For this month's Chatter article, we are going to continue last month's article highlighting the rest of the many other things you can see and do in the Gettysburg area on your own. **These sights and activities are not included in any of the NAFCaree tours offered by the committee.** Please feel free to go out and explore the area with these and the many other offerings in the area. We also encourage everyone coming to the NAFCaree in Gettysburg to do your own research on the activities and sights in the area.

The Jennie Wade House

548 Baltimore St, Gettysburg, PA 17325

Authentically furnished from cellar to attic, the Jennie Wade House is a shrine to Jennie and to life during the American Civil War. Just 20 years old at the time of the Battle, Jennie was kneading dough in the kitchen when a rifle bullet pierced two doors and claimed her life. Jennie Wade was the only Gettysburg civilian to be killed outright during the battle.

The Jennie Wade House features guides in period attire who are well-versed in the history of the home. For years, they've enthralled visitors with passionate retellings of the tragedy that befell young Jennie and her family.

Artifacts from that fatal day in 1863 are on display as well, including the artillery shell that punctured the roof of the house and a floorboard with Jennie's blood still on it.

Gettysburg Reenactment (You will need to verify the dates for 2021)

965 Pumping Station Road, Gettysburg

For the past 25 years GAC has been putting on the annual Gettysburg Civil War Battle Reenactment in Gettysburg each July. There is no better way to make those dusty old history books come alive than to experience first-hand the battles, live mortar fire demonstrations, talk with Generals, Infantry, Artillery, and Cavalry at the 156th Gettysburg Civil War Battle Reenactment. Nowhere else can you hear the clashing of swords, the thunder of hooves, the smell of black powder, the sound of artillery shells bursting in the air and hear that distinctive rebel yell other than at this stimulating event. The event will feature daily battles and an extensive Living History Village. It will also include a Living History Activities Tent with a variety of interactive demonstrations that you will be able to see throughout the day, all three days.

The National Civil War Museum (Harrisburg)

One Lincoln Circle at Reservoir Park, Harrisburg, PA

The National Civil War Museum is a permanent, nonprofit educational institution created to promote the preservation of material culture and sources of information that are directly relevant to the American Civil War of 1861-1865, and the aftermath period of the war as related to Civil War Veterans' service organizations, including the Grand Army of the Republic, United Confederate Veterans and the Daughters of the Confederacy to 1920. The museum also serves as the National Headquarters for the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW), the legal successor to the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR). In 2009, the museum became affiliated with the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C.[1]

The museum's exhibits are designed to tell "the entire story of the American Civil War without bias to the Union or Confederate causes". The exhibition covers the period from 1850 to 1876, with its major focus on the Civil War years of 1861 to 1865.

Camping Reservations: The cost for a full hook up site (water, electric, sewer and cable TV) for the week will be \$575.00. Extra Family in a rig will be \$100 and extra adults will be \$50 each.

Cabins: There are several types of cabins available that range in price from \$ 778.60 to \$1,593.42 for the week. You will need to make your own reservations for a cabin by calling Kelsey Nelson at 844-289-6234. Some of these cabins will be near the rest of the group and some will not be. **For reference, the cabins nearest our group are on Picket's Thicket road.** Please mention that you are with NAFCa when making the reservation to receive the discount. If you will be renting a cabin, you will still need to fill out a reservation form and pay the \$50 Admin fee to cover NAFCa costs (the same that everyone else is paying in their camping fee). There is a minimum deposit of \$100 due for camping by April 1, 2021. Final Payment for camping will be due on May 1, 2021. Progress payments are gladly accepted.

The 2021 NAFCa Committee



As a Reminder, Here are the trips offered by the committee:

Sunday, July 18th: Gettysburg National Military Park Visitor's Center & Guided Battlefield Tour: The Tour begins with a self-guided tour of the park Museum and Visitor Center which offers visitors an updated museum experience that tells the story of the Battle of Gettysburg and its significance to our nation's history, within the context of the causes and consequences of the Civil War. Opened in 2008, the museum showcases an extensive collection of artifacts and archival materials and provides visitors with a perspective of the Civil War through the words of its participants and spectators, including Presidents Lincoln and Davis, Generals Meade and Lee, soldiers, correspondents, and civilians. Through a variety of exhibits, interactive displays, films, and a host of research resources, the museum provides a Civil War experience unlike any other. <http://www.nps.gov/geG/index.htm>

Monday July 19th: Seminary Ridge Battlefield / Gettysburg Heritage Center Museum / General Pickett's lunch Buffet / Shriver House Museum: This tour starts at the heart of the first day's fighting in Gettysburg, Seminary Ridge. Seminary Ridge Museum and Education Center, is located on Seminary Ridge along the National Park Service's auto tour route. Three floors of exhibits connect individuals and groups to the dilemmas which led to the Civil War, provide a powerful and personal view of the battle's first day, and show the work of one of the battlefield's largest field hospitals. The museum also features a museum shop and a mile-long outdoor walking trail with wayside markers. Please note that all three floors of museum exhibits and the museum entrance are handicap accessible. <http://seminaryridgemuseum.org/plan-your-visit.html>; <https://www.gettysburgmuseum.com/>;

Tuesday, July 20th: Day Trip to Lancaster for the Amish Experience: Join us for an airconditioned bus tour of the backroads of Lancaster to get a glimpse into Lancaster County life. We will stop for an Amish at Home Experience with a homestead tour, Jacobs Choice Movie presentation and an authentic Amish Lunch with a stop the Amish Farm and House Countryside Bus Tours. This 90-minute bus tour weaves through the farmland, takes riders to a tucked-away covered bridge, and passes Amish schoolhouses, buggies, barns, homes, and farmland vistas, all while sharing stories and facts about the Amish way of life.

