L: Jesus Christ is the Light of the world,

C: The Light no darkness can overcome.

L: Let us worship Him.

Confession and Forgiveness

L: We are gathered in the name of the Father, and of the Son +, and of the Holy Spirit. C: Amen.

L: Calling to mind our need for God's mercy and grace, let us confess our sin to the One who walks with us through our human life.

(Silence for reflection and self-examination)

L: God of life and light,

C: You join us in our humanity through your Son Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh, and you know our frailties and failings. Pardon our selfishness, release us from captivity to all that leads us away from you, center our lives on the manger and the cross, and restore us to a right relationship with you.

L: God who is gracious and merciful, abounding in steadfast love, forgives you all your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son +, and of the Holy Spirit. May He strengthen you to live and serve as His faithful people in the world.

C: Amen.

L: Behold, the days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah.

C: This new covenant was sealed at our Savior's birth.

L: There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse.

C: And a branch from his roots shall bear fruit.

L: For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon His shoulder.

C: His name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

L: This one whom the prophets foretold is the Messiah,

C: The King of kings and the Lord of lords. It is He whom we worship; it is He whom we adore.

L: We light the Christ candle in celebration of His birth.

C: The Light of the world has come.

(The Christ Candle is lit.)

First Reading

Isaiah 9:2-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone. You have multiplied the nation; you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as they are glad when they divide the spoil. For the yoke of his burden, and the staff for his shoulder, the rod of his oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. For every boot of the tramping warrior in battle tumult and every garment rolled in blood will be burned as fuel for the fire. For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. Titus 2:11-14

For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age, waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for himself a people for his own possession who are zealous for good works.

C: Glory to You, O Lord

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. And all went to be registered, each to his own town. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. And while they were there, the time came

for her to give birth. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"

When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

The Nicene Creed
