2 - PMH OPEN-WHEEL LADDER

Parella Motorsports Holdings Open-Wheel Ladder

Since becoming involved in Formula Regional Americas Championship (FR Americas) and Formula 4 United States Championship (F4 U.S.) in 2021, Parella Motorsports Holdings (PMH) has continued to look for new ways to attract and funnel talent up the open-wheel ladder.

Whether by establishing new race series, like the Ligier Junior Formula Championship (Ligier JFC), or forming strategic partnerships that lead to scholarship opportunities and driver development programs, PMH constantly looks for new ways to enable racing dreams.



2 - PMH OPEN-WHEEL LADDER

Ligier Junior Formula Championship

The Ligier Junior Formula Championship (Ligier JFC) launched in 2024, providing a new home for the widely-available first-generation Ligier JS F416 chassis. Debuting a new name and logo for the 2025 season, Ligier JFC continues to offer up-and-coming racers with an opportunity to develop their skills and learn the basics while competing on the most cost-efficient ladder system with the lowest cost per mile in North America.

Sanctioned by PMH and available to drivers ages 14 and up, the championship focuses on education as much as it does competition to prepare drivers to climb the ranks through F4 U.S. and FR Americas.



2 - PMH OPEN-WHEEL LADDER

F4 U.S. & FR Americas

Launched in 2014, FIA Formula 4 was created to offer young, aspiring racers the opportunity to take the first step from karting into the world of single-seater racing. Designed to be a globally-recognized, yet affordable entry point to the world of single-seater racing, FIA F4 allows drivers to compare themselves to the best young talent, not only in their own country, but across other F4 Championships around the world.

In 2017, FIA launched the Formula Regional Championships. With several championships available in different regions around the world, Formula Regional offers racers another step to further their careers after FIA F4.

In the United States, the FIA and SCCA Pro Racing joined forces to launch F4 U.S. in 2016, and FR Americas in 2018. Both Championships have continued to grow thanks to support of Parella Motorsports Holdings and key series partners. With driver training, unmatched affordability and strong manufacturer support, competitors continue to grow their skills and prepare for higher level of motorsports—as proven by several alumni who have reached the pinnacle of the sport. FR Americas and F4 U.S. have proven to be one of the best ways for aspiring drivers to begin their professional careers and gain experience on an international platform.

4 - DRIVER DEVELOPMENT AND SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Driver Development

Drivers travel from around the globe to race in the world-class FR Americas, F4 U.S., and Ligier JFC.

Participants lean on series officials to accelerate their learning curve and professional development. With accomplished racers serving as championship leaders—such as Race Director and five-time INDYCAR winner Scott Goodyear—there's no shortage of knowledge to be shared.

All three championships incorporate additional development and learning opportunities, covering topics like social media and public relations, sponsorship acquisition, FIA rules and regulations, and more. Our goal is to draw from the years of experience in the SpeedTour paddock to help drivers grow and progress in their careers.



Scholarship Opportunities

Radford Racing School's F4 "Karts to Cars" Scholarship School

Through a partnership with Radford Racing School, up to six talented karters have the opportunity to get behind the wheel of a spec Ligier JFC racecar for a multi-day intensive training program to assist them in the transition from karts to single-seater cars. With a variety of training drills and on-track sessions, the program is uniquely designed to account for the fact that participants are some of the top karters in the world.

The "Karts to Cars" school has already proven successful with Patrick Woods-Toth, a member of the inaugural class in 2022, winning the championship in F4 U.S. in 2023, and FR Americas in 2024.



PMH Powering Diversity Scholarship

The PMH Powering Diversity Scholarship looks to empower drivers from a variety of backgrounds to participate in PMH-owned race series. In addition to providing recipients with benefits such as free entry fees or test days, the program aligns recipients with a team of executives and mentors to assist them in their career development with educational opportunities and training, as well as increasing their exposure through media and fan engagement events. Entering its fifth year in 2025, the PMH Powering Diversity Scholarship has assisted nearly 30 drivers in their racing careers.

Making Connections That Matter

Kiwi Motorsports Aligns with Chip Ganassi Racing

With established teams that compete at the top level of motorsport, our drivers are exposed to relationships and connections that can make a big impact in their racing career.

As organizations like Chip Ganassi Racing (CGR) form alliances to feed talent to their top-tier INDYCAR program, they look to proven feeder-series teams, like Kiwi Motorsport.

Through the partnership, drivers not only have the eyes and attention of the one the most successful teams in the INDYCAR Series, but they also have access to countless CGR programs, including physical, mental and media training, technical education, simulator training, business development and more.


Notable Graduates

Participants in FR Americas and F4 U.S. have consistently advanced in their motorsport careers, with graduates among the starting grids of INDYCAR, FIA Formula 3, Super Formula, IMSA, INDY NXT (Indy Lights), NASCAR and more.

In INDY NXT, alumni have been responsible for three of the last four championships, as well as 67% of all pole positions and race wins over the last four seasons.

