FRIDAY TRIP CHANGE:

The NAFCAree Committee has just been advised that the Eisenhower National Historic Site will not be open in 2021. Therefore, we have changed the itinerary and lowered the price for the Friday July 23rd trip.

The new trip will be as follows;

WWII Guided Tour / Lunch at Hickory Bridge / Adams County Winery

This tour will start with a fascinating 2-hour tour of a a rarely-explored aspect of Gettysburg's rich military history. Learn about the people and places that played a part in the Allied victory in World War II. Visit the site of a prisoner-of-war camp and learn why an intelligence camp was located

here, training specialized troops for psychological warfare. You will hear stories of the Navy's secret site where maps wer e drawn for an invasion of Japan, and see the many famous

battlefield monuments that were nearly lost to a scrap drive

created to fuel the war effort. Experience the moving stories of WWII veterans buried in the Gettysburg National Cemetery. From Pearl Harbor to the Battle of the Bulge to Guadalcanal, these war-time casualties encompass all theaters of the war and all military branches. World War II in Gettysburg also tells the inspiring stories of key wartime leaders who came to Gettysburg, including President Franklin D. Roosevelt and Prime Minister Winston Churchill. And lea rn about General (and later President) Dwight D. Eisenhower's decades-long history in Gettysburg, starting in 1918.

After the WW II Tour, we will stop for lunch at Hickory Bridge Farm and Restaurant which dates back into history as far as the late 1600s when the King of England granted the land to Charles Carroll the father of the signer of the Declaration of Independence. Here, we will enjoy a full family style meal for lunch. The menu may include, a house salad with a warm sweet and sour dressing, warm baked bread with apple butter,

two or three entrees passed family style complimented with several vegetables, corn fritters, stewed apples and a choice of homemade dessert.

After an abundant meal, you are welcome to visit the farm museum, old time country store or the bed and breakfast at no additional cost (Please no hanky-panky in any of the guest rooms!).

Lastly, to cap off a great meal (and a very busy week), we will stop at the Adams County Winery. The winery offers an inviting, comfortable, and casual atmosphere where anyone can relax and taste wine. Enjoy the beautiful gardens,

Pet- friendly grounds, and the historic tasting room built in an 1860's era bank barn.

Whether you are a wine connoisseur or a complete newcomer, you are invited to visit, make yourself at home, and let the knowledgeable staff guide your experience here at the winery. Note: The cost of any beverages / refreshments at the winery are NOT included in the cost of the trip.

Trip pricing; \$57.00 per Adult, \$45.00 per Child. This is a reduction in price from the original Friday trip. All Members tha t have signed up for the Friday trip will be given the option of ca ncelling their Friday trip or going on this revised trip and receive a refund of the difference in price.

FINE PRINT: Although we expect that all trips will be provided as described, they are tentative and subject to change. In addition, the committee reserves the right to cancel or modify any trip if minimum participation is not met or availability changes. If a trip reaches maximum capacity, you will be placed on a waiting list for that trip and openings will be filled from the top of the list. Final payment for trips is due by **May 1st!**

Camping Reservations: The cost for a full hook up site (water, el ectric, sewer and cable TV) for the week will be \$575.00. Extra Family in a rig will be \$100 and extra adults will be \$50 each. A \$100 minimum deposit was due February 1st. Final payment is due by May 1, 2021. After that, the remaining sites will be turned back to the campground.

Cabins: There are several types of cabins available that range in price from \$ 778.60 to \$1,593.42 for the week. You will need to make your own reservations for a cabin by calling Kelsey Nelson at 844-289-6234. Some of these cabins will be near the rest of the group and some will not be. For reference, the cabins nearest our group are on Picke t's Thicket road. Please mention that you are with NAFCA when making the reservation to receive the discount. If you will be renting a cabin, you will still need to fill out a reservation for m and pay the \$50 Admin fee to cover NAFCAree costs (the same that everyone else is paying in their camping fee). Job Well Done Roberta Chermely!

NAFCA's General Liability Insurance Policy renews every April. I changed agents last year and saved \$1,000 over the previous year's premium of \$5,000. Roberta Chermely thought we could do even better and she did something about it. At a NAFCA meeting last Fall she mentioned she could help, so last month I asked her to give it a try.

Roberta is an Account Manager, and a certified insurance agent. She knew of insurance carriers that have experience with non-profit companies. So we worked together on a back-and-forth barrage of questions by the insurance underwriters, and faced a major hurdle due to high demands of our NAFCAree campground. In the end we were able to work with the Campground and the underwriter to come to an agreement. When the dust settled. Roberta's and my efforts were rewarded when NAFCA's premium dropped to under \$3,000. A reduction of well over \$1,000 from last year, and over \$2,000 from the year before.

At a time when NAFCA is fighting for every dollar, Roberta brokered us a great deal. Well done Roberta. NAFCA thanks you.
