

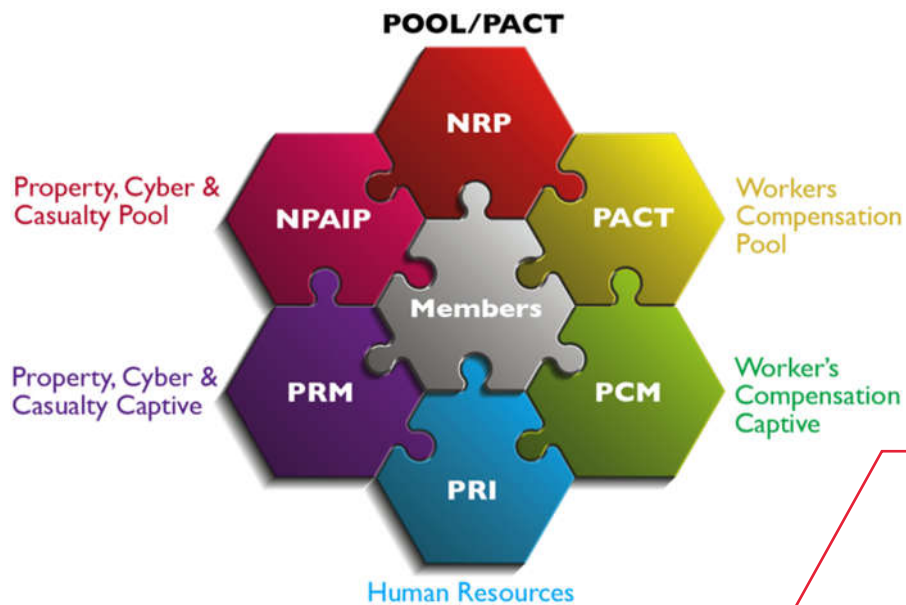
## POOL PACT – HERE FOR YOU