Wednesday July 21st: The Pride of the Susquehanna Riverboat Ride (Harrisburg): The Pride of the Susquehanna Riverboat is an authentic stern-driven paddle wheel riverboat built 32 years ago as a community service project by the Harrisburg Area Riverboat Society for the benefit of and visitors to the Harrisburg, Pennsylvania area. Since her construction and launch 1988, the Pride has carried over a million passengers. She's has been, and is continually, used for weddings, parties, business functions, a whole variety of themed dinner cruises, Murder Mysteries, and the ever-popular Pirates on the Pride. In recent years, the Pride's events expanded drastically to include fun events like Wing Nights, Hard-shell Crab Nights, Blues, Jazz, Family events, Wine & Cheese Cruises, and much more. <https://harrisburgriverboat.com/>

Wednesday Evening July 21st: Totem Pole Playhouse - Beehive – The 60s Musical <https://totempoleplayhouse.org/>

July 22nd: Train Trip - North Central Railway of York / Amish Market: Ride along the same route that carried President Lincoln from Washington, DC to Gettysburg, PA, where he delivered one of the greatest speeches in American History! The Northern Central Railway is an excursion railroad that makes time travel possible! It's an authentic experience where you might meet presidents and generals, experience the Wild West, and literally ride along the very rails that helped build and save our nation. It's a breathtaking journey through gorgeous countryside that brings out the child in all of us. Friday July 23rd: Eisenhower National Historic Site / Hickory Bridge Farm Lunch / Winery Tour: The Eisenhower National Historic Site preserves the farm of General and 34th President Dwight D. Eisenhower. Adjacent to the Gettysburg battlefield, the farm served the president and first lady as a weekend retreat and as a meeting place for world leaders. With its peaceful setting and view of South Mountain, it was a respite from Washington, DC, and a backdrop for efforts to reduce Cold War tensions.

What's Cooking?

Fluffy Waffle Recipe

2 C. All-purpose Flour
4 Tbsp. Granulated Sugar
4 tsp. Baking Powder
1/2 tsp. Salt
2 Eggs
1 1/2 C. Milk
6 Tbsp. Unsalted Butter, melted
1 tsp. Vanilla Extract

Preheat waffle iron. Gently coat with non stick baking spray. In a large bowl, combine the flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. Use the back of a spoon to create a "well" in the center. Whisk the two eggs into the milk until well combined.

Pour the wet ingredients (butter, milk/egg mixture, vanilla?) into the well of the dry ingredients and whisk until blended. (Note the batter will be slightly lumpy, don't over-mix). Scoop the battering the preheated waffle iron and cook until the waffles are golden brown and crisp (about 2-3 minutes, but this may vary) Serve immediately or lay on a wire cooling rack until cool. Store leftovers in an airtight bag in the freezer.

Quick Butter Crunch

1 C. Butter
1 C. Sugar
1 1/2 C. Crushed Nuts
1 C. Melted Chocolate Chips

In heavy saucepan, melt butter. Add Sugar. Cook over medium heat stirring constantly for 12-14 minutes. Add crushed nuts. Pour into a 9x9 inch pan. Top with melted chocolate chips and crushed nuts.

Peanut Butter Pie

4 oz. cream cheese
1/2 C. Peanut Butter
1/3 C. Sugar (or 5 envelopes of Equal)
1/2 C. Milk
8 oz. Cool Whip
Graham cracker pie crust

Beat cream cheese, peanut butter, sugar and milk. When well mixed, fold in container of Cool Whip. Pour into graham cracker pie crust and freeze. Remove from freezer a few minutes before serving. (I use a chocolate cookie crust to mix it up sometimes).

Healthy Chicken Alfredo

1.5 lbs chicken breasts or thighs cubed
11 oz whole wheat or gluten free fettuccine linguine or spaghetti
1 tbsp oil
1 cup stock low sodium
2 cups cold 2% or 3.25% milk
2 tbsp cornstarch
1/2 tsp salt
Ground black pepper to taste
1/2 cup Parmesan cheese grated
1 garlic clove grated
3 cups frozen peas broccoli or chopped spinach
2 tbsp parsley for garnish

Fill large pot with water and bring it to a boil. In a medium bowl, add cold stock, milk, cornstarch, 1/2 tsp salt and whisk with a fork. Set aside. In the meanwhile, preheat large deep ceramic non-stick skillet on medium heat and swirl oil to coat. Sprinkle chicken with a bit of salt and pepper, add to a skillet and cook for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. While chicken is cooking, add 1 tsp of salt and pasta to boiling water. Cook for 7 minutes until pasta is al dente, stirring a few times to make sure noodles do not stick. Give cornstarch mixture a whisk and add it to the skillet. Stir, bring to a boil and cook for 2 minutes or until bubbly and thickened. Add Parmesan cheese, garlic and stir until cheese has melted. Using tongs, transfer noodles directly from the pot to the skillet. No need to drain in a colander. Grab a bunch at a time, hold right above the pot for a few seconds and add to the skillet. Stir and add peas, broccoli or spinach. Let chicken alfredo warm through for a minute.

Turn off the heat and garnish with parsley and black pepper. Serve hot.
