CHRISMONS

Chrismons are white and gold Christian monograms and symbols, originally handmade ornaments created to decorate a Christmas tree. The word Chrismon refers to "Christ" and "monogram". The white symbolizes joy and holiness, while the gold represents glory and royalty, and each symbol is meant to teach about Christ.

- Origin: The concept was developed in 1957 by Frances Spencer at the Ascension Lutheran Church in Danville, VA.
- Purpose: The ornaments are used to decorate a "Chrismon tree," which is often adorned only with white and gold ornaments and clear lights. The purpose is to explain the story of Christ through the ornaments, which are used during the Advent and Christmas season.
- Symbols: Chrismons are decorated with various Christian symbols, such as:



- o Chi Rho: A monogram of Christ, formed from the first two letters of the Greek word for Christ.
- $A\Omega$ \circ Alpha and Omega: The first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, representing Christ as the beginning and end of all things.



- O Fish (Ichthys): An acrostic for "Jesus Christ, God's Son, Savior," which was once a secret sign for early Christians during times of persecution.
 - Crosses: In various forms, symbolizing the crucifixion and other aspects of Christ's life.
- Materials: Chrismons can be made from a variety of materials, including white felt, foam, and craft wood, and are often decorated with gold paint, glitter, and other embellishments. Making them is considered a project for all ages.
