Superintendent search has narrowed to two finalists

Public will have an opportunity to meet them prior to final board decision

The Templeton school board met in special closed session on Thursday, March 5th and Friday, March 6th to interview candidates for the position of Templeton Unified School District (TUSD)

Superintendent. The search has now narrowed down to two finalists for the position, and the school board will be holding a “meet and great” Public Forum on Monday, March 16 for the public to meet the two candidates prior to making a final

decision. The two finalists are Aaron Asplund and Lisa Gilbert.

The Forum will be held in the Eagle Conference & Training Center (off Old County Road next to the School District Office) from 5:30 to 7:30 pm. The public will meet with one of the finalists from 5:30 to 6:30 and the second from 6:30 to 7:30.
