The fine print; Although we expect that all trips will be provided as described, they are tentative and subject to change. In addition, the committee reserves the right to cancel or modify any trip if minimum participation is not met or availability changes. Camping Reservations: The cost for a full hook up site (water, electric, sewer and cable TV) for the week will be \$575.00. Extra Family in a rig will be \$100 and extra adults will be \$50 each. A \$100 minimum deposit was due February 1st. Final payment is due by May 1, 2021. After that, the remaining sites will be turned back to the campground.

Cabins: There are several types of cabins available that range in price from \$ 778.60 to \$1,593.42 for the week. You will need to make your own reservations for a cabin by calling Kelsey Nelson at 844-289-6234. Some of these cabins will be near the rest of the group and some will not be. For reference, the cabins nearest our group are on Picket's Thicket road. Please mention that you are with NAFCA when making the reservation to receive the discount. If you will be renting a cabin, you will still need to fill out a reservation form and pay the \$50 Admin fee to cover NAFCAree costs (the same that everyone else is paying in their camping fee).

FINE PRINT: Although we expect that all trips will be provided as described, they are tentative and subject to change. In addition, the committee reserves the right

to cancel or modify any trip if minimum participation is not met or availability changes.

If a trip reaches maximum capacity, you will be placed on a waiting list for that trip and

openings will be filled from the top of the list. Final payment for trips is due by **May 1**, **2021.** Please reserve your spots soon!

1 (8 0z) package refrigerated crescent rolls
1 lb ground beef
1 (1 oz) pkg. taco seasoning mix
8 oz. shredded Mexican style cheese blend
Optional topping, sour cream, shredded lettuce, diced tomatoes, green onions, avocado, olives.

Preheat oven to 350° Lay crescent dough flat on the bottom of a square cake pan and bake according to package instructions. Meanwhile, brown the ground beef in a large skillet over medium high heat. Add the taco seasoning and stir together well. When the dough is done, remove from oven and place the meat mixture on top and then layer with the cheese. Return to oven and bake at 350° for 10 minutes or until cheese has melted. Top with desired toppings and enjoy. to the camparound.
