In September of this year, a front page story in the San Francisco Chronicle told about a female humpback whale who had become entangled in a spider web of crab traps and lines.

She was weighted down by hundreds of pounds of traps that caused her to struggle to stay afloat. She also had hundreds of yards of line rope wrapped around her body, her tail, her torso and a line tugging in her mouth.

A fisherman spotted her just east of the Golden Gate Bridge and radioed an environmental group for help.

Within a few hours, the rescue team arrived and determined that she was so bad off, the only way to save her was to dive in and untangle her.

They worked for hours with curved knives and eventually freed her. When she was free, the divers say she swam in what seemed like joyous circles. She then came back to each and every diver, one at a time, and nudged them, pushed them gently around as if she was thanking them.

Some said it was the most incredibly beautiful experience of their lives.

The diver who cut the rope out of her mouth said her eyes were following him the whole time, and he will never be the same. Thank you! Social Compassion in Legislation SB 1249 was passed into law

SB 1249 will make it unlawful for cosmetic manufacturers to sell any cosmetic in California if the final product or any component of the product was tested on animals after January 1, 2020, with some exceptions for regulatory requirements.

Introduced to the legislature in February of 2018, SB 1249 was endorsed by over 100 cosmetics companies, including John Paul Mitchell Systems and Lush Cosmetics. Tens of thousands of individuals wrote letters and made phone calls to their legislators.






Do you have an old recliner that needs to be replaced? Your donation of that unwanted recliner to a shelter could bring so much comfort and happiness to a dog waiting for its new furever home! Some have even bought and donated chairs from thrift stores. The dogs love them so much!

Veggie Meatless Balls!

Mix together well:

1 pound of mashed silken tofu (other tofu styles may be substituted, but will change the texture)

1/3 cup of flour

1/3 cup of rolled oats

1/3 cup of bread crumbs

1 tablespoon of peanut butter

1 tablespoon of soy sauce

1 tablespoon of mustard

Dried parsley flakes, onion

flakes, & Italian seasoning to taste. (Fresh parsley and a small onion, chopped fine, may be substituted.) Roll into 1.25" balls and roll the balls in flour. Bake at 350° until browned. Serve with spaghetti & spaghetti sauce, make into a sandwich, or eat in any other way in place of traditional meatballs. Serves 6+



A warning about the Xmas treats many stores are now starting to stock for dogs.



The chews are made from cattle or horse hides that have been soaked in a toxic sodium sulphide to remove the hair and fat. Then more chemicals are used in order to split the hide

into layers which is then washed with hydrogen peroxide to give the white "pure" look and remove the rancid smell. On testing, the festive colors that are added on these chews have shown traces of arsenic, mercury, chromium and formaldehyde. They regularly cause intestinal blockages, poisoning from chemical residue and choking. The chews get slippery when wet and are nearly impossible to get ahold of to save a choking dog.

Leave them in the shop where they belong. If you get some as a gift, throw them away!

Please be safe with your dogs!
