North Beach Park is currently closed as it will be getting a new dock, thanks to Boy Scout Daniel, who is working to earn his Eagle Scout Rank, along with his boy scout troop and other volunteers. Daniel had his plans submitted to his scout council to do this project last summer but with the pandemic, it was not possible for him to work on his project.

Did you know that Trails End Lake was originally known as Prickett Lake? It was names for Emma Pickett, who owned property near the lake in 1896. The lake is

located in Mason County, Township 22, North Range 2 west of the Willamette Meridian. It is composed of parts of sections 23 and 24. It was first surveyed by the Department of Interior during the summer and fall of 1861.

Our very first recipe is from our TECC President Robert Elliott – ENJOY!

Meatball & Kale Soup

3 large Carrots, peeled and chopped 1 small white Onion, peeled and chopped 1 Tbsp Olive Oil ½ pound of Kale, washed and cut into bite-sized pieces 10 cups Beef Broth

For the meatballs:

1 lb. 7% fat Ground Beef
½ small White Onion, finely chopped
2 large Eggs beaten
¼ cup plain dried Breadcrumbs
½ cup Grated Parmesan Cheese
Dash of Nutmeg
1 Tsp Sea Salt
¼ Tsp Black Pepper

In a large stock pot, heat olive oil and add carrots, onion and kale. Sauté 5 minutes. Add broth and bring to a boil. Reduce to simmer for 15 minutes.

In a medium bowl, combine meatball ingredients and mix well. Shape into walnut size meatballs. Carefully drop meatballs into broth. Bring back to a soft boil and let them bubble in the broth, stirring gently. Cover and reduce heat to simmer for ½ hour until meatballs are cooked through. Serve with grated Parmesan Cheese and a crusty bread.

RECIPE CORNER

Egg Rolls

3 lbs. Sausage (season with salt & ginger)

Brown and drain

Dice small:

- 1/3 can bamboo shoots
- 1/3 can water chestnuts
- 1 stalk celery
- 2-3 green onions
- ½ carrot
- 2 mushrooms
- Bean sprouts equal to cooked sausage bulk

Add diced vegetables (except bean sprouts) to sausage and cook for 1 minute.

Remove from heat and add bean sprouts

Spoon onto egg roll wrapper (approximately 1 Tbsp)

Fold and seal with a drop of water

Cook in hot oil

Serve with vinegar and garlic, combine 1 cup vinegar with 1 clove garlic. Let sit for 1 hour.

FUN FACT #2

By 1900, the property around the lake was owned mostly in 40-acre parcels. The land adjacent to the lake itself was called "government lots" and were usually greater or lesser than the normal 40-acre parcels. The land between Allyn and Prickett Lake had been logged by 1909, as well as some land between the lake and Hood Canal. The timber was moved to North Bay by railroad.

RECIPE CORNER

Homemade Ice Cream

(you must have an ice cream maker – electric or crank, with the can in the middle and will need ice to pack around the can to help freeze the ice cream)

	1 Gallon	1 1/2 Gallons	2 Gallons
Eggs	4	6	8
Eagle Brand			
Condensed			
Milk	½ can	1 can	2 cans
Sugar	2 cups	3 cups	4 cups
Vanilla	1 ½ Tbsp	2 Tbsp	3 Tbsp
Milk	Approximately 6 cups or enough to fill		
each can to	within ¼ ful	I.	

Mix eggs, Eagle brand, sugar and vanilla together. Pour into can and then add milk. Strawberries or peaches may be added if desired. Use 1 quart thawed for a gallon. You can also add a little red coloring with strawberries.
