DR. WALTER MCALHANEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE

The Board of Directors of Wright's House of Hope (WHOH) and I are excited to continue to assist in funding the education of the scholarship award winners over the years through your kindness and generosity! The scholarship was created in 2016 in memory of research biochemist Dr. Walter McAlhaney, the devoted husband of WHOH's Board Chair, Kathleen McAlhaney.

The first winner, Alexis Rodrigues, graduated from USC with a degree in Public Health. At that time the award was \$1000 per year and required the winner to maintain a 3.0 GPA or higher. In 2020 the scholarship was increased to \$2000 annually, and in 2023 the scholarship was increased to \$3000 annually. There have been seven graduates who received full, continuous funding throughout their entire college careers. Some of the degrees awarded to scholarship winners were: Master of Science in Applied Behavioral Analysis, Bachelor's in Science, BS in Biology, and BS in Journalism.

Up until this year the Scholarship team had to choose from an average of five applicants, but this year they had to choose a winner from thirty-one highly competitive applicants! In fact, the essays of the applicants were so impressive, the *Scholarship Team* awarded six, one-time \$500 awards to the following students: Juwel Fabanwo, Joshua Harkness, Jatazjah Holliday, Benjamin Luines, Michael Rosemond and Valerie Sandoval. **CONGRATULATIONS ALL!**

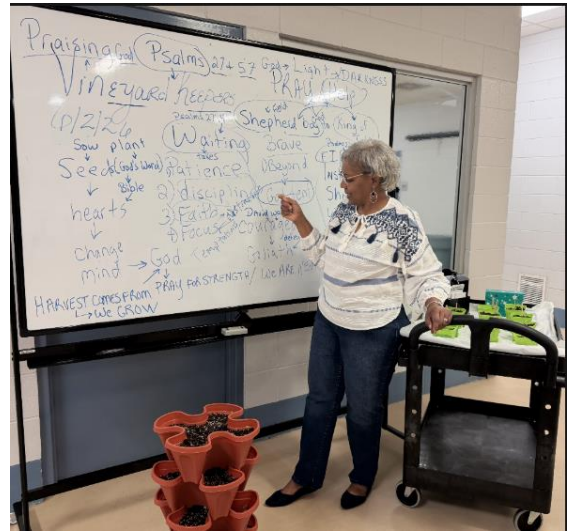

The name of our Spiritual Development group at the Greenville County Youth Services (GCYS) with the young men is called *Vineyard Keepers*. We're so grateful to Nancy Cyphert, Program Director, for her support of WHOH. Twice a month I meet with the young men and share lessons from the Bible with at least two groups. We have an average of nine guys in each session. They are growing and engaging by volunteering to read and answer questions in the lessons. They're also sharing by writing prayer requests.
