The Consent Agenda appears to contain mainly first of the year housekeeping items that include [16] a sublease between SLO County and Santa Barbara County for a communications facility at San Antonio Peak in SB County that requires a 4/5 vote, [17] County Fire has a request to declare 17 surplus vehicles from the County fleet for auction, sale or salvage, [19] a request from County Health to purchase two hand-held blood analyzers for real-time, lab-quality results within minutes to accelerate the decision making process in patient care, [21-23] two memorandums of understanding and a resolution with bargaining units, [25] a request by the applicant and land owner to rescind a permit for an indoor cannabis cultivation operation located at 7755 Airport Road in the North County, and [27] the beginning of the process to build a new County Probation Building.

Under Hearings, the board will consider [35] the renewal of the San Luis Obispo County Tourism and Marketing District and levy the relevant assessments and [37] an amendment to County Code pertaining to flood hazard permits and processing requirements.

Closed Session contains a number of items regarding pending litigation and labor negotiations.

In the afternoon, the Board will hold a Public Meeting [39] to consider an Ordinance amending County Code to <u>expand prohibition of smoking to all public areas</u> within the unincorporated areas with allowable exceptions. [40] The Public Meeting continues with the consideration of an Ordinance amending County Code to <u>prohibit the sale of electronic smoking devices</u>. And the final item [41] is the submittal of a resolution <u>extending the limited abeyance of enforcement policy for existing cooperative or collective cannabis cultivation operations</u>.

The meeting starts early with a tour of the newly refurbished B-Wing at Templeton High School and then will be held in room B-11.

The agenda includes a solar presentation by Mr. Diodati and his Engineering students who will present a slide show about a solar installation project the students participated in with Grid Alternatives. Interim Superintendent Aaron Asplund will provide a report to the Trustees on the results of the January 6th Professional Development Day.

Under "Instruction", those in attendance will hear school site reports for both Vineyard Elementary School and Templeton Middle School. And under "Business", the Board will hear information on the Governor's budget proposals for 2020/21 as it relates to the school district budget along with a Board discussion on reductions for the 2020/21 school year.

According to the staff report for the budget reduction, "As was outlined in the 1st Interim Budget Report at the December 2019 board meeting, projections for the 2020/21 and 2021/22 school years indicate structural budget deficits of approximately \$400,000 and \$500,000 respectively. This level of deficit spending, absent unexpected budget improvements, is not sustainable."

The agenda doesn't state what seats are up for election in March, the length of tenure for each seat, or what seats and length of tenure the board appointees will fill.

The agenda also includes [8.6] a discussion of the DRAFT Cal Poly EIR without providing any further information on the item or why TAAG is reviewing it. A discussion [8.7] regarding "how TAAG will respond to" the Paso Robles Gateway Annexation Project – noting that the EIR won't

be available until later this month and that a presentation on the project will most likely be given at the TAAG meeting after the EIR is released.

The agenda also states that all project application were either incomplete or on an information hold with the County and for that reason, there were no project applications to be reviewed at this meeting.
