BUDAPEST

Days 1 & 2: September 28th - 29th 2025

Budapest, a city of grandeur and romance, has long been a cradle of musical brilliance. As the birthplace of **Franz Liszt**, Hungary's most celebrated composer and virtuoso pianist, the city resonates with his legacy, from the prestigious Liszt Academy of Music to the grand concert halls that still echo with his compositions.

Day 1:

Welcome onboard your River & Music cruise. Encounter your luxurious swimming hotel for the next 7 days. Enjoy a welcome cocktail and dinner on board.

While Budapest slowly transforms into a sea of lights, we set a fiery highlight in the Panorama Lounge: clear the stage for our folklore show with two dancing couples in colourful traditional costumes. 
And afterwards? Another highlight awaits you: our atmospheric light tour through magnificently illuminated Budapest. You can enjoy the most beautiful view from the very top of the sun deck - accompanied by the wonderful sounds of the waltz, which will capture your heart and your dancing legs.

Day 2:

Explore Budapest on the traces of Franz Liszt during your morning excursions.

In the evening there is possibility to visit Esztergom. Enjoy the incredible views of the Danube Bend region and visit, among other sites, the Cathedral of Esztergom, the largest church in Hungary, which was the model for St. Peter's Basilica in Rome.

After dinner you will be delighted by the first musical highlight on board, soprano Rebeca Olvera performs a recital with piano accompaniment.

It was not by coincidence that the three musicians came together under the name of the "gentle revolutionary" Peter Altenberg. The poet symbolizes the love of beauty and the adventure of life. His devotion to stylistic precision is legendary, as is his keen sense of subtle humor and quiet irony.

The tradition of the Altenberg Trio Wien began in 1984, when pianist Claus-Christian Schuster founded the Vienna Schubert Trio together with violinist Boris Kuschnir and cellist Martin Hornstein. A re-founding followed in 1994, under the name "Altenberg Trio", first with violinist Amiram Ganz and later with cellist Alexander Gebert. As "Trio in Residence" of the Gesellschaft der Musikfreunde in Vienna, it has been an essential fixture of Viennese cultural life for almost 40 years. There are few chamber music ensembles worldwide that pass on tradition through generations.

The Altenberg Trio stands for maintaining this continuity in flux. The three musicians of the current ensemble are also very active soloists. Ziyu He was one of the youngest soloists with the Vienna Philharmonic. Christopher Hinterhuber is a professor at the Vienna University of Music and Performing Arts and Peter Somodari is

principal cellist of the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra. In addition to the cycle at the Vienna Musikverein the trio played concerts at the Salzburg Mozartwoche, the Lockenhaus Chamber Music Festival, the Bregenz Festival, the Georges Enescu Festival in Bucharest, appearances at the Teatro la Fenice in Venice and at the Library of Congress in Washington, to mention a few. For years, the Altenberg Trio has been responsible for the artistic direction of the Schloss Weinzierl Music Festival in Lower Austria, a place with high significance in music history, where the young Haydn composed his first string quartets.

Over their many years of concert activity, the Altenberg Trio has recorded numerous CDs, many of which have won honours. For example, the complete recording of Schumann's piano trios was awarded the Robert Schumann Prize of the city of Zwickau (alongside prize winners such as Nikolaus Harnoncourt and Alfred Brendel). The Altenberg Trio's current repertoire includes more than 200 piano trios, including several works that the Altenberg Trio itself inspired and premiered. Ziyu He plays the 1698 "ex Rouse-Boughton" violin by Antonio Stradivari on loan from the Austrian National Bank.




Day 4: October 1st 2025

Kirill Kobantschenko - Violin

Born in Odessa, Ukraine, Kirill Kobantschenko is a celebrated violinist and a key member of the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra. Having studied in Odessa and Vienna, he has built a career defined by brilliance and versatility. As the artistic director of K+K Vienna, he combines his classical expertise with a flair for innovtative collaborations. Kobantschenko's performances are marked by their lyrical expressiveness and technical mastery, making him a standout among today's violinists.



Bartek Sikorski - Double Bass

Born in Piekary, Poland, Bartek Sikorski joined the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra in 2003, where he quickly earned a reputation for his exceptional skill and rich, resonant sound on the double bass. As a composer and visual artist, Sikorski's creative pursuits extend beyond performance, enriching his interpretation of music with a multidisciplinary perspective that resonates deeply with audiences.



