The Consent Agenda includes [13] a resolution to ratify an ordinance adopted by Templeton Community Services District (TCSD) which adopts and amends the 2019 California Fire Code, and [20] request to approve letters reserving \$1,008,379 in Federal Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funds and \$171,755 in County inclusionary housing in-lieu fee funds for two affordable housing projects in Districts 1 and 4 (Templeton Place II and Nipomo Affordable Senior Housing).

After [30] Public Comment, Board Business includes [31] FY 2020-21 County and State Budget update, [32] a resolution authorizing the Chairman or designee to sign [the San Luis Obispo Countywide Regional Compact...](#)

From the Staff Report: “The proposed San Luis Obispo Countywide Regional Compact (Exhibit A to Attachment 1) is an aspirational document. It sets the tone and goals for future recommended plans and actions among the local agencies. It establishes a united regional framework to unlock the potential to develop an adequate supply of housing and resilient infrastructure that support our economic prosperity. It recognizes that people, water, transportation, connectivity, and housing form the foundation of the San Luis Obispo County region’s healthy, livable communities and thriving economic opportunity.”

... and finally, under Board Business, [33] submittal of the Infrastructure and Facilities Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan.

The Closed Session agenda includes the usual Anticipated Litigation, Conference with Legal Counsel on Pending Litigation, and Conference with Labor Negotiator. For more information, please see the agenda link above.

In the afternoon, Board Business includes [36] a request to approve a project in the amount of \$6,100,144 to replace and upgrade the County’s aging public safety communications system. And the Board will hear [38] an appeal regarding the Planning Commission’s denial of a proposed cannabis operation just southeast of the City of San Luis Obispo.

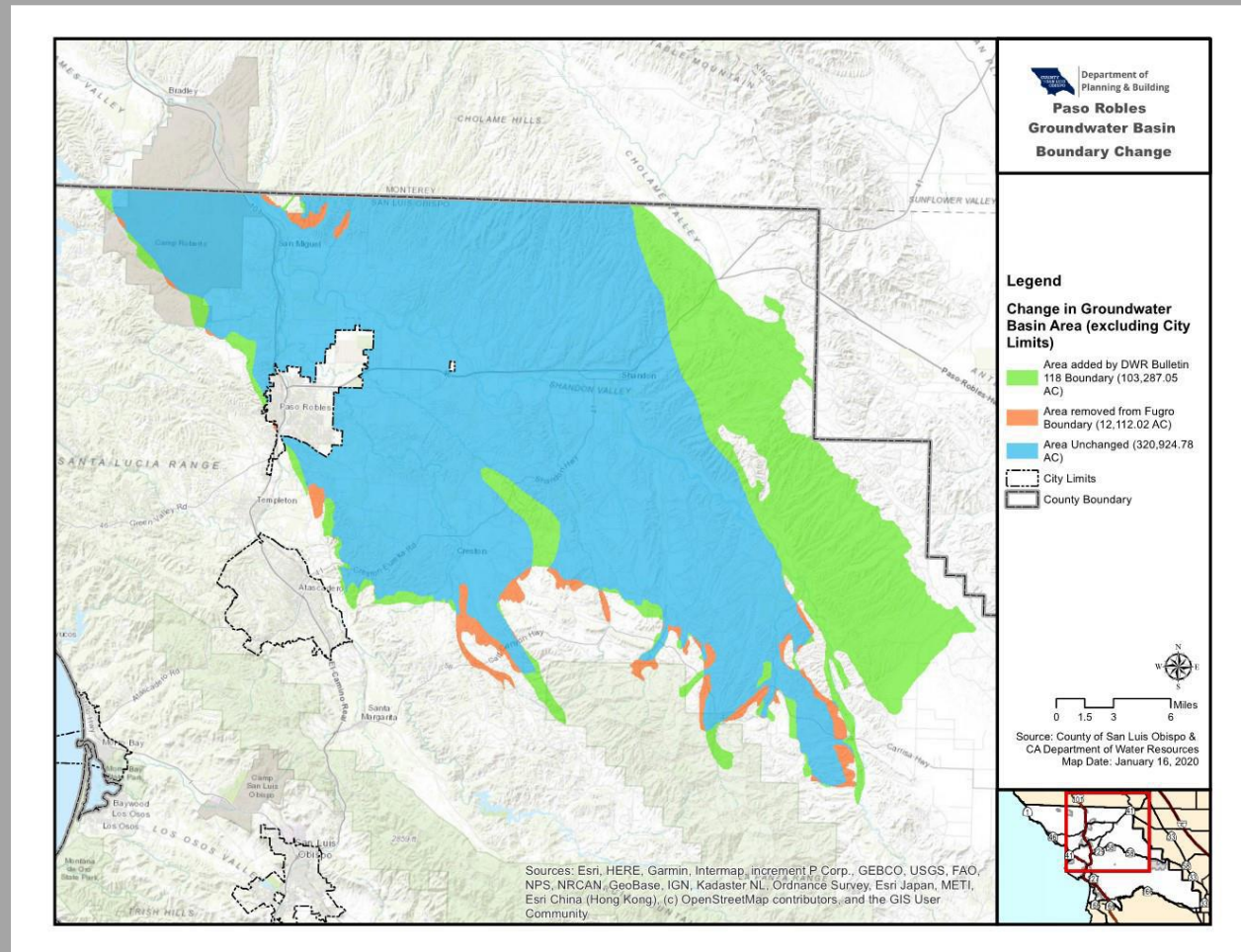

A hearing [5] to consider a request from the County of San Luis Obispo to update the maps of the Paso Robles Groundwater Basin boundary and area of severe decline to be consistent with the Paso Robles Sub-basin Groundwater Sustainability Plan and to incorporate a following option into the Agricultural Offset Program.

“The staff report recommends that the boundary of the area subject to the Paso Basin water moratorium and its sub-component regulations be brought into conformance with State

designated Paso Basin boundaries. This action is necessary to conform the boundaries of the area recognized by the State and the Paso Basin Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP).



With this update, 945 properties (524 owners) that are not currently considered to be in the Paso Basin would now be within the basin. 301 properties (244 owners) that are currently considered to be in the Paso Basin would be removed. Overall, the changes would be a 27% increase in area, 8% increase in affected properties, and 5% increase in affected property owners.

It is not clear from the write-up if the staff discussed the impacts with the ranchers and farmers within the 100,000+ acre area to be added and subjected to the existing and impending regulations, not to mention the SGMA Groundwater Sustainability Plan itself.” From the COLAB Weekly Update for the week of February 23-29

The agenda also includes hearings regarding a proposed wireless communications facility at 3939 El Pomar Drive about 5 miles east of the town of Templeton, a multi-phased cannabis project near Nipomo, and an events request for a barn located near San Luis Obispo.
