Wedding Schedule

Music Starts _____

(Should begin approximately 30 minutes prior to actual start of Ceremony, while guests are arriving)

Ceremony Time _____

(You should allow approximately 30 minutes unless full mass is being performed.)

Cocktails & Photos _____

(45 minutes for pictures. If you want to mingle with your guests, you can cut down on photo time by taking most of your pictures prior to the ceremony.)

Introductions _____

(10 minutes prior to meal being served unless you want to mingle with your guests.)

Meal Begins _____

(Generally 1 hour after the end of the Ceremony)

Toast(s) _____

(Depending on the type of meal, toasts usually happen when the guests have been through the buffet or after salads, if it is a sit down meal. It's always a nice touch to have a parent give a welcome speech or the officiate give a blessing prior to the meal.)

First Dance _____

(Approximately 60-90 minutes from the beginning of the meal. You will have eaten first so you may want to consider taking time to go around to each table and visiting with your guests. It can also be nicely done as you are introduced into the reception or after your cake cutting)

Cake Cutting _____

(Approximately one hour after first dance or directly following the meal. It can also be nicely done immediately following your special dances, such as father/daughter dance.

Last Dance _____

(Should be 5 - 10 minutes before the end of the evening)



DJ Performance

Performance Attire-

Tuxedo / Formal Attire

Music Selection-

DJ has complete control of music. DJ should read the crowd & take requests.

Mostly play music selected, take some requests and read the crowd.

Only play the music selected. No Request

On the Microphone-

Conservative, make the announcements when necessary.

Adapt to crowd. DJ should moderately interact with guests.

Encourage. DJ should interact with guests and encourage participation.

Perform. DJ should be vocal. Get guest participation. Utilize special events or dances.

Coordinating Reception Events-

DJ has control of events. DJ should work with the schedule given and make announcements at appropriate times.

We have a coordinator. DJ should make announcements when told to do so.