Michael Strasser - Viola

An accomplished violist hailing from Grieskirchen, Austria, Michael Strasser has been a member of the Vienna Philharmonic since 2006. Known for his depth of tone and nuanced interpretations, Strasser has contributed to countless memorable performances with the orchestra. His artistry reflects both the technical precision and emotive power for which the Vienna Philharmonic is renowned.




Peter Somodari – Cello

A former child prodigy, Somodari honed his craft at the Franz Liszt Academy in Budapest and has since become a distinguished soloist and chamber musician. His soulful playing and technical brilliance bring unparalleled depth and beauty to every performance.







LINZ

Day 6: October 3rd 2025

Linz, a city where history, music and innovation converge, offers a unique blend of Austrian tradition and forward-thinking creativity. Once a beloved retreat for Anton Bruckner, whose legacy still resonates through its streets and concert halls, Linz is a place where classical music meets modern artistry. From the grandeur of its historic old town and the majestic Danube waterfront to its thriving contemporary arts scene, the city embodies a spirit of evolution.

Follow the traces of Anton Bruckner in his museum in Linz. The life and work of Anton Bruckner (1824-1896) is the focus of this small museum, which has been designed with great attention to detail. A memorial to the composer from Ansfelden has been in this building since 1972. The renovation and redesign in 2014 then managed to prepare the contents in such a way that the museum is not only a must for Bruckner fans, but also for Bruckner novices.

Highlights in the museum include the conductor's baton, the top hat, and the organ console. Views of the town, theatre, and sheet music complete the picture. Anton Bruckner was born in this very house in 1824 and spent the first eleven years of his life there. The building was also the village school and his father, like his grandfather, was the schoolteacher. As he was also responsible for playing the organ in the church at the time, Anton Bruckner was able to develop a relationship with music and various instruments at an early age. St Florian's Abbey, which is situated on the tomb of the martyr St Florian and whose wall remains can be traced back to the 4th century, is one of the most magnificent monuments of Baroque architecture in Austria.

You will visit the magnificent collegiate church, the library, the marble hall, imperial rooms, and the picture gallery. The great Bruckner organ was for a long time the largest in the Danube monarchy. It has an extraordinary tonal power and a special sweetness of voice. Anton Bruckner, the most important Upper Austrian composer, was a choirboy here and later a monastery organist. Like many other musicians, Bruckner emerged from the Florian Boys' Choir, which is still taught and supervised at the monastery today. The guided tour will be followed by a short organ concert on the Bruckner organ.

In the afternoon you have the possibility to explore Linz.





SALZBURG

Day 7: October 4th 2025

In the midst of majestic alpine peaks and beneath the gentle flow of the Salzach River, Salzburg is a city that feels like a symphony come to life. As the birthplace of **Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart**, it holds an unparalleled significance in the world of classical music. With its cobblestone streets, baroque architecture, and charming squares, Salzburg exudes an air of timeless elegance. From the grandeur of Mirabell Palace to the imposing Hohensalzburg Fortress, every corner of the city tells a story of art, culture, and musical brilliance.

Today, we could set out to explore Salzburg. The journey begins with a scenic drive through the Austrian countryside, passing rolling hills and picturesque villages that inspired the setting of The Sound of Music.

Upon arrival, immerse yourself in Mozart's world with a visit to Mozart's Birthplace, the modest yet historic house where the prodigy spent his early years. Continue to the Mozart Residence, where his family lived, and explore exhibits showcasing his instruments, letters, and personal belongings. Strolling through the Getreidegasse, Salzburg's most famous shopping street, you will feel transported back in time, surrounded by beautifully preserved medieval and baroque buildings.

The city's cultural richness extends beyond Mozart. Visit the stunning Mirabell Palace and Gardens, where the composer once performed, and take in the breathtaking views from the Hohensalzburg Fortress, which has stood as a guardian over the city for centuries. There will be time to enjoy Salzburg's vibrant café culture—perhaps indulging in a slice of the legendary Mozartkugel.

As the day winds down, return to the ship for a truly German farewell evening. Gather in the lounge for an intimate performance by talented brass musicians, celebrating the rich traditions of German & Austrian music. Their melodies, filled with warmth and charm, will provide the perfect soundtrack to a final toast and a farewell cocktail as we reflect on the beauty, music, and memories of this extraordinary journey.


