
But, It is only Through your support that we are able to keep our doors open and buy food and provide care and medical help.

This is Cora, she is a 4 year old rat terrier/chihuahua mix, we are looking to find her a good home. Unfortunately, Cora suffers from a condition called Intervertebral Disc Disease that causes her to be paralyzed from her lower back down. She cannot walk, does not have control of her bowels or bladder and she will not recover, the paralysis is permanent. She doesn't act like she's paralyzed, she still wants to play and is actually very fast. Despite our best attempts to protect her, she has developed two wounds on her feet from dragging them, one on each foot, each about the size of a quarter. I have tried to keep them clean and dry but she keeps trying to play and inevitably reopens them. My husband and I can no longer care for her. We are looking for someone who can take the time to care for her properly. She gets along well with other dogs and cats, very rarely barks. She loves to cuddle and give kisses. She would make an excellent lap companion. We have 6 washable/reusable diapers and 2 special made bags to drag herself around in. She is fixed and is microchipped. If we cannot find anyone to take her into their loving home, we will have to unfortunately put her down. Please feel free to share with anyone could help.

To meet Cora is to fall in love! She has the most precious face with a big heart right in the middle of her forehead, and big ears too that she would be teased about later (but not too much teasing).

Cory was lucky! Her life was going to change forever... She was confused and scared as the wraps were taken of her bloody hind feet. She desperately wanted someone to cling to as she was reassured over and over again that she was loved and very much wanted.

She doesn't see herself as handicapped (she never did), and she is bonded with Annie, our other little special girl. They sleep right next to each other and love chasing toys and kitties. 

Thank you so very much..... to Social Compassion in Legislation for writing and passing a new California state law (AB 485) that bans the retail sale of cats, dogs, and rabbits unless they come from a shelter or a rescue group.

This new law will stop the sales of puppies from so called puppy mills which are often sick, inbred, and have other health and socialization issues. It will go into effect in January of 2019 and will make the adoption of shelter dogs and cats and rescue dogs and cats much more likely and will work towards bringing an end to the cruelty suffered by animals at notorious puppy mills and factory farms by closing the market, while also helping animal shelters with issues such as overcrowding by providing more space and increasing adoption opportunities.

This is a great new law!



For many, many years Penny has lived in a pasture next door.

She is well over 30+ years old, and has now lost most of her teeth. She was once a beautiful horse (still is), but time, old age, and her willingness to work have taken their toll on her. Her coat is now rough and scarred, and her beautiful eyes are well sunken in her head (but they still twinkle). She is very thin,

and her tail bone and ribs stick out. She can no longer chew hay or eat pasture grass (but she tries), and now survives on equine senior pellets. She loves and begs for them !



More than anything she loves and trusts people and never misses a chance to come for visits and food. She is frail but takes good care of herself. The one thing she didn't have was a shelter or shade of any kind. So this summer we bought her a big beach umbrella at Walmart and put it up on our fence line. She loved it. We talked to her owner and put up a gate between our two pastures. She now comes over to our barn for extra food and has a shelter of her own to get out of the rain and blazing summer sun. She has a fly mask and a warm winter blanket if she needs it! And... she is still free to run out of her beloved pasture and go visiting. Her umbrella is still up and she can still chase cars up and down the lane between our pastures hoping for a treat. Sometimes, the littlest kindness means so much to those who have nothing!
