HAPPY NEW YEAR







This site was created to support all those who need access to the lesson texts of the Episcopal (TEC) Eucharistic Lectionary.

The year which ended at the beginning of Advent 2019 was Year C. Beginning with the first Sunday of Advent in 2019, we will be in Year A.

The Bible translation used is The New Revised Standard Version, copyright 1989 by the Division of Christian Education of the National Council of the Churches of Christ in the USA, and used by permission. The readings have been emended to provide context and clarity for public reading in conformance with the rubrics of the Book of Common Prayer.

The collects and the Psalms are from the Book of Common Prayer. The collects use the contemporary wording.

The liturgical color appropriate for the day is indicated, when the color is green, red or purple, by the color of the numeral against a light grey background. When the liturgical color is white, the numeral is black against a white background.

On weekdays, other than major Holy Days, the color indicated is the color appropriate to the season. When celebrating the feast of a martyred saint, scarlet is also appropriate.







Easy Homemade Fudge (3 Ingredients)

I love chocolate and I love fudge. My mom has an excellent classic fudge recipe that she made all the time during the holidays. But what if you don't have a lot of time but still want to make a great fudge? That is where this easy homemade fudge recipe comes in. And it only requires 3 ingredients. Pretty cool right?

11x9 or 9x9 pan (depending on how thick you want your fudge)

Ingredients

1 can sweetened condensed milk 14 oz

1/4 cup unsalted butter

2 1/4 cups of chocolate milk chocolate, dark, semi-sweet, or a combination of them

Optional Ingredients

1 tsp vanilla extract

1/2 to 1 cup chopped walnuts

Instructions

First let's combine our sweetened condensed milk and our butter in a large microwave safe bowl. Then let's heat it up in the microwave for 2 to 3 minutes until the butter has melted and the mixture is hot, I usually give it a good stir at the 1 minute mark.

Now let's add our chocolate. This recipe is awesome you can use all semi-sweet chocolate chips if you like, or all milk chocolate, or all dark chocolate, or a combination of all of them, as long as you have around 400 grams total. Place the chocolate in the hot condensed milk and butter mixture, and push it down a little bit with a spoon, then just let it sit for 3 to 4 minutes in the hot liquid.

Next after the chocolate has bathed in the sweetened milk, take a spatula or spoon and start to mix, the chocolate should combine very easy with the liquid. Once all melted and combined, the mixture will resemble a frosting or brownie batter.

Now let's take a 8x11 or 9x9 pan and add some parchment paper to it, I like to spray the bottom of the pan first with kitchen spray, this just helps the parchment paper stick to it. Next pour your chocolate mixture into the pan and smooth it out with your spatula. Then all you need to do is put it in the fridge for 2 to 3 hours until it sets up completely. Simple as that!

Now take the large piece of fudge out of the pan and cut it up however you like. This dessert is fairly rich, so I generally cut mine up into small squares. You can store it back in your same pan and just cover it with plastic wrap, or put it in Tupperware, or create little gift bundles and give it away. :) Enjoy!



NOTE: Try mint chocolate chips, peanut butter chips, butterscotch chips, or any combination of chips that sound good to you.



Epiphany e-piph-a-ny



noun: Epiphany; noun: epiphany; plural noun: epiphanies

A season of four to nine weeks, from the Feast of the Epiphany (Jan. 6) through the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday. The length of the season varies according to the date of Easter. The gospel stories of this season describe various events that manifest the divinity of Jesus. The coming of the Magi is celebrated on the Epiphany. The Baptism of our Lord is observed on the Sunday after Epiphany. The gospels for the other Sundays of the Epiphany season describe the wedding at Cana, the calling of the disciples, and various miracles and teachings of Jesus. The Last Sunday after the Epiphany is always devoted to the Transfiguration. Jesus' identity as the Son of God is dramatically revealed in the Transfiguration gospel, as well as the gospel of the baptism of Christ. We are called to respond to Christ in faith through the showings of his divinity recorded in the gospels of the Epiphany season.

The Epiphany

The manifestation of Christ to the peoples of the earth. The winter solstice was kept on Jan. 6 at some places during the first centuries of the Christian Era. In opposition to pagan festivals, Christians chose this day to celebrate the various manifestations, or "epiphanies," of Jesus' divinity. These showings of his divinity included his birth, the coming of the Magi, his baptism, and the Wedding at Cana where he miraculously changed water into wine. The day was called "The Feast of Lights." Celebration of the Son of God replaced celebration of the sun. Baptisms were done, and a season of preparation was instituted. It was later called Advent.

The solstice was kept on Dec. 25 by the fourth century. Jesus' birth was celebrated on this day in both eastern and western churches. The western church commemorated the coming of the Magi on Jan. 6. The eastern church continued to celebrate the Baptism of our Lord and the Wedding at Cana on Jan. 6. In the east the day was called "Theophany" (manifestation of God).

The coming of the Magi is celebrated on the Feast of the Epiphany, Jan. 6, in the BCP. The Baptism of our Lord is celebrated on the First Sunday after the Epiphany.

From one Kitchen to Another

Ingredients

for 6 servings

6 bone-in, skin-on chicken thighs

salt, to taste

pepper, to taste

- 1 tablespoon unsalted butter
- 3 cloves garlic
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- 1/4 cup honey
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 lb green beans



Preparation

Preheat oven to 400°F (200°C)

Season chicken thighs with salt and pepper.

Melt 1 tablespoon butter in a large ovenproof skillet over medium heat. Add chicken, skinside down, and sear both sides until golden brown. (The skin side will take much longer, in order to properly render the fat and crisp up the skin.)

Remove chicken thighs and set aside. Pour out any excess fat, but leave some in for the sauce. Add garlic, stir until fragrant, then add brown sugar, honey, thyme, and oregano, and stir. Reduce heat to low.

Return chicken to the skillet. Coat the chicken in the sauce. Add green beans to skillet.

Bake for 25 minutes or until chicken is cooked through. Enjoy!

Note: If baking in a 92

If baking in a 9x13 pan, I make 15 rolls.

If baking in a 10x15 pan, I make 18 rolls.



Instructions

Preheat oven to 400 degrees.

In a large bowl, combine 1 cup water, oil, sugar, and yeast. Let sit until yeast is bubbly (about 8 minutes). Stir in beaten egg softened butter and salt.

With a stand mixer or by hand, add flour, one cup at a time until you have a soft dough that isn't sticky. Knead by hand 10 minutes or 5 minutes with a stand mixer.

Divide dough into 18 even pieces, and form into balls. Place in a greased pan and cover with parchment paper and a kitchen towel.

Let rise 10 minutes in a warm place. (You can allow them to rise up to an additional 30 minutes if time allows).

Lightly brush with milk and bake on the middle rack for 10-12 minutes or just until browned.

1 cup warm tap water

1/3 cup oil

1/4 cup sugar

2 tablespoons yeast

1/2 teaspoon salt




