# FROM THE DESK OF

## Fr. Ray Higgins



Dear Parish Family,

As we light the final candle on our Advent wreath, the liturgy shifts our gaze from Israel's long history to the immediate events preceding Christ's birth. This Sunday, the Gospel of Matthew (1:18-24) invites us to step into the shoes of St. Joseph.

Joseph faced a crisis that would shatter any man's peace: his betrothed was with child, and the child was not his. Yet, in the midst of this turmoil, Joseph displays a profound holiness. When the angel appears to him in a dream to reveal the truth of the Incarnation, Joseph does not argue. He does not ask for more proof. He simply wakes up and does as the angel commanded.

It is often noted that St. Joseph speaks no words in the New Testament. His sanctity is wrapped in a profound stillness. This brings to mind a riddle that I think fits this final week of Advent perfectly:

The Riddle: I am not found on any map, but every person seeks me. I am never bought, but I am often sold. I am broken the moment you speak my name. What am I? The answer, of course, is Silence.

St. Joseph is the patron saint of this "holy silence." In our modern world, silence is often viewed as empty space—something to be filled with noise, podcasts, music, or news. But for the Christian, silence is not empty; it is the necessary atmosphere for meeting God.

This riddle reminds us of a vital spiritual truth: Silence is fragile. In our noisy world, we must intentionally cultivate it. We often "sell" our silence to the demands of life, trading our peace for busyness. But if we are constantly speaking, or constantly surrounded by noise, we cannot hear the "still, small voice" of the Holy Spirit.

Joseph could hear the angel because his heart was quiet. He was listening. If he had been consumed by the noise of his own fear or the gossip of the town, he might have missed the instruction to take Mary into his home.

As we enter this final, often chaotic week before Christmas, I challenge you to protect your silence. "Buy back" a few moments of quiet this week. Turn off the car radio; sit by the tree in the dark; spend five minutes in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.

It is in that silence that we, like Joseph, will find the courage to welcome Emmanuel—God with us—into our homes and hearts.