Kyle Kirkwood and David Malukas were the first graduates to reach the INDYCAR grid, with Kirkwood the first to win a race and earn a pole.

In 2024, six graduates made INDYCAR starts accounting for two poles, 178 laps led, seven top-five finishes, 21 top 10s and the Rookie of the Year title, won by Linus Lundqvist.



6-CHAMPIONSHIP PARTNER OVERVIEW

Organizer Overview

The Sports Car Club of America (SCCA) partnered with the Federation Internationale de l'Automobile (FIA) to launch F4 U.S. in 2016 and FR Americas in 2018, bringing the Road to F1 to the United States. As the international governing body for motorsport, including F1, the FIA is a global organization that aims to safeguard the rights and promote the interests of motorists and motorsports around the world.

Parella Motorsports Holdings (PMH) is a premier motorsport holding company that includes wholly-owned Sportscar Vintage Racing Association (SVRA), Trans Am Race Company, International GT (IGT) and Prototype Sprint Series Association (PSSA). In addition, PMH owns the commercial and operating rights to F4 U.S. and FR Americas, allowing it to operate both championships, and after licensing the SCCA Pro Racing name, it also offers sanctioning and operational services to privately-owned racing series, including the FIA-certified FR Americas and F4 U.S. In addition, PMH owns, operates and sanctions the Ligier Junior Formula Championship.

PMH hosts motorsports festivals at some of the most prestigious race tracks across America under the brand name SpeedTour. Incorporating a diverse range of cars from all of PMH's properties, SpeedTour events feature a family-friendly atmosphere with everything from sim racing to car shows to open paddocks, which give fans unmatched access to cars and drivers.



6-CHAMPIONSHIP PARTNER OVERVIEW

Key Partner Overview



Ligier Automotive is a racecar manufacturer with roots dating back to 1969, including a rich history with 20 years as an F1 constructor, highlighted by nine Grand Prix victories, and many successes in topflight sportscar racing. Headquartered in France with a significant presence in North America, Ligier Automotive specializes in the development and support of racing cars for use in series throughout the world. Ligier Automotive chassis are developed to reach the highest levels of performance, safety and reliability standards put forth by the FIA. The JS F3 is raced in FR Americas, while the JS F422 is used in F4 U.S., and the original first-generation JS F416 chassis has a home in the Ligier JFC. All have been meticulously developed to uphold safety, while the JS F3 and JS F422 meet all the latest innovation requirements for the FIA-certified championships.

Hankook Tire America Corp. is a growing leader in the U.S. tire market, leveraging investments in technology, manufacturing and marketing to deliver high-quality, reliable products that are safer for consumers and the environment. The tires used in FR Americas, F4 U.S. and Ligier JFC are specifically designed for the driver development championships.

Mountune USA joined the PMH family in 2024 with the MK20J and MK20R power plants, developed and engineered by Mountune, and based on the championships' original Honda K20C1. Serving as the official engine partner for FR Americas and Ligier JFC, the championships benefit from Mountune's reputation of high-performance, race-winning engines. Backed by a team of experienced engineers and engine builders, Mountune provides teams with the required replacement parts and engine service items, while enhancing engine reliability and providing world-class customer service.

Television & Broadcast Partners

PMH has partnered with LiveRaceMedia to film, produce and stream all SpeedTour events in 2025. With the agreement, every FR Americas, F4 U.S. and Ligier JFC race will stream live on the SpeedTour TV YouTube page this season.

Also new this year, PMH debuted a partnership with SPEED SPORT, one of the most-trusted brands in motorsports, to bring live coverage of SpeedTour events to SPEED SPORT 1 (SS1). Launched in 2023, SS1 is a FAST Channel—a free, ad-supported streaming television network. Available on mainstream platforms with a reach exceeding 200 million monthly active users, anyone with an internet-connected device can watch SPEED SPORT 1 content for free through Amazon Prime, Roku Channel, PlutoTV, SlingTV and more.

With all races from FR Americas, F4 U.S. and Ligier JFC available either live or via a tape-delayed broadcast, SPEED SPORT will provide crucial marketing and editorial support through SS1, as well as its cornerstone motorsports news website, SPEEDSPORT.com and its wildly-popular daily racing newsletter, "The Daily."



Championship Event & Year-End Awards

Prize money is awarded to the top-three finishers in each individual round, with contingency prizes, such as the Omologato Perfectly-Timed Move of The Race, available each weekend.

At the Year-End Awards Celebration, scholarships, prize money and contingency awards are distributed as the top drivers from each championship are recognized with special awards.

Honoring both teams and drivers with awards for the champions, vice champions and third-place champions, others, such as the most-improved driver, the driver who picked up the most positions throughout the season, the top rookie and/or Master's Champion (top finishing FR Americas driver over the age of 35), are also recognized throughout the evening.

In total, drivers participating in FR Americas, F4 U.S. and Ligier JFC are eligible for over \$634,700 in awards, scholarships and prizes.




