topographical surveys, architectural and interior designs, mechanical electrical and plumbing design, structural engineering designs, soil testing and miscellaneous at a cost of \$125,000. The Primus estimate came in much lower at \$40,540 for this work, with no miscellaneous expenses included. After much discussion, it was decided that the investment in the plan would be a good investment, even if we don't move forward with the construction right away. Doug moved/ Marty seconded approval of Primus Companies as the engineer on this planning phase, subject to the approval of the Diocesan Property Management Director. All voted in favor.

Linda will call Mid American Energy about converting the lights in the church basement to LED lights. St. Patrick's parish has met its ADA goal as of 12/10/24!!

New Business: Marty moved and Kevin seconded approval of Christmas bonuses of \$250 each for staff members, and \$50 each for catechists.

The diocesan priest housing agreement was read. Kevin motioned and Michelle seconded approval of the letter as read. All voted in favor.

The next finance council meeting will be held February 18 at 7pm.

Don moved/Michelle seconded that we adjourn the meeting at 8:35 pm. All approved.
